Ice Activity Update

Waldport – Urgent Action Alerts work! The Waldport City Council voted unanimously to pass Resolution 1328, formally opposing any attempt by ICE or DHS to house immigration enforcement personnel at the Alsi Resort. In the words of the Indivisible Waves, the Indivisible group headquartered in Waldport, “Make no mistake: this unanimous vote happened because you organized. Because we organized. Because communities up and down the Coast organized together.” As of today, December 11th, the owner of the Alsi Resort has agreed not to sign the ICE contract. The city of Waldport is updating information on this issue. You can access the updates and read Resolution 1328 [HERE](#).

Newport – Although the city of Newport and its residents have been vocal in their opposition to an ICE concentration camp in their city, the threat of DHS and ICE activity is still very real. The news outlet NOTUS ("News of the United States") has [an informative and disturbing article](#) about construction plans for an Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention center. Indivisible groups on the north coast are very active in organizing non-cooperation. An "ICE HAS NO BUSINESS HERE" rally is planned for Saturday, December 13th, to oppose a possible ICE detention facility in Newport. The rally kicks off a campaign to hold businesses accountable amid threats from DHS and ICE. Indivisible Lincoln City, Indivisible Waves, and Oregon Coast Indivisible Alliance (INCC is a member) are hosting the rally, ICE HAS NO BUSINESS HERE, on Saturday, December 13th, to oppose a possible ICE detention facility in Newport. The rally kicks off a campaign to hold businesses accountable amid threats from DHS and ICE. The rally will visibly support business neighbors who stand with us. The event will take place from 12 to 2 p.m. in front of Newport City Hall, 169 SW Coast Highway, Newport, OR 97365.

INCC Minutes December 11, 2025

- 1) Discussed the Monday Community Dinner – Numbers are up once again – 34 meals were served. Volunteers are stepping up and the text messaging worked well. Donations are coming in at each meal and we continue to operate in the black. New flyers were created and those will be distributed throughout the community. Port Orford Public Schools will post a flyer on their Facebook page.
- 2) Discussed the recent boycott of businesses over the Thanksgiving weekend. Members felt these boycotts should continue. The targeted businesses included Target, Home Depot, and Amazon. The list of companies to boycott is long and diverse, ranging from those that financially support the Trump administration to those that have yielded to his demands regarding DEI programs, to funding the ballroom, and profiting from the genocide in Gaza. It's impossible to create a complete list, so members are encouraged to do their own research. INCC will provide specific information when available. The message is to boycott what you can, when you can.
- 3) The next INCC Information/Organizing Meeting – Thursday, December 18, at the Port Orford Library – from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm. **There will be no meetings on Thursday, December 25 or Thursday, January 1.**
- 4) The next regular INCC Port Orford Rally is on Friday, December 12 (and every Friday) at the corner of 16th and Highway 101 in Port Orford from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. Friday's rally theme – ICE HAS NO BUSINESS ON THE OREGON COAST.
