This workshop will explore strategies that foster collaboration and promote active reading. We will explore how social annotation platforms and collaboration tools can be used to annotate texts collaboratively, crowdsource information, and encourage authentic exchange in order to help students make the transition from passive to active reading. This workshop will also aim to introduce language acquisition techniques and ideas to increase student engagement at different levels (from beginner to advanced): it will introduce practical communicative activities that immerse French students in authentic tasks and reflect on ways in which instructors can draw upon their own creativity, as well as on that of their students.

The first part of the workshop will be dedicated to the exploration of practical activities that promote active reading and creativity. Following a presentation, participants will work in small groups to exchange ideas for classroom use and reflect on their pedagogical approach. Finally, participants will discuss the role of emerging technologies (including AI) in creating learning environments that foster intercultural competence, facilitate vocabulary acquisition and enhance engagement.
