

Biography of Tracie Frank (2025)

Tracie Frank (she/her) is an African-American television, film and voice actor based in Lisbon, Portugal.

Born in Massachusetts (USA), Tracie spent her primary years in Europe due to her dad's service in the U.S. Air Force. Her family returned to Massachusetts in time for Tracie to graduate high school. Years later she moved to Charlotte, North Carolina, where in 2013 she decided to pursue her lifelong dream of acting.

Tracie began training in acting, improv and voiceover. Tracie booked her first role (Ronnette) in a community theatre production of "Little Shop of Horrors" in late 2013. By 2015, she was a regular in the local theatre scene, receiving rave reviews from local critics. She was awarded *Best Actress in a Musical* by Broadway World (Charlotte) that year for her role as Mary Magdalene in the musical "Jesus Christ, Superstar." Tracie began working in professional theater venues soon after. One of her most memorable was as Betty in the world premiere of "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever: The Musical" at Children's Theatre of Charlotte in 2017.

By 2020, Tracie was an experienced and sought-after actor in the Charlotte film community, with several short-film, commercial and industrial bookings under her belt. She became the commercial voice of Atrium Health (to present), and by the end of the year she'd booked on-screen roles on three major streaming network series: "HighTown" (Starz); Emmy-award winning "Dopesick" (Hulu); and "Outer Banks" (Netflix).

Tracie also appeared in feature films "The Other Zoey" (Netflix 2023) alongside Josephine Langford and Drew Starkey; "The Angry Black Girl and Her Monster" (in theaters and streaming 2023) alongside Laya DeLeon Hayes and Denzel Whitaker; and "The Hill" (in theaters and streaming 2023) starring Dennis Quaid. She received the *Best Actress* award from Queen City Awards (2022), and was honored to be nominated again in 2023.

Today Tracie is an experienced working actor with a love for the craft. She is a commanding presence known for conveying strength, wisdom and compassion both on screen and on the mic. Most recently in September 2025, Tracie booked her first theatre role in Portugal, the Lisbon Players' production of Dario Fo's timely and hilarious "The Accidental Death of an Anarchist" (Superintendent).

Tracie is also half of *Angry Goddess Productions* with business partner Dara Brewton. Their most recent endeavor, "Rough Seas," was co-written by Tracie and Dara, and is currently airing on Charlotte Comedy Network (YouTube). Tracie directed Episodes 7-9.

Between auditions and bookings you'll find Tracie either wandering around Portugal attempting to speak Portuguese, or watching comfort shows like "Arrested Development".
