Schnur Cottages Recipient Eligibility Requirements and Criteria

MISSION STATEMENT:

The mission of Islesboro Affordable Property (IAP) is to help in the maintenance and growth of Islesboro as a vital and successful year-round community.

Our program, to carry out that mission, is to do all that we can to ensure that affordable, good housing is permanently available for families and individuals who live and work in Islesboro year-round. We support residents who participate (or will participate) in community activities, and whose work is an essential part of day-to-day life on Islesboro.

IAP builds houses for sale or rent. We monitor the private real estate market. We raise funds from private and public sources to underwrite our program.

ELIGIBILITY for Rental of the Schnur Cottages

To be eligible for consideration, the applicant(s) must have fully completed this application.

- 1. Currently lives on Islesboro or intends to make Islesboro the permanent home.
- 2. The applicant must demonstrate a **need for affordable housing**, i.e., the applicant may not own a buildable lot, or an existing house and lot, in the Town of Islesboro at the time of application.
- **3.** The applicant must show that their **current income falls within the moderate range**, defined as up to 120% of the **2025** AMI, adjusted by household size, for Waldo County.
- 4. History of credit worthiness: applicants should have sufficient income to cover monthly rental payments.
- 5. **Current employment**: applicants should be gainfully employed for a minimum of 30 hours per week.

Important Note:

Rent for these two new three-bedroom houses has not yet been finalized but will be based on a sliding scale determined by income and household size. The State of Maine grant that allowed IAP to build the Schnur Cottages requires that rental applicants have incomes determined as moderate based on Average Medium Income (AMI) data for Waldo County, as determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and adjusted for household size. Applicant *income must be no more than 120% of the most current AMI family limits*.

The HUD chart below shows the 2024 Islesboro median family income levels, with percentage adjustments for family size. *Once the 2025 HUD moderate income data is available it will be posted, and rents on the Schnur Cottages will be determined.*
