Birth Flower / Birthstone
Quilt Challenge 2026

Instructions:

Determine your birth month elements (chart on next page)

- 1 Birthstone: Identify your birthstone (e.g., January is Garnet).
- 2 Birth Flower: Find the flower that corresponds to your birth month (e.g., January is Carnation).
- 3 Colors: Pull fabrics in the colors associated with both your birthstone and flower. For January, this would be red, white, and pink.
- 4 Size: 20"x 20" minimum
no larger than 60"x 70"
- 5 Theme: Theme should represent your birth flower and birthstone. You may also incorporate the meanings of both or just one in your quilt.
- 6 Technique: Choose any quilting technique, such as a traditional block pattern, appliqué, or free-motion quilting, embellishments.
- 7 Deadline: Your entry must be a quilt and completed by the December Guild meeting
Monday, December 14, 2026.
- 8 Stretch yourself, think outside of the box, use your imagination, but most of all
