## Lantana

## Bluebonnets



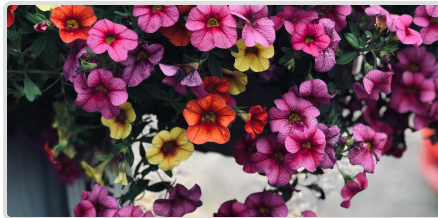
The Texas state flower, thrives in full sun and well-drained soil; best planted in fall to bloom in spring.

## Black-eyed Susan



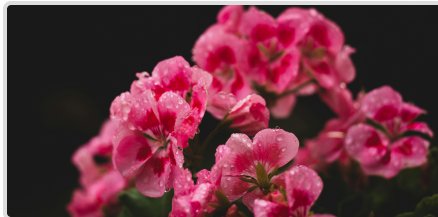
Hardy perennial with bright yellow petals that thrives in full sun.

## Coneflower

## Geraniums



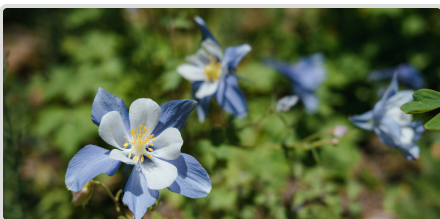
Best grown in pots during early spring (February–May) before the intense heat.

## Sweet Alyssum



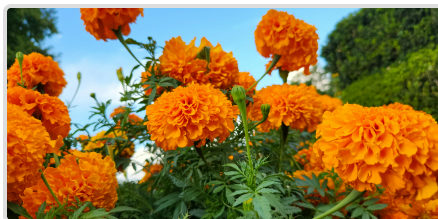
A fantastic, fragrant ground cover that resists deer and adds a delicate look to borders.

## Columbine



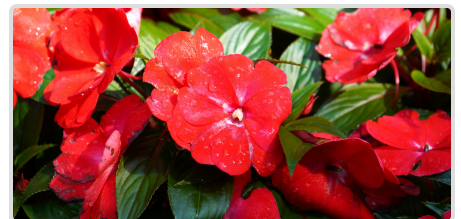
A delicate, shade-loving perennial with red/yellow blooms.
