CHECK ONE CATEGORY

Quilt is large if total perimeter is 265 inches or greater, small is less than an 265 in perimeter
1. Large quilt – pieced
2. Large quilt – applique/mixed techniques/hand embroidered
3. Small quilt – pieced
4. Small quilt – applique/mixed techniques/hand embroidered
5. Wall hanging – pieced
6. Wall hanging – applique/mixed techniques/hand embroidered
7. Machine embroidered quilt – any size
8. Miniature – All aspects of the quilt are reduced in size. Blocks must not exceed 4 inches.
9. Innovative art quilt – any size – reflects substantial deviation from traditional patterns and sets.
10. Wearable – jacket, vest, dress; all or some parts must have three layers
11. Miscellaneous – table runners, pillows, placemats, curtains, purse, etc.
12. Group – created by 2 or more people, round robin
13. Junior Quilter – 18 years old or younger, beginner quilter.
14. Challenge – Interpretation of theme by guild members for the year 2024

QUILT ENTRY

Judges have the right to re-categorize any quilt.

Categories 15-21 are professionally quilted quilts. This is where the quiltmaker has paid for the quilting to be done by machine or hand (perimeter requirements as previously stated apply)





Minutes of meeting of the Rutherford Quilt Guild July 14, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Barbara Welge. We had one guest present who was welcomed. The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as printed in the newsletter. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$15,637.02 in the checking account. The report was accepted.

Gwen Moore gave an update on the upcoming quilt show. Signup sheets are available on a front table, please sign up to work sometime during the show. Entry forms are now available, some are on a table at the front, they have also been attached to the July newsletter. If you are printing them yourself, print on the front and back of the page only. One form per entry is required. The necessary paperwork has been completed to sell tickets outside WalMart, The raffle quilt will be at the Forest City WalMart on August 7, 2025.
