Season of Lent

The Season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Each Wednesday during Lent we will begin with a Soup Supper at 6 pm, followed by worship at 7 pm. On Ash Wednesday we hear those familiar words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The following Wednesdays we will worship with a Lenten Liturgy written by Marty Haugen and Susan Briehl entitled, "That You May Have Life." It is a wonderful, easy to sing, contemplative service written in the same style as Marty Haugen's familiar Holden Evening Prayer.

Our theme for our midweek Lenten Services will be: "Regrets and Redemption: Monologues for the Lenten Season." These monologues will add depth to our understanding of some of the key players from Jesus' last years on earth. We will hear from people like: the Centurion of Capernaum, the Mother of James and John, the Maidservant of Caiaphas, the Wife of Pontius Pilate, and other.

Jesus, the Model of Salt and Light

"The remarkable thing is that Jesus brought it all into reality in his own person," writes Bible scholar N.T. Wright in Matthew for Everyone. "He was the salt of the earth. He was the light of the world: set up on a hilltop, crucified for all the world to see, becoming a beacon of hope and new life for everybody, drawing people to worship his [F]ather, embodying the way of self-giving love which is the deepest [fulfillment] of the law and the prophets."



Living Lutheran

An author, Elise Seyfried is highlighted recently in Living Lutheran. She says, "many stories in Scripture tell of people who, in times of crisis, meet difficult moments with courage." Some are quite unexpected, such as David facing Goliath, or Moses saying he wasn't good at speaking but led the Israelites anyway, or Queen Esther when she speaks up and saves her people. Seyfried suggests there are present day situations that call us to act with courage. Examples include actions regarding changing climate, wars, governmental divisions, homelessness, social media interactions. "We may succeed or fail," Seyfried says, "but don't we owe it to the next generations ... to try?" God is there with us. "God offers us wisdom and compassion." We can "tap into that great wellspring of courage."
