Instructions: Print one copy for each student (you can print more of a page if you need it). Use a binder with dividers for each student. Place each copy behind a binder and label with the student's name. Update each section monthly with work samples, adding books read, field trips, new curriculum resources used and books read. By the end of the year, you have a complete portfolio for the school year!

For High School Students, print the HIGH SCHOOL section for keeping track of grades, course descriptions and credits. You'll need a Course Description page for each course. Keeping course descriptions on hand is recommended in the event that a student wants to go to college and needs to submit this along with their official transcript.

GRADE POINTS

A = 4.0
B = 3.0
C = 2.0
D = 1.0
F = 0.0

TYPICAL HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT GUIDELINES:

Full credit 1.0

~120–180 hours of work per year (aka ~1 hour/day, 5 days/week for a school year)

Half credit 0.5

~60–90 hours of work per year or a one-semester course

Quarter credit 0.25

~30–45 hours of work (short unit or enrichment course)

To determine total grade points, multiply the credits by the grade point value of the assigned grade.

Subject	Credits	Grade Point Value	Total Grade Points

To determine the total GPA, add the last column of total grade points earned together and divide it by the total grade points possible.

To determine the total grade points possible, multiply each subjects credits by 4 (A grade), then add together.

$$\frac{\text{Total Grade Points Earned}}{\text{Total Grade Points Possible}} = \text{GPA}$$
