

Thank you to those who attended our ThinkUKnow Presentation. The session was led by Wade Spokes, a Detective Leading Senior Constable at Benalla Sexual Offences and Child Abuse Investigation Team (SOCIT). Wade's key takeaways were:

- Know which apps your children are using
- turn off location information on their devices
- turn on privacy settings
- monitor their use of devices, if they are worried about you seeing what they are doing, they probably shouldn't be doing it!
- Tell them to block anyone acting inappropriately
- Report any request for inappropriate image to the police and block the person immediately
- Tell your child that they have not done anything wrong

There will be a ThinkUKnow presentation for the students from Grades 3 to 6 in Term 2.

"Dindi Daze" - A new fun filled family focussed event, celebrating all that is good in Murrindindi. This free entry event will be based in Rotary Park, Alexandra, and will include a morning and afternoon of free of charge children focussed activities and prizes, such as face painting, competitions, games for young as well as older children and a mobile "petting" farm.
