Senator Rand speaks for 10 hours over the NSA Surveillance Program FISA

May 21, 2015, 5:00 AM ET

Rand Paul voiced his opposition to the Patriot Act, which authorizes bulk collection of Americans' phone records by the government. Paul says collecting the records is an assault on civil liberties. On the Senate floor yesterday, Kentucky Senator Rand Paul started talking. He spoke for 10 hours about his opposition to NSA surveillance of Americans' phone records.

SENATOR RAND PAUL: "The American people say enough's enough. We want our privacy protected. We want the government to take less of our records. There comes a time - there comes a time in the history of nations when fear and complacency allow power to accumulate and liberty and privacy to suffer. The bulk collection of Americans' phone records under the Patriot Act violates constitutional guarantees against unlawful searches and seizures. We're talking about an enormous amount of information. We're talking about all of your phone records all of the time. The government should need a court order to get that data from phone companies for terrorism investigations. Paul says this still doesn't go far enough to roll back the government's reach. Some people are so fearful, they're like, how could we get terrorists? We'll be overrun with terrorists, and ISIS will be in every drug store and in every house in America if we don't get rid of the Constitution, if we don't let the Fourth Amendment lapse, if we don't just let everybody pass out warrants."

There is a 50-50 chance Senator Rand may run for president in 2028.

Excuses for keeping FISA as is:

"Reauthorizing Section 702 of FISA is a national security imperative. For decades, it's helped our intelligence community monitor foreign threats and identify plots before they happen. Letting the program expire would dismantle that progress at the exact moment we need it.

"Critics focus on the risk of abuse; however, the guardrails Congress placed on FISA in 2024 are working. The Justice Department's Office of the Inspector General found that the FBI followed the rules correctly over 99% of the time in both 2024 and 2025. Additionally,

today's reauthorization includes added penalties for FBI employees violating guardrails, additional oversight over the FBI's use of Section 702, and a requirement for a government audit over the intelligence community's FISA targeting procedures.

"We should continue to monitor FISA compliance, and seek continued improvement, but the threats to our nation won't pause. Neither should the tools that stop them."

PRESENT STATE OF THE FISA SECTION 702

Congress passed a 45-day clean extension of FISA Section 702, which temporarily extends the warrantless surveillance program until June 12, 2026, while lawmakers negotiate comprehensive reforms. This measure passed the House by a vote of 261-111 and the Senate by unanimous consent.

- **The 45-day extension:** Pushed through just before a looming deadline, this patch allows intelligence gathering to continue uninterrupted while serving as a buffer for the deeply divided Congress.
- **The 3-year House Bill:** Just prior to the extension, **the House passed a 3-year reauthorization bill (often tied to S. 1318) which included an unrelated and controversial ban on Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC)**. The Senate declined to clear this version due to the CBDC attachment and privacy concerns.

Ongoing Policy Debates

- **The Core Issue:** Section 702 permits warrantless surveillance of non-U.S. targets located abroad. However, it sweeps in vast amounts of Americans' personal data, which federal agencies can query—a process widely known as "backdoor searches".
- **Reformer Stances:** Privacy advocates are heavily lobbying for legislation like the Foreign Intelligence Accountability Act, which would require agencies to obtain a warrant before querying the communications of U.S. citizens.
- **Intelligence Stances:** National security officials have heavily pushed for a clean renewal, citing Section 702 as a critical tool that provides a majority of the actionable intelligence in the President's Daily Brief.
