### 1. Brief description

This memory game involves matching European countries with their flags and famous landmarks. The flags on the landmarks and the coloured edges of the cards, which indicate the continent, provide a little help.

### 2. Game materials

Cards with country flags and cards with matching landmarks  
Coloured borders to indicate the continent

### 3. Game preparation

Shuffle all the cards well and place them face down on the table – ideally in a square or rectangle.

### 4. How to play

Each player takes turns to turn over two cards. If the flag and landmark match, the player may keep the pair and turn over two more cards. If the cards do not match, they are turned back over and it is the next player's turn.

### 5. Aim of the game


The player who has collected the most pairs at the end wins.

Country	Attraction	Description	Picture
Austria	Hallstatt	This picturesque village on Lake Hallstatt in Upper Austria is world-famous for its idyllic alpine architecture, spectacular location between mountain and lake, and as a historic centre of salt mining since prehistoric times.	
Belgium	Atomium	The Atomium is a gigantic, walk-through sculpture in Brussels, representing an iron crystal unit cell magnified 165 billion times. It was originally built for the 1958 World's Fair and is now a museum and landmark.	
Bosnia and Herzegovina	Old Bridge of Mostar	The elegant, historic arch bridge spans the Neretva River in Mostar. It was built by the Ottomans in the 16th century and destroyed in the 1993 war, but was faithfully rebuilt to symbolize the connection between cultures.	
Croatia	Plitvice Lakes	Plitvice Lakes are a stunning national park known for its 16 terraced lakes connected by spectacular waterfalls. The UNESCO World Heritage site is striking due to the unique colour variations of the water.	
Cyprus	Blue Caves	These fascinating sea caves on the west coast of Cyprus, near Cape Greco, are famous for the incredibly bright, turquoise water. The colour is created by the refraction of sunlight, making the caves a popular photo opportunity.	
Czech Republic	Charles Bridge	The Gothic stone bridge from the 14th century in Prague crosses the Vltava River and connects the Lesser Town with the Old Town. It is lined with impressive Baroque statues of saints and is a central meeting point.	
Denmark	The Little Mermaid	The bronze statue, inspired by Hans Christian Andersen's fairy tale, sits on the waterfront in Copenhagen and is a world-famous symbol of Denmark. The figure, looking longingly out to sea, has attracted millions of visitors since 1913.	
Finland	Moose in Nature	The moose, the largest member of the deer family, is an iconic animal of the Finnish forests, symbolizing the country's untouched nature. It represents the wilderness and is a frequent motif in Finnish art and culture.

France	Eiffel Tower	The 330-meter-high Eiffel Tower, built for the 1889 World's Fair, is the undisputed landmark of Paris and one of the world's most visited structures. Its intricate iron structure symbolizes the elegance and spirit of France.	
Germany	Brandenburg Gate	The Brandenburg Gate in Berlin is a neoclassical structure that originally served as a city gate and toll station. Today, it is an important symbol of German reunification, representing peace and unity in Europe.	
Greece	Acropolis	The Acropolis is an ancient city fortress in Athens, home to famous structures like the Parthenon and the Erechtheion. As the cradle of democracy and Western civilization, it is the outstanding symbol of ancient Greece.	
Hungary	Parliament Palace	The impressive neo-Gothic building on the Danube riverbank in Budapest is the seat of the Hungarian National Assembly. It is one of the largest parliament buildings in the world, noted for its imposing dome and rich facade decoration.	
Iceland	Geysir Strokkur	Strokkur is an active fountain geyser in the Haukadalur valley that reliably shoots an impressive column of hot water up to 20 metres or higher into the air every few minutes. It is part of Iceland's famous Golden Circle.	
Ireland	Cliffs of Moher	These majestic sea cliffs on the west coast of Ireland rise up to 214 metres above the Atlantic Ocean. They stretch for eight kilometres, offering a spectacular view of the sea and the Aran Islands.	
Italy	Colosseum	The Flavian Amphitheatre in Rome is the largest in the world and served as the setting for bloody gladiator fights and public spectacles. As a symbol of the Roman Empire, the ruin tells the story of ancient power and greatness.	
Luxembourg	Grand Ducal Palace	The official residence of the Grand Duke of Luxembourg in the capital city. The palace serves as a venue for official receptions and representative duties, showcasing a rich historical architecture that reflects the country's monarchical tradition.

Macedonia	Ohrid Village	The city of Ohrid on the lake of the same name is known for its rich history, numerous churches, and beautiful location. The Old Town with its narrow streets and the Fortress of Tsar Samuil is a UNESCO World Heritage site.	
Malta	Popeye Village	Popeye Village, originally a film set for the 1980 musical film "Popeye," is now a popular theme park. The colourful wooden houses form a charming backdrop at Anchor Bay and attract tourists.	
Monaco	Monte Carlo City with Racing Cars	Monte-Carlo is famous for its casino, luxurious lifestyle, and especially for the spectacular Formula 1 Grand Prix. The race cars on the streets symbolize the glamour and speed of the Principality of Monaco.	
Montenegro	Budva Ballerina	The Ballerina statue, standing on a rock off the coast of Budva, is a popular photo opportunity and a romantic symbol of the region. It is connected to a local legend about a lost love that inspired the statue.	
Netherlands	Tulips and Windmills	Windmills and the endless, colourful tulip fields are the most famous symbols of the Netherlands. They represent the long history of land reclamation and the country's rich flower-growing tradition.	
Norway	Trolltunga Fjord	Trolltunga, a horizontal rock protrusion lying 700 meters above Ringedalsvatnet lake, is one of Norway's most spectacular views. The hike there is challenging, but the view is incomparable and majestic.	
Poland	Kraków Old Town	Kraków's Old Town, with its massive main market square, St. Mary's Basilica, and the Cloth Hall, is a UNESCO World Heritage site. It is the historical heart of the city and a living testimony to Polish culture and history.	
Portugal	Lisbon's Old Town Tram	The historic yellow trams, especially the famous Line 28, wind through the narrow, steep streets of Lisbon's Alfama old town. They are an iconic means of transport and a charming symbol of the capital.	

Country	Attraction	Description	Picture
Russia	Red Square	Red Square in Moscow, surrounded by the Kremlin, St. Basil's Cathedral, and the GUM department store, is the historical and geographical centre of Russia. It served as the scene of many important events in Russian history.	
San Marino	Mount Titano	Monte Titano is the highest mountain in San Marino and shapes the landscape of Europe's smallest state. Perched on its three peaks are the "Three Towers of San Marino," which represent the national symbol.	
Slovenia	Lake Bled with Church	Lake Bled is known for its picturesque island, on which the famous Assumption of Mary Church stands. Surrounded by the Julian Alps and a medieval castle, it is Slovenia's most famous postcard motif and a natural treasure.	
Spain	Sagrada Familia	The unfinished basilica in Barcelona is the masterpiece of architect Antoni Gaudí. The unique combination of Gothic and Art Nouveau, as well as its intricate facades, make it one of the most visited structures in the world.	
Sweden	Northern Lights	The Northern Lights, or Aurora Borealis, are a spectacular natural phenomenon in the northern sky. The green and pink luminous veils are a symbol of Sweden's Arctic nature, attracting nature photographers from all over the world.	
Switzerland	Matterhorn	The pyramid-shaped mountain in the Alps on the border with Italy is one of the most distinctive and famous mountain shapes in the world. Its characteristic form makes it the unmistakable national symbol of Switzerland.	
United Kingdom	Tower Bridge	Tower Bridge in London is a combined bascule and suspension bridge over the River Thames. With its two neo-Gothic towers, it is one of the most famous bridges in the world and an iconic symbol of the British capital.	
Vatican City	St. Peter's Basilica	St. Peter's Basilica is the largest and most important church in the world and the centre of the Catholic Church. With its imposing dome and masterpieces by Michelangelo and Bernini, it is an architectural marvel and pilgrimage destination.
