

PART 1: PREPARATION & TEACHING (Days 1-6)



From Tied to Trusted:
A Journey Into
Unleashed Obedience

Muleashed

I didn't always understand what it meant to be unleashed by God.

I was raised in ministry under a denomination that valued structure, order, and tradition.

And while much of what I learned was good—I was taught to be respectful, to honor leadership, to serve faithfully—there were lessons hidden beneath the surface that shaped my view of God's calling. I was taught to follow the inspiration of the Holy Spirit... but I was also taught, sometimes silently, that titles and positions held more weight than obedience to His voice.

I learned about what not to do.

I learned about how to stay in line.

I learned how to be agreeable to man, even if it meant suppressing what God was whispering to my spirit.

I learned about the spirit of religiosity and control far more deeply than I learned about the freedom found in the Holy Spirit. Muleashed

I learned more about tavoittistit than I learned about the true favor of God.

Still, through it all, God was planting seeds. In 2018, He gave me a vision—Faith Beyond Measure Ministries—but at the time, I didn't fully understand what it was meant to become.

It sat in my spirit like a seed buried beneath the soil: present, but not yet visible.

In 2021, a desire to start something small pushed me forward: an online women's Bible study under the Faith Beyond Measure name.

It was simple. It was faithful. It was a start.
As time passed, the Holy Spirit led me deeper.

I began hosting Faith and Finance workshops traveling to churches and organizations to teach about biblical wealth-building. Unleashed

My denominational leaders didn't show support, but I went anyway.

I watched transformation happen—people's eyes opening to the truth of God's provision—and I knew the Holy Spirit was confirming my steps.

Then came the Positioned-2-Prosper Conference, along with a workbook that many called life-changing.

A few months later, under the same divine leading, I authored Watch As Well As Pray, a study of the 8 prayer watches.

Hundreds purchased the book, and I hosted an 8-week teaching series where leaders and lay people gathered—not many from my denomination, but enough to know God was breathing on it.

Unleashed_

Still, the pull of tradition remained like chains rattling at my feet.

I could have stayed comfortable—doing just enough, staying just tied enough not to disrupt anything.

But God wasn't calling me to comfort. He was calling me to greater obedience.

I hosted "Embrace Your Call to Ministry," another conference, and another workbook.

I authored Watch Your Mouth: How to Align What We Say with What We Pray—a book that stirred hearts and aligned tongues with Heaven's language.

Each step was terrifying. I did it scared. But I was never alone.

Muleashed

God sent powerful women of God into my life—women who poured into me, who pushed me when I doubted myself, who reminded me that I was untied for a purpose.

Together, we founded Kingdom Coalition Ministries, a network of leaders dedicated to following God, not structures.

Through this obedience, I developed the Journey to Renewal course for newly saved and baptized believers.

Later, the Holy Spirit inspired the Surrendered Living curriculum, which is still being taught today, transforming lives through the power and authority of Jesus Christ.

Imagine if I hadn't obeyed. Imagine if I stayed tied to comfort, to fear, to man's approval.



Every book, every conference, every curriculum, every soul impacted would have remained locked inside an obedient but restricted spirit.

But God...

God sent word. God sent help. God said, "Loose her and bring her to Me, for the Lord has need of her."

Today, I walk in freedom—not because I was perfect, but because I was willing.

Friend, if you hear nothing else from my story, hear this:

Being tied does not mean being disqualified. Being overlooked by man does not mean God overlooks you.

Being afraid does not mean you are incapable; it simply means you are human. It simply means you're waiting for the right word to loose you... And tonight, that word has come.

Unleashed by the Master's Command Scripture

Matthew 21:1-3 (NKJV)

"Now when they drew near Jerusalem, and came to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her.

Loose them and bring them to Me.

And if anyone says anything to you, you shall say, "The Lord has need of them," and immediately he will send them."



As we read this passage carefully, something profound leaps out of the text:

The command to loose did not originate from the tied ones.

It originated from Jesus. Before the donkey and colt even knew release was possible, the Master had already declared their freedom.

He saw their condition.

He saw their potential.

He knew the assignment waiting for them.

And He initiated their untying.

This is the nature of divine release:
It is not dependent on our ability to free ourselves.

It is dependent on His word over us.

Whats Holding You Back

"You will Find a Donkey Hed..."

Jesus was specific.

He didn't say "You might find."

He said, "You will find"—because He knows exactly where His vessels are, even when they are restricted.

Maybe you've been wondering if God sees you in your stuck place.

Maybe you've questioned whether your limitations disqualified you.

Hear this truth today:

- God sees you tied.
- God still needs you tied.
- God already has a plan for your release.

The place you feel most bound is the place He plans to birth glory.

Positioned but Vot Refeased -

"Loose Them and Bring Them to Me..."

The instruction was not just to notice the donkey and colt.

It was to loose them and bring them to Jesus.

God's goal is not simply to make us free for

freedom's sake.

His goal is to loose us for relationship and purpose.

Once untied, the donkey and colt would not wander aimlessly.

They would be brought to the Savior.

They would be positioned to carry Him into places He had destined to enter.

Freedom in Christ always carries purpose.

The Lord Has Meed of You

"The Lord Has Need of Them."

Imagine being tied for years.

Overlooked. Unused. Feeling unseen.

And then hearing:

"The Lord has need of you."

Those words change everything.

You are not forgotten.

You are not disqualified.

You are not optional.

You are necessary.

God's Kingdom assignments require what you carry.

Your voice.

Your hands.

Your obedience.

Your testimony.

He has need of your movement. He has need of your surrender. He has need of your yes.



How This Applies To You Today

✓ You may be tied by fear, tradition, rejection, failure, or comparison.

But Jesus has already issued the command for your release.

- ✓ You may be tied to mindsets, environments, or loyalties that no longer serve your growth.

 But the Lord has need of your availability.
- ✓ You may feel hidden, stagnant, or stuck. But the Lord has already prepared the moment of your movement.

The word over your life today is simple:

Loose her. Loose him. Bring them to Me.

You are being unleashed because you are needed.

Not someday. Not when you're perfect.

Not when you have a bigger platform. Now.





21 Day Devotional Transition

From Self-Reflection to Spirit-Led Movement

You've just completed a powerful moment of self-reflection.

By answering honestly, you've positioned yourself for clarity, healing, and transformation. You've chosen to take responsibility—not for fixing everything, but for surrendering everything to the One who can.

Now begins your journey of movement.

Over the next 21 days, God will begin to untie things that have kept you stuck—mindsets, memories, fears, loyalties, limitations. You'll move from awareness to activation, from hesitation to Holy Spirit-led obedience.

Transition

From Self-Reflection to Spirit-Led Movement

- Each day is intentional.
- Each entry is a step.
- Each prayer is a pulling down of strongholds.
- Each action is a loosening of the ties that have held you back.

You are not walking alone.
The Lord has need of you.

And He is walking you into greater.

Take a deep breath.

Open your heart.

Let the journey begin.

Day 1 of 21

When Movement Feels Like Madness

Scripture:

Isaiah 43:19

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

Devotional:

There's something unsettling about a shift. Not because it's wrong—but because it's different. You pray for clarity, for growth, for "next"—but when God actually begins to answer that prayer, the process can feel disorienting.

That's because God's movement often begins with disruption.

You may not feel like you're moving forward. You may feel like you're unraveling. But take heart—what looks like chaos is often God's way of shaking loose the things that have kept you spiritually stuck.

Sometimes, the door to next doesn't open. Sometimes, it shatters. And you're left wondering, "What is happening to me?" But what if the wilderness you're walking through is the way God is making? Faith doesn't always feel like peace. Sometimes it feels like madness. But even in that wilderness, God is making streams. He's clearing the fog. He's pulling you out of the familiar because it stopped feeding your future.

Today marks a divine interruption. You are not here by accident. You are here because God is calling you to transition—from routine to revelation, from survival to surrender, from stuck to sent.

Devotion Notes

Brief summary of the passage	Question i have
How will i apply this devotion	on and scripture in my life?

Day 1: When Movement Feels Like Madness

Action Step:

Write a short letter to yourself titled, "I'm Ready to Shift." Be honest. Acknowledge the places where things feel uncertain, but end with a declaration of trust.

Example:

"It doesn't feel good, but I believe it's God. I'm ready to shift.
I'm ready to move forward in faith."

Prayer Notes

Your hand. Even when things feel unfamiliar, You are faithful. Thank You for disrupting what was keeping me stuck. I welcome the shift. I welcome the new thing. I believe You are making a way—even when I can't see it yet.

Reflection Prompt:

Where in your life or ministry do you feel disoriented, and could it be a sign that God is shifting you?

Journaling Notes

Day 2 of 21

You Can't Heal While You're Hiding

Scripture:

Psalm 32:5

"Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the Lord.' And you forgave the guilt of my sin."

Devotional:

One of the most common reasons people get spiritually stuck is because they try to move forward while hiding what's still broken. Hiding doesn't always mean lying. Sometimes it means pretending everything's okay when you're actually spiritually bleeding. You're leading others while you're wounded. Smiling while silently suffocating. Doing ministry with bandages God never asked you to wear.

But healing can't happen in the dark. The enemy thrives in secrecy—but God heals in honesty. The longer you hide your pain, the longer your process will drag out. God is not intimidated by your wounds, and He's not shocked by your truth. He simply wants you to bring it to Him.

When you stop hiding, you start healing. When you stop pretending, you start progressing.

Devotion Notes

Brief summary of the passage	Question i have
How will i apply this devotion	on and scripture in my life?

Reflection Prompt:

What am I trying to carry in secret that God is asking me to surrender in truth?

Prayer Notes

Lord, I'm tired of pretending. I bring You every secret, and every space I've been afraid to cor the God who heals—so today, I stop hiding and I healing. Heal me where I've been bleeding. Touch buried. In Jesus' name, amen.	nfront. You are come home to

Action Step:

Write a personal letter to God (in your journal or phone notes) confessing what you've been hiding—be it pain, bitterness, shame, or fear. Let it out. Then declare out loud:

"I am no longer hiding—I'm healing."

Day 3 of 21 When God Interrupts Your Routine

Scripture:

Proverbs 16:9
"A man's heart plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps."

Devotional:

You had a plan, a timeline, and a clear picture of how your life—or even your ministry—was supposed to go. But now everything feels out of sync, interrupted, and off-schedule.

Here's the truth we often resist: God doesn't need your permission to shift your path. He's not obligated to run His divine reroutes through your planner. When your routine becomes more of a ritual than a relationship, God will lovingly disrupt it.

We often ask God to order our steps, but we don't expect Him to interrupt our rhythm. But He will—especially when we've gotten too comfortable. His interruption isn't punishment—it's redirection. It's protection. It's purpose.

Unstuck begins with being unglued from the life you scripted and open to the life God is actually writing.

Devotion Notes

Brief summary of the passage	Question i have
How will i apply this devotion	on and scripture in my life?

Reflection Prompt:

Where has God interrupted my plans, and have I been resisting or receiving the shift?

Prayer Notes

Father, forgive me for being more committed to my plan than to Your presence. I release the fear of losing control. Even when I don't understand, I trust You to guide me. Teach me how to embrace divine detours and trust that Your interruptions are always intentional.

Action Step:

Take five minutes today to surrender your personal timeline to God. Write out the phrase:

"God, I trust You with my future—even when it doesn't match my plans."

Say it out loud as a declaration, then sit quietly and listen.

Journaling Notes

Day 4 of 21

You Can't Be Loyal to What's Killing You

Scripture:

1 Samuel 15:22

"But Samuel replied: 'Does the Lord delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the Lord? To obey is better than sacrifice...'"

Devotional:

Loyalty is honorable—until it becomes spiritual bondage. Many of us stay in places, relationships, ministries, or assignments longer than we should, not because we're still growing—but because we're afraid to disappoint people.

You can be committed to the wrong thing. You can sacrifice yourself for what God never asked for. And the danger? You'll call it faithfulness while slowly withering inside.

Saul thought he was doing right by holding on to what God told him to let go. His intentions weren't enough. Obedience mattered more.

God will never ask you to remain loyal to something that's killing your purpose, draining your spirit, or silencing your gift. What feels like betrayal to man may be obedience to God. And when the two conflict, choose God.

Devotion Notes

Brief summary of the passage	Question i have
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Reflection Prompt:

Am I holding on out of loyalty to man or obedience to God?

Prayer Notes

	Lord, reveal to me anything I've been loyal to that's been limiting my growth. I don't want to call disobedience "faithfulness" anymore. Give me the courage to walk away from what You've already moved on from—even if it costs me relationships, titles, or approval. I choose obedience over sacrifice.
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Action Step:

Identify one area where your loyalty is costing you your peace or purpose. Write a release prayer today—even if you're not ready to walk away yet. Start by loosening your emotional grip. "God, I release the fear of letting go. Show me how to follow You fully."

Journaling Notes

Day 5 of 21

Faith Doesn't Always Feel Like Clarity

Scripture:

Hebrews 11:8

"By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to the place which he would receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going."

Devotional:

One of the biggest reasons we stay stuck is because we're waiting for full instructions before we obey.

But faith is rarely clear. It's often messy, uncomfortable, and frustratingly vague. God told Abraham, "Go,"—but didn't tell him exactly where. Abraham moved anyway.

That's what real faith looks like: not perfect understanding, but consistent obedience. Sometimes, God won't clarify the next step until you walk away from the last one.

You won't always get details. You may not always feel ready. But if God said move, then your faith must step in even when your feelings don't line up.

Clarity may come later—but your obedience is due now.

Devotion Notes

Question i have

Brief summary of the passage

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Reflection Prompt:

What have I been delaying because I don't have all the answers yet?

 ,

Prayer Notes

God, help me to trust You in the unknown. Even when I don't have all the pieces, I choose to follow Your voice. Strengthen my faith to move beyond logic, beyond fear, and beyond delay. I may not know the "where," but I trust the Who.

Action Step:

Write down one thing you know God has told you to start, shift, or release—even if you don't see the full picture yet. Then declare:

"I will no longer wait for clarity to obey. I trust God's voice over my need to see the full plan."

Journaling Notes

Day 6 of 21

You're Anointed for This Assignment

Scripture:

2 Corinthians 3:5-6

"Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God. He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant..."

Devotional:

Sometimes the weight of the calling feels heavier than your capacity. You look at what God is asking you to do and think, "I'm not ready. I'm not enough. I'm not qualified."

Because if you could do it without Him, it wouldn't require anointing.

God isn't looking for the most polished or perfect vessel—He's looking for the most willing one. The anointing is what equips you. It's what carries you. It's what makes the impossible, possible.

You were anointed for this assignment before you ever doubted yourself. You're not going to fulfill your calling by striving—you're going to fulfill it by surrendering to the Spirit who empowers you.

Stop questioning if you have what it takes. You do—because He does.

Devotion Notes

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Prayer Notes

Father, I thank You that I am not walking in my strength, but in Your Spirit. I receive the anointing that breaks yokes and moves mountains. I am equipped, empowered, and anointed to fulfill every assignment You have ordained for my life.

Action Step:

Write a short "I am anointed" affirmation. Example: "I am anointed to lead. I am anointed to serve. I am anointed to shift atmospheres. I am anointed for my assignment." Read it out loud every morning for the next 3 days.

Reflection Prompt:

Where have I been doubting my readiness instead of trusting God's anointing on my life?

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Journaling Notes

Day 7 of 21

You're Anointed for This Assignment

Scripture:

John 21:5-6

"He called out to them, 'Friends, haven't you any fish?' 'No,' they answered. He said, 'Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some.'"

Devotional:

Sometimes we keep casting our nets in the same place—not because it's fruitful, but because it's familiar.

The disciples had already fished all night and caught nothing. They were tired, disappointed, and probably questioning their own abilities. But when Jesus showed up, He didn't bring new tools. He brought fresh direction.

What if your lack of breakthrough isn't because you need to work harder—but because you're casting on the wrong side? Familiarity is comfortable, but it can also be deceiving. If it's not producing what God promised, you might need to shift—not your calling, but your approach.

When Jesus gives fresh instructions, even empty nets become full.

Devotion Notes

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Reflection Prompt:

Where in my life have I settled for familiarity even though it's no longer fruitful?

Prayer Notes

Jesus, I surrender the way I've always done things. I don't want to keep fishing in the same empty waters out of habit. Give me fresh ears to hear You and boldness to obey—even when it feels unfamiliar.

Action Step:

Make a "Net Check" list. Write down any routine, relationship, or responsibility that no longer bears fruit. Ask God for wisdom on where and how to "cast" differently this week—and take one step in obedience.

Day 8 of 21 Healing Requires Honesty

Scripture:

James 5:16

"Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

Devotional:

You can't get free from what you won't face. Healing requires more than silent tears and personal prayers—it requires honesty.

God isn't intimidated by your struggle. But you might be surprised by how much healing He's hidden in the vulnerability of confession. We often think of confession as weakness, but in the Kingdom, confession is a gateway to wholeness.

Too many people are stuck because they've convinced themselves that silence equals strength. But it doesn't. Strength is saying, "I'm not okay—and I don't want to stay this way."

Whether it's confessing to God or opening up to a trusted spiritual friend or leader, freedom often flows when truth finally breaks the surface.

Devotion Notes

Question i have

Brief summary of the passage

How will i apply this devotic	on and scripture in my life?

Reflection Prompt:

What part of my life am I afraid to speak about—but desperately need healing in?

Prayer Notes

Lord, I want to be whole. I choose honesty over image and vulnerability over pride. Heal me as I open up. Let confession bring clarity, community, and cleansing. I receive Your forgiveness, and I make room for Your healing to flood my life.

Action Step:

	Write down (privately) the one area you've been keeping silent about—whether sin, shame, trauma, or pain. Then, take a step of faith: Tell God everything—no edits. Ask Him to show you if there's someone safe you need to open up to next.
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Journaling Notes

Day 9 of 21

Delayed Doesn't Mean Denied

Scripture:

Habakkuk 2:3

"For the vision is yet for an appointed time; but at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry."

Devotional:

There's nothing more frustrating than knowing you've been faithful, obedient, prayerful—and still... waiting. Still stuck between promise and manifestation. Still trying to stay encouraged when everything feels paused.

But hear this: Delay is not denial.

God doesn't deal in wasted time—He deals in perfect timing. The space between your obedience and your outcome isn't punishment, it's preparation. And if you give up now, you'll miss what was always on its way.

What if the delay isn't to test your faith—but to train your faithfulness?

The vision is still alive. The promise is still good. The door is still scheduled to open—just not on your clock. Keep sowing. Keep seeking. Keep showing up. Your "suddenly" is coming.

Devotion Notes

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Reflection Prompt:

What promise have I started doubting simply because it's taking longer than I expected?

Prayer Notes

Father, I trust You in the delay. I silence every lie that says You've forgotten about me. I choose to wait in faith, not in frustration. Strengthen me while I wait. Mature me while I trust. And prepare me to carry the very thing I've prayed for.

Write down three areas of your life that feel stale or stagnant. Ask God honestly: "Is this a season You're calling me out of?" Sit quietly and listen.

Devotional:

The truth is, you don't need closure—you need healing. And healing comes from God, not from their explanation.

Don't mourn so long that you miss your moment.

Don't walk out of the fire in bitterness—walk out with boldness.
