Jesus & Money – Monetary Value

Synopsis: Knowing how much money was worth helps us to understand parables and metaphors better. In this lesson, we look at how much various denominations were worth and then look at several scriptures to see if knowing a little more about how much the money in question was worth, makes a difference.

Questions for Discussion or Journaling

- 3. Why was the widow's contribution worth more than the wealthy men who actually gave more?
- 4. If Jesus is the moneylender who has forgiven out sins, does it matter how much he has forgiven?

5.	Now that you know how much a talent is worth, would the parable have a different meaning if the servants received denarii instead of talents?
