Springtime in the Pacific Northwest is nothing short of breathtaking. After the long, gray months of rain and winter chill, we finally begin to see the signs of new life—leaves on the trees, blossoms on the rhododendrons, and that unmistakable freshness in the air after a spring rain. It is as though creation itself is preaching a sermon: New life has come!

How fitting, then, that we find ourselves still in the Season of Easter.

While the world tends to move on quickly from Easter-shelves cleared of chocolate bunnies and pastel colors packed away—the Church keeps celebrating. For 50 days, we live in the

proclaiming with full hearts: "Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

One of my favorite Easter stories comes from Luke 24:13-35, the account of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. It's a story about walking, wondering, and discovering that Jesus has been beside us the whole time. As they journeyed, confused and disheartened by all that had happened in Jerusalem, Jesus Himself came near and walked with them. Though they didn't

recognize Him at first, He opened the Scriptures to them, helping them see that everything had been pointing to His death and resurrection. And later, in the breaking of the bread, their eyes were opened—and they knew it was Jesus himself.

Isn't that the way our faith so often works? Oftentimes, we walk through seasons where we feel uncertain or even lost. We wonder where

> God is in the midst of it all. But as the Emmaus road reminds us, Jesus walks with us-even when we don't recognize Him. And He reveals Himself to us through His Word, and in the breaking of the bread, just as He does every time we worship.

This spring, as you go about your days-walking the trails, planting your gardens, or just enjoying the sun when it breaks through the clouds—I encourage you to walk with Jesus. Open your Bible and see how He is speaking to you. Come to the Lord's Table and receive His presence. Be encouraged that He is not far off, for He is Risen, and He is near.

May the joy of Spring and the Resurrection fill your heart today and always.





Seizing Holy Opportunities

In Holy Moments, Matthew Kelly discusses the world's need for more small (but sometimes large) instances of people caring for others, cultivating joy, encouragement, and love instead of anger, envy, and fear. Kelly defines a Holy Moment as "a single moment in which you open yourself to God. ... For one moment you do what you prayerfully believe God is telling you to do."

This may mean mowing the lawn for a neighbor with a broken leg, praising a child on his artwork, buying a surprise snack for someone having a bad day, working extra shifts for a coworker with cancer so she can receive her full salary while out sick. Anyone can create a Holy Moment, because you don't need special skills, position, or wealth. "If you want to see miracles, make yourself available to God."

He adds that God has a track record of collaborating with "the most unlikely people to make amazing things happen, and now He wants to collaborate with you." When we're open to God's leading, holy opportunities abound. And we will experience as much joy as the ones to whom we show care.

Thank you, God, for the special women in my life [mom, grandmas, aunts, nieces, friends, wife, daughters]. I pray for their well-being.

An ELCA missionary who served in Chili for more than 40 years has been honored for founding a community health organization. Local people were trained to be community health workers who advocated for health care, sustainable food, violence against women, and general needs of their communities. Karen Anderson's time of service included working under a brutal dictator when her colleagues were harassed and physically harmed, but they continued their work despite the hardships.

Contributions to ELCA World Hunger helped provide resources for which Anderson is very thankful. She says, "When people join in the work together, we remember that we're not alone. Micah's Baptism




Micah Almgren, son of Anya and Garth Almgren, was baptized on April 6 at Our Savior's Lutheran Church-Everett. In
