"Caveman Square-Dance"

with Susan Skuda Rutherford Quilt Guild July 15, 2025



This is a GREAT stash-buster!

Select colors you love. Batiks, solids, hand dyes, tone-on-tones work well in this project.

Bright and bold colors give the quilt its wild and crazy look, but it has been beautifully made using softer colors as well. Throw in one or two multi-color fabrics or prints and/or a black and white stripe, dot or print for added interest and a bit of zing! Bring extra fabric to give yourself options as you create.

The more variety available to work with, the more interesting your quilt will be and the more fun you will have!

You may choose to mix warm colors (red, orange, pink, yellow) with accents of cool colors (turquoise, green, blue and purple). This quilt looks great in any color combination but needs contrast to sing! Caution – an abundance of bold prints tends to get a bit overwhelming, and the magic can get lost in the chaos. Be sure to include a good supply of blenders to balance out any prints.

This quilt may be as large or as small as you like. The standard size is about 60" x 60" and is made up of 36 blocks. Ideally you will have at least 36 different fabrics to work with.

If you are using fat quarters, I suggest at least 15-20 for ample selection.

Your top piecing thread will show! Please bring plenty of fun, bright or variegated thread to enhance your quilt and plenty of neutral bobbins. We will also use neutral thread for some traditional piecing.

Fabric for borders – approximately $1 \frac{1}{2}$ - 2 yds that will contrast with your block fabric (think solid, neutral, gray, white or black).

Class Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order with a regular sewing foot, ¼" footor open toe foot. (You will use a straight stitch for construction.)
- Power cord, power strip, extension cord, additional light and cushion for your chair, if desired.
- Solid bright or variegated machine thread. It will be visible!
- Neutral sewing thread and 1-2 full bobbins of neutral thread.
- Regular sewing supplies: sharp scissors, straight pins, sewing machine needles, etc.
- Rotary cutter and cutting mat, iron and pressing surface
- Pre-cut fabric squares (see Pre-Class Prep below)
- Fabric for borders. You will need approximately 1 ½ 2 yds. that contrasts with block fabric

PRE-CLASS PREP: Pre-cutting prior to class is essential!

Cut either: 16, 25 or 36 of the following:

9x9", 6x6" and 3 ½"x 3 ½"squares, depending on what size you want your quilt center before borders. (16 blocks = 30", 25 blocks = 38", 36 blocks = 46")

A mix of warm and cool colors works well, some in each size. Please bring extra fabric for additional options as needed. Contrast is key to creating an enchanting design.

Prepare to come and play with color and favorite fabrics! The block building is easy!
In class, we will learn easy block construction and the magic of those super-simple "zig-zag" borders.





The business meeting continued at 7:57PM. We had two guests who were welcomed. The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as printed in the newsletter. The treasurer reported a balance of \$8933.52 in the checking account, the CD renewed with a balance of \$7622.56, her report was accepted.

Gwen Moore talked about the quilt show. She feels everything is progressing nicely, the inventory has been done. We need volunteers to take the raffle quilt to various venues to sell tickets. We are doing the paperwork to be able to sell tickets at WalMart. Barb has the raffle tickets, please pick yours up. Gwen requests committee chairs have signup sheets for working at the show available for people to sign up at the July meeting. We still need volunteers for take down after the show.

Martha McGinnis reported that we have been given a grant from the Stonecutter Foundation. \$2000.00 is for the quilt show and \$3000.00 is for education.

Community service projects are to be quilts for the Rutherfordton Fire Department (a committee has been formed to coordinate this).

Also quilts for the new DSS facility, they have eight beds. The quilts will go with the children so there will be an ongoing need for twin size quilts Barb already has two quilts finished.

June will be our annual salad supper, the guild will provide the chicken and ham. Please bring a dish to share.

Jane Chownyk said there would be a workshop on the Tuesday after the meeting in July. It will be "CaveMan Square Dance", by Susan Skuda. She will have more information at the June meeting

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20PM.
