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# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a slip knot:



1) Place yarn tail over the main yarn from the ball to form a loop.



2) Position the yarn tail over and behind the loop you have just made.



3) Insert the hook under the single thread, and over both sides of the loop.



4) Tighten the knot by holding both threads securely and pulling the hook upwards.



5) The finished slip knot - note that the shorter yarn tail tightens.



# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a chain stitch:



1) Wrap yarn over hook (draw yarn from back to front of hook)

2) Pull loop through the loop on the hook

3) Repeat steps 1 and 2 until you have the required number of stitches



# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a double crochet stitch:



1) Insert hook into 2nd chain from hook



2) Wrap yarn over hook



3) Pull loop through (2 loops on hook and wrap yarn over)



4) Pull yarn over through both loops on hook (leaving one loop remaining on hook)



# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a half treble crochet stitch:



1) Create your chain, yarn over hook



2) Insert hook into 4th chain from hook, yarn over



3) Pull loop up, you now have 3 loops on your hook



4) Yarn over hook



5) Pull yarn over through all 3 loops (one loop left on hook)



# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a treble crochet stitch:



1) Create your chain, yarn over hook



2) Insert hook into 4th chain from hook, yarn over



3) Pull loop up, you now have 3 loops on your hook



4) Yarn over hook



5) Pull yarn over through 2 loops (two loops left on hook)



6) Yarn over hook



7) Pull yarn over through final two loops on hook leaving one loop remaining - treble crochet stitch complete!



# Crochet for Beginners

How to make a double treble crochet stitch:



1) Create your chain, yarn over hook twice



2) Insert hook into 5th chain from hook,



3) Pull loop up, 4 loops on your hook



4) Yarn over hook



5) Pull yarn over through 2 loops (3 loops left on hook)



6) Yarn over hook



7) Pull yarn over through two loops on hook, 2 loops left



6) Yarn over hook

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5) Pull yarn over through 2 loops (1 loop left on hook)
