

2025 Spring White Geese Hunting Supplement

Despite declines over the last decade, white goose populations remain high and many birds will pass through Saskatchewan this spring. For a summary of provincial regulations, programs and wildlife management zones (WMZ), see the 2024-25 HuntersGuide at <u>saskatchewan.ca/hunting.</u> The most up-to-date version of the guide is available online. Paper copies may still be available at provincial licence issuers, Ministry of Environment field offices and select provincial park offices.

Wildlife habitat: (all hunters, excluding Canadian Armed Forces veterans)	
Veteran wildlife habitat: (Saskatchewan and Canadian resident veterans) Note: The ministry's automated licence system will ensure that any purchase of a hunting or fur licence will also include a valid Wildlife Habitat Licence (one-time purchase only).	
Saskatchewan resident game bird:	\$25
Veteran game bird: (Saskatchewan and Canadian resident)	Free
Canadian resident game bird:	\$100
Non-resident game bird:	\$200
Youth game bird: (Saskatchewan residents only) Note: Available only to Saskatchewan residents aged 12 to 18 years (inclusive), who have successfully complete a firearm safety/hunter education course.	
Federal Migratory Permit: A 2024 Federal Migratory Permit is required for all hunters and is available online at <u>permis-permits.ec.gc.ca/en</u> or from any post office or select licence issuers.	

Note: Hunting licences, whether paper or electronic, and any required seals or ledgers must always be carried with you when hunting.

Note: A 2024 federal permit is valid for the entire 2025 spring white geese season.

Open season for Spring White Geese (all hunters)

Hunting is allowed in wildlife management units (WMUs) and national wildlife areas within a game bird management district listed below. Only the provincial parks and recreation sites listed below are open to hunting. Prince Albert WMZ is closed to all game bird hunting.

North Game Bird District includes: WMZs 43, 47-50, 52-76; Fort à la Corne WMU; Clearwater River; Clarence-Steepbank Lakes; Athabasca Sand Dunes; Greenwater Lake; Great Blue Heron, Lac La Ronge, Meadow Lake, Narrow Hills, Porcupine Hills and Wildcat Hill provincial parks; Bronson Forest; Nesslin Lake and Round Lake recreation sites; and Prairie National Wildlife Area Units 1, 4, 6 and 7. South Game Bird District includes: WMZs 1-42, 44-46, Saskatoon and Regina/Moose Jaw zones; Duck Mountain, Moose Mountain, Saskatchewan Landing and Cypress Hills (West Block) provincial parks; the portion of Douglas Provincial Park located west of Diefenbaker Lake (Gordon McKenzie Arm); Bradwell, Last Mountain Lake, Stalwart, Tway and Webb national wildlife areas; and Prairie National Wildlife Area Units 2, 3, 5 and 8-28.

Canadian and non-resident game bird hunters must possess a harvest ledger that is registered with a valid game bird licence and carried with them while hunting. 2024 provincial game bird licences (and wildlife habitat certificates) are valid until March 31, 2025. 2025 game bird licences will be available April 1, 2025 for all hunters and will be valid until March 31, 2026. Blank harvest ledgers can be ordered ahead of time o obtained from Ministry of Environment field offices and select provincial park offices, and are registered when you purchase the game bird licence. White geese may be hunted all day (one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset) in both game bird districts.
