

Volunteer Release and Waiver of Liability

Thank you for volunteering with Carmel Owls (the "Organizer") to participate in the selection of suitable trees and locations for the installation of Great Horned Owl platforms. By completing and signing this form you agree to release the Organizer of all liability while you are serving as a volunteer.

freely, voluntarily, and without duress executes this Release under the	following terms:

No Employment and No Payments: I understand that I am to receive no payment for services from the Organizer. I am not an employee and will receive no benefits.

Release and Waiver: Volunteer does hereby release and forever discharge and hold harmless the Organizer and their successors and assigns from any and all liability, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature, either in law or in equity, which arise or may hereafter arise from Volunteer's activities.

Volunteer understands that this Release discharges the Organizer from any liability or claim that the Volunteer may have against the Organizer with respect to any bodily injury, personal injury, illness, death, or property damage that may result from the Volunteer's activities whether caused by the negligence of the Organizer or their officers or assigns.

Volunteer also understands that the Organizer does not assume any responsibility for or obligation to provide financial assistance or other assistance including, but not limited to, medical, health or disability insurance in the event of injury or illness.

Assumption of the Risk: Volunteer desires to participate in owl platform activities which may include working on easements located along roadways throughout Carmel and the Monterey Peninsula as well as on private property including the use of a cherry picker also known as a boom lift. Volunteer also hereby expressly and specifically assumes the risk of injury or harm in the activities and releases the Organizer from all liability for injury, illness, death or property damage resulting from the volunteer activities.

Medical Treatment: Volunteer does hereby release and forever discharge the Organizer from any claim whatsoever which arises or may hereafter arise on account of any first aid, treatment or service rendered in connection with the Volunteer's activities.

Insurance: The Volunteer understands that the Organizer does not carry or maintain health, medica
or disability insurance for Volunteer. It is the responsibility of the Volunteer to determine if their
insurance covers Volunteer activities. Volunteer has an active medical insurance policy with the

Media Release: The Volunteer grants Carmel Owls permission to the rights of their image and voice as recorded for use on promotional videos and on social media without payment or any other consideration. I understand that my image may be edited, copied, exhibited, published or distributed at public events and on the internet and waive the right to inspect or approve the finished product wherein my likeness appears.

Volunteer Safety Guidelines: Carmel Owls Volunteers must adhere to the following Safety Guidelines to minimize the chances of injuries and to minimize any inconvenience to locals and visitors while our projects are underway. Prior to participating in any Carmel Owls project, your Project Manager will review these guidelines with you and will have you acknowledge receipt by signing this document.

Your safety and the safety of those around you is our number one priority. Whenever conducting any activity, always consider whether you are taking any risk of injury to yourself or others. If you are in any doubt, do NOT undertake the task.

- 1. Always <u>be aware of your surroundings</u> and the effect that your work could be causing to yourself and others. Please pay attention and <u>focus on your task</u>. Inattention and not being aware of your surroundings can cause injury to yourself and others.
- 2. When installing an owl platform always use Carmel Owls traffic cones to alert passersby that our project is in progress. Have your Project Manager put out cones to alert for an existing hazard.
- 3. Always wear <u>clothing that can protect you</u> from the environment in which you are working. This includes sturdy shoes, jeans, long-sleeve shirts, <u>work gloves</u> and a hat to protect you from the sun. It is <u>your</u> responsibility to wear protective clothing.
 - Always use the <u>proper tool for the job</u> and <u>use the tools properly</u>. Seek out guidance if you are unsure of which tool to use or how to use the tool including the use and positioning of a cherry picker also known as a boom lift. Careless use can cause serious injury. Never leave your tools in areas that could cause someone to trip on them or be hurt.
- 4. Work in a team of two people, when at all possible and it makes sense, to help increase the level of safety for the participants and to call for help if there is an accident.
- 5. Wear <u>eye protection</u> especially when installing an owl platform which is typically elevated above you. Branches of trees can spring back or fall off, or loosened bark or debris can enter the eyes causing serious injuries. Please ask the Project Manager for any protective gear that you may not have.
- 6. <u>Do not lift heavy objects</u> that might strain your back or your legs including an owl platform or the cherry picker trailer. Any lifting should be done using your legs, not your back. Get assistance on site to help with any objects that you cannot handle.
- 7. Be cautious when working near traffic in the roads or on the shoulders of roads. Always wear safety vests with reflective colors and face traffic to be aware of approaching cars. Wait until traffic has cleared before continuing work. If working in a defined area, place safety cones out to alert drivers. You can get cones and vests from your project manager before starting your task.
- 8. Do not climb trees. Do not walk on the coastal bluffs.
- 9. I have read the above Safety Guidelines and agree to follow them whenever participating in a project for Carmel Owls.

Other: Volunteer expressly agrees that this Release is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of California and that this Release shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Volunteer agrees that in the event that any clause or provision of this Release shall be held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of such clause or provision shall not otherwise affect the remaining provisions of this Release which shall continue to be enforceable.
