Yvonne Buchan said take in for judging will be at the Rutherfordton Presbyterian Church on October 13, 2025 from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm. Entry forms are due on September 8, 2025.

Martha McGinnis reported that a pattern has been selected for the Rutherfordton Fire Department quilts and fabric will be purchased at the Foust sale.
