Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Awasthi Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Ward no. 09, Nalagarh, Distt. Solan-174101, Himachal Pradesh (Inst. ID: - AYU0790)** inspection was conducted on **17.03.2025 and 18.03.2025 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **3<sup>rd</sup> Renewal of Permission with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

**1. Teaching staffs:-**

a) **Availability of total teaching staff for UG ( BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college**

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3) The assessment report was placed in the **133<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on **11.07.2025** Board discussed and decided to ask the college for Clarification regarding the aforementioned defects/ shortcoming found during the assessment and for the same a clarification letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated **12.07.2025**. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification **vide an email dated 17.07.2025** enclosing a letter **vide ref. no. AMCH/NLG/2025/275/C-2408 dated 17.07.2025** and the submitted clarification is examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and after **verification observation is as under:-**

The first batch of Third Professional class shall commence from February 2026</p> <p>2. As per Clause 67(4) of the Minimum Standard Regulations (MSR) 2024, the teaching staff for the Third Professional Year must be made available at least six months before the commencement of the said year. In our case, the college is currently running only the First and Second Professional Years. The 2022 batch was promoted to the Second Professional Year in August 2024 and their university annual examinations are scheduled in December 2025. At the time of submission of Performa Part-I and during the inspection, there were more than six months remaining before the commencement of the Third Professional Year. Hence, the appointment of faculty for the Third Professional Year was not mandatory as per MSR 2024 at that point of time. (Annexure I)</p> <p>3. Furthermore, we would like to mention that the process of appointing new faculty is already underway, and several faculty members have been appointed in the departments of the Third Professional Year.</p> <p>4. You are also requested to kindly consider Table 10, Column 3 of MSR 2024 under the Human Resource Development (HRD) Cell, which provides an 18-month period for the establishment and Appointment of new faculty. This process is currently in progress at our institution. (Annexure II)</p> <p>5. Teaching Staff (a): At the time of submission of Performa Part-I and inspection, the college had a total of 8 lower faculty members (including a Sanskrit lecturer) and 7 higher faculty members. As per MSR 2016, the total required teaching staff for First and second Prof is 17 teachers, plus one part-time Yoga teacher.</p>	<p><b>1.)</b></p> <p><b>a.) We had a total of 15 teachers out of 17 required for the First and second Prof and fulfilling the requirement after applying the permissible 10% relaxation as per your guidelines. (Annexure III)

Shortcomings as Mentioned in Your Letter:

i. Department of Rachana Sharir: At the time of inspection, only one higher faculty was available. However, we have now appointed one Assistant Professor, Dr. Nikita Verma. Appointment and joining letters are attached herewith.

ii. Department of Rog Nidan: The process of appointing one higher faculty is underway, and we assure you that the appointment will be finalized shortly. iii. Department of Prasuti & Stree Rog: One lower faculty member has already been appointed, and the remaining appointments are in progress.

iv. Department of Kaumarbhritya / Bal Rog: One lower faculty member is currently working as a consultant. The rest of the faculty appointments are under process.

v. Department of Kayachikitsa: Two lower faculty members are working as consultants. Dr. Kusum is due for promotion as Associate Professor in November 2025. Remaining appointments will be made accordingly.

vi. Department of Shalya Tantra: At the time of inspection, one lower faculty member was working as a consultant. Subsequently, one more lower faculty has been appointed. Additional appointments are of higher under in progress.

vii. Department of Shalakyta Tantra: Two lower faculty members have been appointed. One of them, Dr. Narender Chanchal, is scheduled for promotion as Associate Professor in November 2025.

viii. Department of Panchkarma: Note: One lower faculty member is working as a consultant and the remaining appointments are under process.

**f.) Department of Shalakyta Tantra:-**

**Dr.smriti kaul (AYSK01263)** working as assistant professor in department of shalakyta tantra on verification on **OTMS appointment request is in process so may be considered.**

However **Dr. Narender Chanchal cannot be considered as an Associate Professor so shortcoming persist for 01 Higher faculty**

**g.) Department of Panchkarma:-**

**Shortcoming persist for Higher faculty.**

**Further,** the teaching staff for the Third Professional Year must be made available at least six months before the commencement of the said year, therefore only 2<sup>nd</sup> proff staff is required.

**Considering the same Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is**

- 4) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined once again in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **135<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **18.06.2025** and **Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue the 3<sup>rd</sup> renewal of permission with an intake capacity of capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**

**"DECISION"**

- 5) **Therefore, 3<sup>rd</sup> Renewal of Permission is granted to Awasthi Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Ward no. 09, Nalagarh, Distt. Solan-174101, Himachal Pradesh (Inst. ID: - AYU0790) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming and the following requirements shall be fulfilled:-**
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
  - 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
  - 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
  - 9) **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
  - 10) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
    - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
    - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
    - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
    - iv) The shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 3 shall be fulfilled.
  - 11) The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation there under, are in position before

the admission of 4<sup>th</sup> batch of students in the 1<sup>st</sup> professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.

- 12) The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time in accordance with the Regulation (66) of MESAR 2024 which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 13) The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 14) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the renewal of permission for the academic session 2026-27.
