# Saving Santa

Neighborhood artist restores a local holiday tradition of 'ole

During the holiday season from the 1940s to the 1970s, two 14.5-foot-tall Santa Clauses were mounted to the awning at Livingston's Department Store at 110 W. Washington Street, Bloomington. For many, visiting the store's Santas became a beloved family tradition. And thanks to Jeffrey Alan Wandell, the McLean County Museum of History, Founders' Grove Artist Andrew Jumonville, and a slew of others, this tradition is being revived.

### Where have the Santas been hiding?

Livingston's permanently closed in 1979, and the Santas were purchased by College Hills Mall where they were displayed for several years before being sold to Wandell, owner of Jeffrey Alans in Normal and Prairie Gardens in Champaign. Wandell continued displaying the Santas until they became too fragile for outdoor use and were put into storage.

In December 2023, Wandell donated both Santas to the History Museum, along with \$10,000 to help pay for significant restoration, site preparation and installation. Since that time, the History Museum has raised more than \$59,000 toward the projected renovation cost of \$85,000, with a goal to raise the remaining funds by December 31, 2024.

### Your Neighbor, the Restorer ...

Jumonville, of the 100 block of Kreitzer Avenue, has finished restoring the first

Santa and will continue work into late November to restore the second.


It's been quite the undertaking. "Over the course of the Santas' lives, they've been patched many times, and those patches needed to be redone," Jumonville said. "In addition to suffering water damage during their years in storage, at least one of the Santas had sustained injuries from a fall or from toppling over. They weren't supposed to last this long."

Jumonville explained the plaster Santas were originally hollow, covered in sign maker's paper (like cardboard), with a couple small pieces of steel tubing running through the inside. They were originally situated atop an awning and attached to the Read on, SANTA — page 4



side of the department store. Going forward, with Jumonville's reinforcements, the Santas will be

freestanding.

After removing all the fiberglass, cardboard and plaster patches that had been added over the past 80 years, Jumonville built two sleds made of box steel on which each Santa will stand. He then added a substantial

What's next?

The plan is for the Santas to be displayed annually from late November to mid-January.

**Santa 1:** A dedication ceremony for the first Santa is scheduled for **11:30 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 30**, on the southwest corner of the Museum Square in Downtown Bloomington.

**Santa 2:** The second Santa will eventually be displayed in Uptown Normal near the Children's Discovery Museum. The specific location will be confirmed after a nearby underpass project is complete – in 2026 or later.

his many other projects, Jumonville also created "*The Convergence of Purpose*," the statue featuring Abraham Lincoln, David Davis and Jesse Fell which welcomes people to the south lawn at the Bloomington Center for the Performing Arts.

Once the interior structure was in place and each

Santa was filled with foam, he carved the foam into

steel structure to the inside of each before filling the Santas with spray foam and attaching the new interior structures to the box sleds. Jumonville estimates he added 400 pounds to each Santa's bottom half and 150 pounds to each upper half.

### Winter bird watching

Winter bird watching can be a source of joy during the dreary winter months. It can be a fun family activity, as well as for those housebound during this season.

Here are some basics to

# Here are some basics to getting started:

- Purchase a field guide to birds, feeder/s, seed and binoculars.
- If you are going to feed, do it regularly. Birds tend to depend on a source where they have found food.
- Clean your feeders at least once a month and change the seed at least every two weeks.
- Provide a water source nearby but not under the feeder.

We interviewed Bill Inks, owner of AB Hatchery & Garden Center, to discuss the basics of bird watching in winter. Here are his answers:

- **1. What birds can be seen in winter?** *cardinals, finches, woodpeckers, chickadees and songbirds.*
- 2. Is it true you will have better luck getting the birds you want to see by providing specific seeds? Absolutely. AB has a special blend the former owners designed specifically for central IL birds. This blend will attract many of the birds in our area. Specific seeds for specific birds: finches like thistle; cardinals like safflower; blue jay like peanuts and woodpeckers like suet.
- **3. How do you decide what birdfeeder to buy?** The tube feeder will attract a variety of birds and is a good place to start. Finch seeds are tiny, so they fit best in a mesh bag. Suet has its own wire mesh holder a tail prop makes it easier for woodpeckers to feed. Hopper feeders have a larger storage area and bigger birds such as songbirds feed from it. Cardinals need a bigger perch than the tube feeder usually provides.
