Holiday Traditions: Majestic trees to rooftop reindeer

In our neighborhood, there's no shortage of holiday cheer. Drive down the street and you'll see evidence that the holiday season has begun even before it officially kicks off. That's also true with long-time neighbor and Bloomington native Jim White, who lives in Founders' Grove on Washington Street.

We visited Jim at his antique shop, A. Gridley Antiques, which he owns with his partner Andy Willits. We asked Jim to share his favorite holiday traditions. Jim said growing up, Christmas was the highlight of

the year in his family's home. His mother, who was of German heritage, let him fully embrace the magic of the season.

"She pretty much let me have whatever I wanted at Christmastime," Jim laughed. "But one thing was non-negotiable – we always had a real tree."

One year Jim decided the tree needed to be truly spectacular. "It was 9 feet by 9 feet," he recalled. "I had to string it up and attach it to the wood trim just to get it to stand!" That over-the-top spirit seems to have stayed with him, because today Jim brings that same enthusiasm to decorating his antique shop as well as his own home for the holidays.

Each year, right after the Halloween decorations come down, Jim and his team - including his partner Andy and shop assistant Mike Maupin get to work transforming the shop into a Christmas wonderland. "We always bring in a live tree," Jim said. "We try to get one that goes all the way to the ceiling." And with 12-foot ceilings, that's no small feat.

The enormous tree, which Jim and his crew wrangle into place and wire to the roofline, sits in an old washtub so it can be watered. The tree becomes the centerpiece of the display. Around it, vintage ornaments, twinkling lights and antique decorations fill every window and corner of the store.

With decorating buttoned up at the shop, it's time to bring a little sparkle to his home. The first job on Jim and Andy's list is getting a very large Santa and his reindeer up to the rooftop and secured for their stay through Christmas. Jim says putting up the display is his favorite part of the holidays especially since Andy gave him that Santa years ago.



HELLO, NEIGHBOR! Meet the Batemans, who renovated multiple FG homes

If there were an award for FGNA frequent homeowners, David and Jenni Bateman would be shortlisted.


They bought their first house in Normal in 1998, and since 2010 have renovated others on Fairview, Jackson (two) and Florence Streets in FGNA plus Oakland Court (two).

The Batemans took on challenges both big and small, presenting updated spaces that attracted new residents to the unique Founders' Grove neighborhood. Their commitment to FG and respect for the neighborhood, people, renters and buyers continue — even adding some as longtime friends.

Day Jobs: Easterseals and Inquisitive Artistry

The DIYers historically completed 90% of the work themselves, as a side-gig. Their careers began at 11,500 feet above sea level, where the newlyweds ran an Easterseals camp in Colorado in the late '70s.

David worked for the non-profit for four decades as the family moved through seven states until he retired as CEO/President of







management and growth of endowment funds intended to secure the future of Timber Pointe operations for generations to come.

Jenni is an established career-artist as a painter, illustrator, teacher and art-coach. She respects the process of creating commissions, gallery exhibitions, and seamlessly moves between paint and a mix of materials learned over decades of innovative and experimental work (JenniBatemancreative.com). She is actively engaged in the arts community, teaching and showing her work at both the McLean County Arts Center (upcoming solo exhibition 2026) and longtime involvement at Main Gallery 404.

Even now, over 20 years and counting, one FGNA home still boasts a 'mural' she painted on a dining room floor — a large rug, corner upturned in the process of French trompe-l'oeil or "fool the eye."

The Batemans now live 'FGNA adjacent' in a home they completed as a "redo" for themselves, "near-enough" to their daughter's family and two teenage grandsons, extending the motto: "Bringing health back, one sick house at a time."

Listening to Jim talk about Christmas, it's easy to see how much joy the season brings him. The traditions he grew up with have shaped not only his personal celebrations but also how he shares the holiday spirit with the community. His shop, glowing with lights and filled with memories, feels like an extension of those childhood Christmases – warm, welcoming, and a little bit larger than life.

"Christmas has always been a big deal for me," Jim said with a smile.

who grew up on Grove Street in the 1960s and returned here in retirement

Often our family hosted relatives from various parts of Illinois and beyond. When in Bloomington, we always went to church on Christmas Eve for an 11 p.m. Candlelight Service, which was inspiring and thrilling. I usually sang in one of the youth choirs.

We always waited until Christmas morning to open gifts, and it was a thrill to unwrap mine and watch others unwrap theirs.

Sometime on Christmas Day, the kids in and around the neighborhood would get together and compare & contrast the gifts they received. These get-togethers were EPIC because around 70 kids lived within a two-block radius of our Grove Street house, and 132 kids lived on my paper route (Olive, Taylor & Jackson Streets). At least two or three dozen of these former kids still live in B-N, and I cross paths with some of them wherever I go! THIS is the reason I returned to retire in Founders' Grove, after having lived in five other states over the past 50 years!

Sleigh bells once sweet sound on wintry city streets



Imagine stepping out your

front door and seeing streets blanketed in snow, alive with horse-drawn sleighs. According to Bill Kemp's "Pages from Our Past" column in The Pantagraph, this was once a common winter scene in Bloomington.

On Christmas Day 1878, elegant sleighs glided down smooth streets while finely dressed riders drew admiring crowds. A stretch of E. Washington Street — from downtown Bloomington to the Illinois Central Railroad tracks (now Constitution Trail) — was the place to be. Until the 1890s, thousands attended annual "sleighing carnivals" with free rides for children and 200-plus sleighs on parade.
