President's Corner

Dear Members,

I recently read an interesting article doubt displaying your quilts by Nancy Smith and Lynda Milligan. Thought you might find it interesting too. They talk about the 3 R's - refold, rotate, and regularly clean. It is important to refold them often, rotating where the folds occur. Rotate so the weight of the quilt is distributed evenly, hanging puts lots of stress on the quilts. Finally, regular cleaning is a must. Vacuum your quilts to remove dust, and vacuum on both sides. You can also use a soft brush. Or pop it in your dryer for a few minutes on the "fluff" cycle (5-10 minutes). The 3 R's will ensure your prized possession will look their best and last a life time.
