## Jesus & Money – Two Money Parables



**Synopsis**: Out of over 40 parables, Jesus talked about money and wealth in over 10 of them. Here are two popular parables that talk about using money effectively and the behavior that money can drive us to. In both parables, Jesus uses money in the story to communicate a greater principles

## Biblical References (ESV, English Standard Version is used)

Text
For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property. To one he gave five talents, to another
two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went
away.
Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. <b>20</b> And he who had received the
five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here, I have made
five talents more.' <b>21</b> His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. <u>e</u> You have been faithful over a little; I will
set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.' <b>22</b> And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master,
you delivered to me two talents; here, I have made two talents more.' 23His master said to him, 'Well done, good and
faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.' 24He also
who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not
sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, 25so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you
have what is yours.' 26But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have
not sown and gather where I scattered no seed? <b>27</b> Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my
coming I should have received what was my own with interest. 28So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the
ten talents. <b>29</b> For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not,
even what he has will be taken away. <b>30</b> And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be
weeping and gnashing of teeth.'
Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother
sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus said
to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times.
<sup>23</sup> "Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who
wished to settle accounts with his servants. <sup>24</sup> When he began to settle,
one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. <sup>25</sup> And
since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife
and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. <sup>26</sup> So the
servant <sup>i</sup> fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Have patience with me, and I
will pay you everything.' <sup>27</sup> And out of pity for him, the master of that
servant released him and forgave him the debt. <sup>28</sup> But when that same
servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a
hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, 'Pay
what you owe.' <sup>29</sup> So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him,
'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' <sup>30</sup> He refused and went and

put him in prison until he should pay the debt. <sup>31</sup>When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. <sup>32</sup>Then his master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. <sup>33</sup>And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' <sup>34</sup>And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. <sup>35</sup>So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

## Questions for Discussion or Journaling

The following questions are perfect for a group discussion. If working individually, these questions are great for journal.

- 1. The wealthy man was pleased with the first two servants and what they were able to do with the money they received. He called them 'good and faithful servants'. Think about what God has given you. Describe how you have been a good and faithful servant with what you've been given.
- 2. The third servant didn't do anything with what he'd been given. Think of a time when you have squandered or wasted an opportunity that God has given you.
- 3. A talent is a lot of money (15-20 years wages). Is it possible the amount of money scared the last servant. Have you ever been fearful about the size of a blessing your were given or could have been given?
- 4. Describe a time you have struggled with forgiveness. What did you do to be able to forgive? Or did you?
- 5. God has forgiven us for all our sins, big and small. Why do we often have issues with forgiving others?
