January 12, 2026

The treasurer reported a balance of \$15,844.73 in the checking account, \$9071.88 is guild funds and \$6772.85 is from the Stonecutter grants. The report was accepted as presented.

There was a discussion during the board meeting that there were to be 11 members on the board. Amy Hudson said she had been asked to be a member at large, so with that information we have a complete board.

The budget will be available next month.

Community Service Project For August Sit-n-Sew

Block 1

This block will be $12\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ after assembly. Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

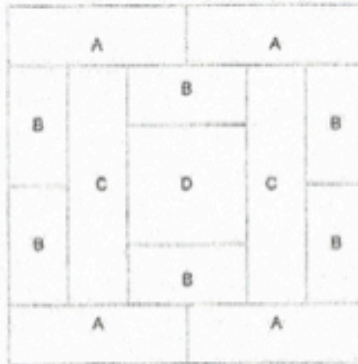
Cutting instructions below.

A – Cut 4 pieces $6\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$

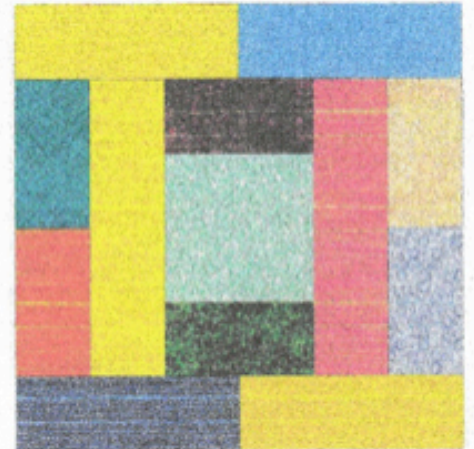
B – Cut 6 pieces $4\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$

C – Cut 2 pieces $8\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$

D – Cut 1 piece $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$



Follow the grid above for assembly



Make at least 2 or 3 blocks; more if you like. Make first block and make sure it will square up to $12\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$. If it comes out a little short, make next blocks a smaller 'scant' quarter-inch.

This year, we will be collaborating on a Community Service Project by making blocks for the 2026 Sit-n-Sew. We encourage all members to take part in this effort. Ideally, each member would contribute at least two or three of each block (there will be four blocks in total). As blocks are completed, please bring them to the following month's meeting. Candi Reed and Jackie Wallace will be collecting the blocks ahead of our August Sit-n-Sew, during which we will transform these blocks into quilts.

From: Candi Reed...Rutherfordton Quilt Guild 2026 President:

I thought I would start by giving you all a little of my quilting journey. My very first quilt was about 45 years ago. I pieced the top, this was when a quilt needed to be quilted by hand. I started that process and quickly realized I would never finish quilting that top. (Even now doing the quilting is still not my thing) and got a group of my church ladies to help with the quilting. It was used as a fundraiser for the church. My next quilt adventure didn't start until 2002 when I went to my first quilt festival in Vermont. My daughter reintroduced me to quilting, it became our 'girl' thing. I have attended many quilt shows since then, and volunteered at the Vermont Quilt Festival every year since 2003 until it was discontinued a couple years ago. Most of my quilts end up as gifts. A good many of which I forgot to document with pictures. Note to self...a part of adding the label is taking a picture. This newsletter includes a block, we want to get all members involved in the charity portion of the guild's mission. We have chosen easy blocks. We want to make completing blocks simple, in an effort to have members make more than 'just a couple' blocks throughout the year. Bright and scrappy is our goal. Cut up those pieces of fabric you can't remember why you have them, or just don't fit into the color place you now are as a quilter. Some of those fabrics Bonnie Hunter says "If they still are ugly, you haven't cut them small enough". The blocks introduced through the year should work together in a mix and match sort of way. We look forward to good programs and workshops this year.

Underground Quilt (Panel) Workshop

Saturday, March 21st 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.



In this workshop, you'll learn how to size your borders to fit your panel. We'll also cover options for piecing flying geese blocks that will make piecing the blocks easy and accurate. There will be samples to show you how color placement changes the visual impact of the quilt.

Underground Class Supply List

1 panel

½ yard of coordinating fabric to use for coping strips if needed

At least 12 coordinating fat quarters (or the equivalent yardage in scraps)

Rotary mat and cutter

Quilting ruler at least 6" x 12"

Deb Tucker Wing Clipper 1 ruler (I will have at least one to share in class)

Optional: *Schoolhouse Quilts* has some for purchase or buy online

Underground pattern (will be provided in class)

Sewing machine in good working order

Basic sewing supplies (thread, scissors, pins, seam ripper, etc.)

Optional: 20 ½" square ruler (I will have one to share with the class)
