01

Choose Your Format

Select Traditional, Contemporary, or Liturgical based on your congregation's preference.

02

Review Briefly

Read through the template and leader notes (5-10 minutes).

03

Gather Essentials

Ensure you have any necessary materials (Bible, candles, communion elements if needed).

04

Lead with Confidence

Use the template as your guide throughout the service.

05

Adapt as Needed

Feel free to modify or extend any part of the service to fit your context.

TEMPLATE 1: Traditional Sunday Morning Worship

Approximately 60 minutes

5 min	Prelude	Quiet instrumental music as people gather
3 min	Call to Worship	Opening scripture and greeting
8 min	Opening Hymns	2-3 hymns (choose from favorites)
3 min	Invocation Prayer	Invite congregation to pray
5 min	Scripture Reading	Old Testament or Epistle lesson
15 min	Sermon/Message	Short message based on scripture
3 min	Pastoral Prayer	Prayers of the people
2 min	Offertory	Collection with quiet music
5 min	Closing Hymn	Upbeat sending hymn
2 min	Benediction	Blessing and dismissal
10 min	Postlude	Fellowship time

Leader Notes for Template 1

Tips for Traditional Sunday Morning Worship

Preparation

Arrive 15 minutes early to prepare the space and greet early arrivals.

Hymn Selection

Choose familiar hymns your congregation knows well. Have hymnals ready or display lyrics.

Scripture

Select a passage that connects to your message. Keep it under 15 verses for clarity.

Message Tips

Keep your sermon focused on one main point. Use simple language and real-life examples.

Flexibility

If running long, you can shorten the sermon or reduce hymns. The key is maintaining a peaceful flow.

TEMPLATE 2: TRADITIONAL EVENING PRAYER

(Approximately 45 minutes)

Time	Element	Details
3 min	Opening Hymn	Evening hymn (Abide with Me, Day is Dying in the West)
2 min	Call to Prayer	Scripture call to evening prayer
10 min	Psalm Reading	Responsive reading of selected psalms
5 min	Silent Prayer	Time for personal reflection
8 min	Short Homily	Brief message of comfort
8 min	Prayers of Thanksgiving	Thanking God for the day's blessings
3 min	Evening Hymn	Peaceful closing hymn
2 min	Evening Blessing	Prayer for safekeeping through the night
2 min	Quiet Dismissal	Peaceful departure

Leader Notes for Template 2

Tips for Traditional Evening Prayer

Atmosphere

Keep lighting low and warm. Encourage a quiet, reflective mood throughout the service.

Psalm Reading

Choose from Psalms 4, 23, 91, or 121. Leader reads verses, congregation responds with refrains.

Silent Prayer

Allow a full 5 minutes of quiet. Invite people to offer their own prayers silently during this time.

Homily

Keep to 8 minutes. Focus on God's faithfulness and presence in daily life.

Thanksgiving

Invite congregation to share brief thanksgivings aloud if they feel comfortable.

TEMPLATE 3: Traditional Communion Service

(Approximately 50 minutes)

Time	Element	Details
5 min	Prelude	Quiet music for reflection
3 min	Call to Worship	Opening scripture and welcome
8 min	Opening Hymn	Hymn of praise
3 min	Prayer of Confession	Silent and corporate confession
2 min	Assurance of Pardon	Words of forgiveness
5 min	Scripture Reading	Gospel or Epistle lesson
12 min	Sermon	Message on grace and sacrifice
5 min	Communion Hymn	Hymn of preparation
10 min	Holy Communion	Words of institution and distribution
3 min	Prayer of Thanksgiving	Thanks for the meal
3 min	Closing Hymn	Sending hymn
2 min	Benediction	Blessing and dismissal

Leader Notes for Template 3

Tips for Traditional Communion Service

Preparation

Ensure all communion elements (bread, juice/wine, and serving trays) are prepared and set on the table before the service begins.

Prayer of Confession

Provide a moment of silent personal reflection and confession before leading the congregation in a corporate prayer of confession.

Communion Words

Use the traditional Words of Institution, beginning with 'On the night he was betrayed...', to consecrate the elements.

Distribution

Decide whether to invite the congregation forward or have servers distribute elements in the pews. Play quiet, reflective music throughout the distribution.

After Communion

After all have received communion, facilitate a period of silent thanksgiving and prayer before proceeding to the closing hymn.

Sample Prayers for Communion

Use these or adapt them for your service

Communion Prayer:

'Holy God, we come to this table not because we are worthy, but because we are invited. We remember Christ's sacrifice for us - his body broken and his blood poured out. As we receive these elements, may we be renewed in faith and strengthened for service. Make us one with Christ and with each other. Amen.'

TEMPLATE 4: TRADITIONAL FUNERAL/MEMORIAL SERVICE

(Approximately 45 minutes)

Time	Element	Details
5 min	Prelude	Quiet instrumental music
2 min	Opening Words	Welcome and purpose
5 min	Hymn	Comfort hymn (How Great Thou Art)
8 min	Scripture Readings	Psalm 23, John 14:1-6
12 min	Message of Hope	Sermon on comfort and resurrection
5 min	Tribute Time	Sharing memories (optional)
3 min	Prayer	Prayer for family and friends
5 min	Closing Hymn	Victory hymn (Crown Him with Many Crowns)
2 min	Benediction	Words of hope and comfort
2 min	Postlude	Quiet exit music

SAMPLE OPENING WORDS

'We gather today not as those who have no hope, but as those who know the comfort and strength of our loving God. In this time of loss and grief, we hold fast to the promise that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. We come to remember, to give thanks, and to find hope in the resurrection.'

SAMPLE CLOSING PRAYER

'O God of comfort and hope, we thank you for the life we celebrate today. As we leave this place, grant us your peace that passes understanding. Sustain this family with your grace in the days ahead. Remind us all that death is not the end, but the doorway to eternal life with you. Until we meet again, help us to live with faith, hope, and love. Amen.'

Leader Notes for Template 4

Tips for Funeral/Memorial Services

Preparation

Meet with the family beforehand to understand their wishes and learn about the person who passed away.

Opening

Acknowledge both grief and hope. Welcome everyone warmly and explain the purpose of gathering together.

Tribute Time

Invite family and friends to share brief memories if appropriate. Keep it organized and respectful.

Message

Keep to 10-12 minutes. Focus on God's presence in grief, hope of resurrection, and comfort for those who are mourning.

Sensitive Language

Use the deceased person's name. Acknowledge the reality of loss while pointing to hope and eternal life.

(Approximately 60 minutes)

5 min	Pre-Service Music	Upbeat background music as people arrive
3 min	Welcome & Announcements	Warm greeting and church news
15 min	Worship Set	3-4 contemporary worship songs
3 min	Opening Prayer	Conversational prayer inviting God's presence
5 min	Scripture Reading	Interactive reading with congregation
20 min	Message	Practical teaching with real-life examples
5 min	Response Song	Reflective worship song
3 min	Pastoral Prayer	Prayers for needs and thanksgiving
3 min	Offering	Collection with background music
2 min	Closing Song	Upbeat sending song
2 min	Blessing	Encouraging words and dismissal

Leader Notes for Template 5

Tips for Contemporary Worship Service

Music

If a band isn't available, use backing tracks or an acoustic guitar. Ensure lyrics are displayed clearly on screen for congregational participation.

Interactive Elements

Engage the congregation with questions and brief responses to foster dialogue rather than a one-sided presentation.

Welcome

Deliver a warm and authentic welcome. Consider sharing a personal story or a relevant connection point to build rapport.

Message Style

Adopt a conversational tone for the message. Focus on practical application and clear next steps for the congregation.

Response Time

Provide ample space for personal reflection after the message. Offer an invitation for individuals to come forward for prayer or further engagement if they feel led.

Sample Contemporary Prayers

Use these or adapt them for your service

Opening Prayer:

"God, we come with open hearts and hands, ready to receive what you have for us today. Fill this place with your presence. Speak to us through your word and through your spirit. We love you and we worship you. Amen."

Pastoral Prayer:

"Father, we pray for our church family. We ask for healing for those who are sick, comfort for those who are grieving, and strength for those who are weary. We pray for our community, that we might be a light in the darkness. Use us to make a difference. Amen."

TEMPLATE 6: CONTEMPORARY CAFE STYLE WORSHIP

(Approximately 50 minutes - Informal Setting)

Time	Element	Details
5 min	Gathering Music	Acoustic background music
5 min	Opening Conversation	Casual welcome and check-in
12 min	Story & Discussion	Share testimony or story
8 min	Worship Songs	2-3 intimate songs
10 min	Scripture & Discussion	Read passage, discuss in small groups
8 min	Reflection	Guided meditation on theme
5 min	Prayer & Blessing	Group prayer, individual prayer as needed

Leader Notes for Template 6

Tips for Cafe Style Worship

Setting

Arrange chairs in a circle or small groups. Have coffee and tea available. Create a relaxed, comfortable atmosphere.

Conversation

Begin with casual conversation. Ask people about the highs and lows of their week.

Story Time

Share a personal story, testimony, or modern parable that relates to the theme of the day.

Discussion Groups

Break into small groups of 3-5 people to discuss scripture questions together.

Reflection

Guide quiet reflection time with 2-3 questions for personal meditation.

SAMPLE DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Scripture: Choose a short passage (5-10 verses).

Questions to ask:

- What stands out to you in this passage?
 - How does this relate to your life right now?
 - What might God be saying to you through this?
 - How can we pray for each other based on what we've heard?

SAMPLE REFLECTION GUIDE

Theme - Finding Peace:

'Take a moment to breathe deeply. Consider: Where do you need peace in your life right now? What would it look like to surrender that to God today? Imagine placing that worry or burden into God's capable hands. Feel his presence with you now.'

(Approximately 65 minutes - Youth Friendly)

Time	Element	Details
5 min	Energetic Welcome	High-energy greeting and ice breaker
12 min	Worship Set	3-4 upbeat contemporary songs
5 min	Interactive Game	Quick activity related to theme
3 min	Video or Testimony	Short video clip or personal story
5 min	Scripture Exploration	Interactive Bible reading
18 min	Message	Engaging teaching with visuals
5 min	Small Group Discussion	Break into groups to discuss
5 min	Response Activity	Creative response (art, prayer stations, etc.)
5 min	Worship Response	Reflective worship song
2 min	Challenge & Blessing	Weekly challenge and send-off

Leader Notes for Template 7

Tips for Interactive Worship

Environment

Make the room awesome with cool lights and screens. Have comfy spots to sit and enough space for everyone to move and hang out.

Icebreaker Ideas

Try fun games to start, like 'Two Truths and a Lie,' 'Would You Rather,' or a quick team game.

Scripture Drama

Ask some volunteers to act out a Bible story. Keep it quick and fun so everyone stays interested.

Talk Style

When you speak, tell personal stories. Use examples that fit what teens are going through and show them how the message helps their real life.

Small Groups

Break into small groups, maybe by age or gender. Make sure the leaders have discussion questions ready beforehand.

SAMPLE ICEBREAKER QUESTIONS

- What's the best thing that happened to you this week?
- If you could have any superpower, what would it be?
- What's your favorite worship song and why?
- How can we pray for you specifically this week?

SAMPLE TALK OUTLINE - 'Dealing with Doubt'

Hook: Share a time when you doubted or questioned your faith.

Book: Read and discuss John 20:24-29 (Doubting Thomas).

Look: Even the disciples had doubts. Jesus met Thomas in his doubt with grace.

Took: It's okay to have questions. Bring your doubts to God. He can handle them.

Application: What questions do you have for God? Write them down and pray about them this week.

5 min	Processional Hymn	Opening hymn
3 min	Collect for Purity	Almighty God, to you all hearts are open...
5 min	Summary of the Law	Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ says...
5 min	Kyrie & Gloria	Lord have mercy upon us...
5 min	Collect of the Day	Prayer for the Sunday/season
8 min	Old Testament Lesson	First reading
3 min	Psalm	Gradual psalm
5 min	New Testament Lesson	Second reading
8 min	Gospel	Reading from the Gospels
15 min	Sermon	Homily on the readings
5 min	Nicene Creed	We believe in one God...
8 min	Prayers of the People	Intercessions
10 min	Holy Communion	Distribution
3 min	Post-Communion Prayer	Thanksgiving
2 min	Blessing	Priestly blessing

Leader Notes for Template 8

Tips for Liturgical Holy Eucharist

Vestments

If available, wear appropriate liturgical vestments. If not, simple and dignified attire works fine.

Liturgical Movement

Process in if possible. Use appropriate gestures like signing the cross and bowing.

Readings

Follow the lectionary for the Sunday or season. Have readers prepared in advance.

Eucharistic Prayer

Use the traditional words of institution. Speak clearly and reverently.

Distribution

Invite people forward row by row. Have assistants help if needed.

Pace

Don't rush through the liturgy. Allow time for reverence and reflection.

5 min	Magnificat	My soul doth magnify the Lord...
5 min	New Testament Lesson	Second reading
3 min	Nunc Dimittis	Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace...
5 min	Apostles' Creed	I believe in God, the Father almighty...
5 min	Lord's Prayer	Our Father, who art in heaven...
5 min	Collects & Prayers	Prayer for the day and intercessions
2 min	Grace	The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ...

Leader Notes for Template 9

Tips for Liturgical Morning Prayer

Setting

Can be used in a chapel, small church, or even outdoors. Keep the atmosphere simple and reverent.

Canticles

The Magnificat (Song of Mary) and Nunc Dimittis (Song of Simeon) are traditional canticles for morning prayer.

Psalmody

Use a responsorial format - the leader reads verses, and the congregation responds with refrains.

Intercessions

Use a structured form: pray for the Church, for the world, for those in need, and for the local community.

Flexibility

This service can be shortened or expanded based on the time you have available.

Sample Texts for Morning Prayer

Use these or adapt them for your service

Opening Sentence:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. OR Almighty God, we thank you for the gift of this new day. As we gather in your presence, open our hearts to hear your word and guide our steps according to your will.

General Confession:

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done; and there is no health in us. But you, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare those, O God, who confess their faults. Restore those who are penitent; according to your promises declared unto all people in Christ Jesus our Lord. Grant that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of your holy Name. Amen.

Closing Grace:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. Amen.

TEMPLATE 10: LITURGICAL SPECIAL OCCASION SERVICE

(Approximately 55 minutes - Adaptable)

This template can be adapted for various special occasions:

- Baptism / Confirmation
- Wedding Anniversary Celebration
- Church Anniversary / Homecoming
- Thanksgiving Service
- New Year Service
- Installation of New Leadership

Time	Element	Details
5 min	Processional Hymn	Appropriate to the occasion
3 min	Opening Collect	Prayer for the specific event
8 min	Scripture Readings	2-3 readings related to theme
15 min	Address/Sermon	Message related to the occasion
5 min	Special Ceremony	Baptism, vows, recognition, etc.
5 min	Hymn of Commitment	Response to the ceremony
8 min	Intercessions	Prayers specific to the occasion
3 min	Affirmation	Renewal of vows or commitment
2 min	Blessing	Special blessing for the occasion
3 min	Recessional	Joyful closing

Adaptation Notes by Occasion

How to customize Template 10

Baptism

Include baptismal vows, sprinkling or pouring of water, welcome of new member, and a baptismal hymn.

Confirmation

Include renewal of baptismal vows, laying on of hands, prayer for the Holy Spirit, and blessing of confirmands.

Church Anniversary

Include recognition of church history, thanksgiving for God's faithfulness, and commitment to future ministry.

Thanksgiving

Focus on gratitude, sharing of blessings, offering of thanksgiving gifts, and prayers of gratitude.

New Year

Include reflection on the past year, commitment to the new year, prayers for guidance, and setting spiritual goals.

Sample Opening Collects

Prayers for special occasions

For Baptism:

Almighty God, by our baptism into death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ, you turn us from the old life of sin: Grant that all who are baptized into his Name may keep the covenant they have made, and boldly confess Jesus as Lord and Savior, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting.

For Church Anniversary:

Gracious Father, we thank you for the faithfulness you have shown to this congregation through the years. As we celebrate your goodness to us, make us mindful of our calling to be your people in this place. Renew our commitment to worship, service, and witness, that we may continue to be a light in our community. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

For New Year:

Eternal God, as we stand at the beginning of a new year, we seek your guidance for the days ahead. Help us to walk in your ways, to grow in faith and love, and to serve you faithfully all our days. Grant us wisdom to make choices that honor you, and strength to persevere in times of difficulty. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
