Law & Grace

The Law is diagnostic, not therapeutic.

But Now... (Romans 3:21) – The Great Turning Point

Grace doesn't make us lawless; it empowers us to
live righteously.

- Grace isn't a free pass to sin (Romans 6:1-2), but power to overcome it.
- Salvation by works leads to pride; salvation by grace leads to worship.
- Grace doesn't give us room to boast — it gives us reason to kneel.

Repentance isn't earning grace; it's responding to it.

- The Law exposes our sin. Grace erases it.
- The Law demands righteousness. Grace delivers it.
- The Law condemns the best of us. Grace saves the worst of us.
