

As an Accredited club we providing a consistent standard both on and off-pitch. We ensure we follow criteria set by England Football to ensure we are providing a fun, inclusive and safe environment for all to enjoy the game.

- Operate within a set of Club rules
- Have a Club Equality and Safeguarding Policy
- Ensure each youth team has access to at least one FA qualified coach with an in-date Emergency Aid and Safeguarding certificate.
- All relevant club officials have an in-date FA Enhanced Criminal Records Check
- Adopt the Football Leadership Diversity Code
- Have a football development plan covering at least 3 years



Code of Conduct: Coaches, Team Managers & Club Officials

All Coaches, Team Managers and Club Officials sign the FA's Code of Conduct at the start of each season.

In addition, all coaches are required to have an in date accepted FA DBS before coaching. This is part of our safe recruitment policy where coaches are also required to attend an interview with the committee.

An alleged breach of a code of conduct will result in the individual/s being approached by the club to explain their actions, in addition further sanctioned may follow depending on severity.

Play Your Part (Code of Conduct)

Coaches, Team Managers and Club Officials

Play your part and support The FA's Code of Respect:

On and off the field, I will:

- Always show respect to everyone involved in the game
- Stick to the rules and celebrate the spirit
 of the game
- Encourage fair play and high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the Referee and encourage players to do the same
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive behaviour
- Be aware of the potential impact of bad language on others
- Be gracious in victory and defeat
- Respect the facilities home and away





- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything
- Never tolerate any form of builying
- Ensure all activities are suited for the players' ability and age
- Work with others (e.g. officials, doctors, welfare officers, physiotherapists) for each player's best interests

I understand that If I do not follow the Code, I may be:

- Required to meet with the club or league Welfare officer or your CFA Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSO).
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- Required to leave, lose my position and/or have my license withdrawn



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Code of Conduct: Young Players

At the start of each season every player at the club is asked to sign the code of conduct you can see on the right.

As a club we pride ourselves on being respectful to all our opponents and we would ask our players to be aware of this either whilst playing or on social media.

Play your best. Be your best.

Make sure you and everyone around you has a good time on and off the pitch.

Play Your Part (Code of Conduct)

Young Players

Play your part and support The FA's Code of Respect:

When playing football, I will:

- Always play my best for the benefit
 of the team
- Play fairly and be friendly
- Play by the rules and respect the Referee
- Shake hands with the other team win or lose
- Listen carefully to what my coach tells me
- Understand that a coach has to do what's best for the team
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club
- Encourage my team mates
- Respect the facilities home & away



I understand that if I do not follow the Code, I may:

- Be asked to apologise to whoever I've upset
- Receive a formal warning
- Be dropped, substituted or suspended from training



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Code of Conduct:

Spectators and Parents/Carers

At the start of the season we ask a parent/carer of every child at the club to sign the Code of Conduct which can be seen on the right of this page.

As a club we want to provide the best possible environment for your child to have fun and learn. To do this we need your help and to follow the expectations listed of spectators and parents/carers. You will find a designated spectator RESPECT barrier alongside the pitch at all youth games which you are required to stand behind.

We will also be working with Essex County FA to provide a spectator workshop once a season. This is something the club will require at least one adult from each household to attend.

If we behave positively during practice and matches, our children will too.

By setting a good example, we'll help build a supportive environment in which everyone can enjoy themselves.

Play Your Part (Code of Conduct)

Spectators and Parents/Carers

Play your part and support The FA's Code of Respect:

- Have fun; it's what we're all here for!
- Celebrate effort and good play from both sides
- Always respect the Referee and coaches and encourage players to do the same
- Stay behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)
- When players make mistakes, offer them encouragement to try again next time
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour



I understand that if I do not follow the Code, I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning or asked to leave
- Required to meet with the club committee, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Obliged to undertake an FA education course
- Requested not to attend future games, be suspended or have my membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents and/or issued a fine





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Guide to Youth Football

As a club we would recommend you to read 'The FA's #PlayYourPart Youth Football Guide' which can be found using the QR code below. You will be redirected to Essex County FA's website where the document can be found at the bottom of the page in 'related documents'.

This document is all you need to know to create the environment where everyone can enjoy football. You will find details of age formats, match length and good practise examples.

Under 7 – Under 11 football is 'non competitive' which means no results are published. At the conclusion of the season there are no league winners. Please refrain from posting score lines on social media if your child plays within these age groups.

Under 12-under 18 football is 'competitive' which means results are published on the leagues website and will see winners, promotions and relegations at the conclusion of each season.

Please familiarise yourself with the club ethos on things such as equal playing time, player selection .

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Subscriptions / Membership Fees
