Portray Romans in three words?

Abraham's Justification by Faith

Abraham was declared righteous because he believed God, not because of his works. This underscores that faith, not deeds, is the basis for righteousness
(Romans 4:3)

Faith Precedes the Law

Abraham's righteousness was credited before the institution of the Law, indicating that faith transcends legalistic adherence

Faith and Grace Intertwined

Faith is the channel through which grace operates. It's not about earning God's favour but trusting in His promise, which is the essence of the Gospel (Romans 4:16)

Justification according to grace, through faith.

Vs:16: Therefore it is of faith that it might be according to grace, so that the promise might be sure to all the seed, not only to those who are of the law, but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all
