### **Itinerary Highlights**

## Day 1: Bishkek → Kyzyl-Oi (via Kara-Balta & Suusamyr Plateau) Accommodation: Homestay in Kyzyl-Oi

- Kara-Balta: Explore the haunting remains of Soviet uranium processing facilities.
- Too-Ashuu Pass (3,180m): Ascend via the old Soviet road, with sweeping mountain vistas.
- Suusamyr Plateau: Traverse vast alpine meadows, rarely visited by tourists.
- Kyzyl-Oi: Overnight in a guesthouse nestled in a dramatic red canyon along the Kekemeren River.

### Day 2: Kyzyl-Oi → Kazarman (via Kara-Keche Pass) Accommodation: Homestay

- Kara-Keche Pass (3,384m): Cross a rugged, scenic pass flanked by abandoned coal mining machinery.
- Song-Köl Lake (optional detour): Visit this high-altitude lake, famed for its nomadic yurts and tranquil beauty.
- Kazarman: Arrive in a remote town on the edge of the mountains.

# Day 3: Kazarman → Kök-Janggak (via Kaldama Pass) Accommodation: Homestay or adventurous camping

- Kaldama Pass (3,062m): Experience a remote mountain crossing with breathtaking views.
- Kök-Janggak: Explore a semi-abandoned coal town, with Soviet-era apartment blocks and relics of industrial history.

# Day 4: Kök-Janggak → Kara-Kuldzha Valley Accommodation: Homestay or adventurous camping

- Kara-Kuldzha Valley: Journey through red cliffs and traditional villages, with opportunities for short hikes depending on the weather.
- Uzgen: Visit the 12th-century Karakhanid mausoleums and the iconic Uzgen Minarettestaments to the region's Silk Road heritage.

# Day 5: Kara-Kuldzha → Osh (via Ferghana Mountains) Accommodation: Local guesthouse/Hotel in Osh (not included)

- Ferghana Mountains: Cross high-altitude switchbacks, passing isolated shepherd villages and panoramic viewpoints.
- Suleiman-Too: Arrive in Osh and visit the sacred mountain, a UNESCO World Heritage
   Site
- Celebration: mark the journey's end with local BBQ shashliks and a party dinner.

#### This expedition is shared cost:

You should prepare 150 to 210 EUR per person for the 5 days Osh–Dushanbe trip, depending on th final number of participants. Payment at the starting point.

#### This covers:

- Fuel
- Food and drinks
- Accommodation (yurt camps, guesthouses,)
- Potential activities and entrance fees
- Miscellaneous local expenses

#### Not included:

- Transport to Bishkek
- Celebration diner in Osh
- Accommodation in Osh

#### Q: When is the best time to travel?

A: Late May to mid-September offers the best weather and open passes.

#### Q: How challenging is the route?

A: The journey includes high-altitude passes and rough roads. Basic fitness and a spirit of adventure are required.

#### Q: What are the accommodations like?

A: Expect simple guesthouses, homestays, and occasional wild camping. Facilities are basic but clean and welcoming.

#### Q: Will there be Wi-Fi?

A: Connectivity is limited outside major towns. Prepare for a digital detox.

#### Q: How does this expedition support local communities?

A: By staying with local families and using community-run guesthouses, your visit directly benefits rural Kyrgyzstan.
