

On Saturday, April 5, 2025, the Extension Master Gardener SM Volunteer Association of McDowell County is hosting a garden symposium, GARDENING OUTSIDE THE LINES. This symposium brings together amateur backyard gardeners and gardening professionals for a day of insightful presentations featuring dynamic speakers who are leaders in their field. Brie Arthur is a bestselling author and gardening personality who is widely known for her leadership with the national Foodscape movement and her lively, information packed presentations. She is a long-time contributor on the Emmy award winning PBS Television show "Growing a Greener World". There will be two opportunities to hear her speak that day and her topics will be <u>Seeds of Enchantment:</u> Cottage Gardening from Seed and Bountiful Containers: Foodscaping in Pots.

Basil Camu is the co-founder of Leaf & Limb and Project Pando. He is a Treecologist, International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Board Certified Master Arborist, Duke graduate, Wizard of Things, and author of the book "From Wasteland to Wonder - Easy Ways to Help Heal Earth in the Sub/Urban Landscape." The mission of Leaf & Limb is to preserve, plant, and promote trees in a manner that attempts to maximize positive benefits for members of all ecosystems. He will speak about <u>From Wasteland to Wonder – Easy Ways We Can Help</u> <u>Heal Earth in the Sub/Urban Landscape.</u>

Felder Rushing has traveled to all fifty states (lectured in 36) and across five continents looking for interesting gardening angles to share via his extensive lecturing, writing and broadcasting. The graduate horticulturist and free-thinking university professor has written syndicated newspaper columns for 40 years and hosted a live radio program for nearly that long, including 15 years now as the weekly host of The Gestalt Gardener, one of National Public Radio's most popular gardening programs. He will talk about <u>Slow Gardening North</u> <u>Carolina Style</u>, a rollicking romp through ways to get the most out of our gardens all year, using all our senses and <u>Over and Under the Fence, p</u>ass along plants of all types as ways to create and maintain communities.

Along with this amazing lineup of talent, attendees will be provided a delicious lunch and time to shop at local vendor booths, including the opportunity to buy books from the speakers. The guild will be having a "Yard Sale" in May, part of the proceeds will go to the guild and part to the members. Be collecting anything craft related that you no longer need to sell in May.

Barbara Welge thanked everyone who brought items for the Backpak program, we will collect items again in two months.

Jane Chownky spoke about upcoming programs for the year.
