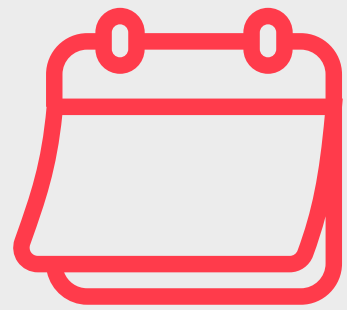
What is EVEREST Project About?

Inspired by EU values and strategies, we aim to break stereotypes, address discrimination, and encourage mutual respect through the art of dance. Through collaboration with partner organizations and young people from diverse backgrounds, we will exchange knowledge of traditional dances, including Afro-dance styles, Zeynek, Hopak, Flamenco, Tarantella etc, to create a unique, blended choreography.

What we will do during the Youth Exchange?

During the youth exchange in Luxembourg, participants will take part in a dynamic and creative program focused on intercultural learning through dance and collaboration.



Main Activities

- **Intercultural Workshops & Sessions**

Participants will engage in interactive workshops focusing on diversity, inclusion, cultural awareness, and mutual understanding.

- **Traditional Dance Presentations**

Each national team will present their traditional dance, including its cultural background and meaning.

- **Dance Workshops with Experts**

Professional dancers and trainers from PAP Association and partner organizations will lead workshops to develop participants' dance skills and creativity.

- **Creative Choreography Development**

Participants will collaborate to blend different traditional dance styles and create a unique, intercultural choreography.

- **Final Dance Performance**

All participants will co-design and perform a final dance show, showcasing unity, diversity, and creativity.

- **Youthpass & Learning Reflection**

Participants will reflect on their learning journey and receive a Youthpass certificate, recognizing their competences gained during the Erasmus+ experience.

What to prepare before the Youth Exchange?

To ensure a smooth and productive experience, participants are expected to prepare the following:

Dance Preparation

- Prepare and bring traditional costumes for your dance performances
- Meet with your national team to decide and practice your traditional dance
- Be ready to present the cultural meaning and story behind your dance

Personal Items

Please bring your personal necessities, such as:

- Slippers
- Towel
- Shampoo and toiletries
- Comfortable clothes suitable for dance activities

About the Venue

The venue offers a variety of facilities, including:

- A training and workshop room
- A fully equipped kitchen
- Indoor and outdoor fireplaces
- Sports and recreational activity areas

Accommodation will be provided in **shared rooms**, separated into **male and female dormitories**.

Bathrooms and toilets are **shared facilities**, also separated by gender.

Food & Accommodation

All food and accommodation costs are fully covered by the Erasmus+ programme grant.

Sleeping Arrangements

- Participants will be accommodated in dormitory-style sleeping rooms.
- Each room includes 4–6 bunk beds and is spacious enough to ensure a comfortable stay.
- Sleeping rooms are separated by gender.
- Sleeping bags will be provided for all participants by the organizers.

What you need to bring

Please make sure to bring your own:

- Towels
- Personal hygiene items (toiletries)

TRAVEL INSTRUCTIONS

The nearest airports are Luxembourg Airport, Charleroi Airport, and Brussels Airport.

Participants arriving at Charleroi or Brussels Airport are expected to travel to Luxembourg city center by train or bus. In Brussels, it is recommended to book a youth ticket, which offers a discounted fare.

Please note that public transportation within Luxembourg is free of charge.



How to reach the accommodation

From Luxembourg Airport:

From the airport exit, take **Bus 361 (direction Schrassig / Schlassgewan)**.

Get off at **Neuhaeusgen / Iewecht Neihaischen station**.

From there, walk approximately **2 minutes east**, and you will arrive at the accommodation.

From Luxembourg Central Station:

From **Luxembourg Central Station**, take **Train RB 5600 (direction Igel)**.

Get off at the **4th stop: Munsbach**.

After a **2-minute walk**, take **Bus 361 (direction Findel / Cargo Center)** from the **Munsbach, Kulturzentrum stop**.

Get off at **Neuhaeusgen / Iewecht Neihaischen station**.

From there, walk approximately **2 minutes east**, and you will arrive at the accommodation.

Travel Costs

Travel costs will be reimbursed based on original tickets and receipts, up to the maximum amounts per country listed below. Only actual costs supported by valid invoices and receipts will be covered.

- Belgium: up to 285.00 EUR
- Germany: up to 285.00 EUR
- Spain: up to 309.00 EUR
- Italy: up to 309.00 EUR
- Turkey: up to 395.00 EUR

Travel Reimbursement

If participants' travel costs exceed the maximum reimbursement limits listed above, the additional amount must be covered by the participants themselves.

Travel costs will be reimbursed after participants submit all required travel documents and complete the EU survey shortly after the project.

Green Travel

Participants choosing green transportation (such as bus or train instead of flights where applicable) may be eligible for a higher travel budget, as encouraged by the Erasmus+ programme.

Green travel conditions apply only to specific cases as defined by the organisers.

Participants using green travel may also be eligible for one additional travel day of accommodation, with accommodation costs covered up to 50 EUR.
