1. Subject

The subject is the person or thing performing the action in a sentence.

Example:

- John plays football.

- The cat is sleeping.

2. Verb

A verb expresses an action or a state of being.

Example:

- She runs every morning.

- They are happy.

3. Object

The object receives the action of the verb.

Example:

- She reads a book.

- He bought a car.

4. Adjective An adjective describes a noun or pronoun.

Example:

- She has beautiful eyes.
- The tall boy won the race.

5. Adverb

An adverb describes a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.

Example:

- He speaks fluently.
- She runs very fast.

6. Conjunction

A conjunction connects words, phrases, or clauses.

Example:

- I like tea and coffee.
- She was late because of the traffic.

7. Pronoun

A pronoun replaces a noun to avoid repetition.

Example:

- He is my best friend.
- They went to the market.

8. Preposition

A preposition shows the relationship between a noun (or pronoun) and another word in the sentence.

Example:

- The book is on the table.
- She lives in New York.
