#### What Is a YouTube Channel Manager?

A Channel Manager is the strategic and operational manager behind a YouTube channel. You're not the face on camera—you're the force that gets the videos seen. From planning content to optimizing performance, you help creators and brands grow their presence and drive results.

#### Core Responsibilities of a YouTube Channel Manager:

- Research & pitch high-performing video topics
- Write compelling video titles & descriptions
- Create or oversee thumbnail design
- Upload, schedule & publish videos
- Manage backend settings (tags, playlists, end screens)
- Monitor analytics and adjust strategy
- Coordinate vidogrophers, video editors or designers

- Canva, Photoshop, AI Apps or Designers for thumbnail generation
- Google Drive / Sheets for content planning & file sharing
- YouTube Studio for uploads, analytics & research
- ChatGPT / Al tools for ideation, content writing, titles, tags, chapters & more
- Project management tools (Trello, Notion, ClickUp) to keep things on track
- Opus Clip or other apps that convert long form to short form
