## Secretary's Report

**[Report presented in 7<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting, 2020-21 dated 04.05.2021]**

Dear Members,

I hereby present the Secretary's Report of the Trust in its 7<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting over the online conference mode. The second wave of Corona infection has literally paralysed the entire economy and made us stand a challenge of survival. However, we should not stop outreaching ourselves towards the need of our people.

We proceed our social support activities towards the need of the hour – donation of essential food items, home-to-home campaign, free schooling, special meals and various health-related programs. Nearly 580 people are benefitted out of these programs.

Sustainable agriculture is an invincible social welfare measure for the rural poor. We run four projects under VECT Bio farm. We have introduced Multilayer Vegetable Farming to encourage farmers imbibing the cost-effective organic cultivation of vegetables. Nearly 100 farmers make queries to this new production system. We also provide training on fishery and preparing organic compost to 65 youth aspirants.

The trust moves forward taking food and medicinal responsibility of one mentally challenged person. Alongside two other poor patients are assisted with small monetary help. Due to the COVID19 situation, the MNLP is continued only for four months offering a total of 800 plates of food to the distressed.

Our achievement in the area of research activities is remarkable. Two papers are published jointly in UGC-listed CARE journals and I was invited as a Resource Person to two international educational programs.

Our regular programs on sports, yoga and cultural events are continued in a limited way. We relentlessly tried to revive the spirit and enthusiasm of the COVID19 affected people. Our social services and welfare measures will be continued. Activity Teams have performed more than our expectations.

We convey our thanks and regards to all the supporters and kind donors for being with us in the hard times.

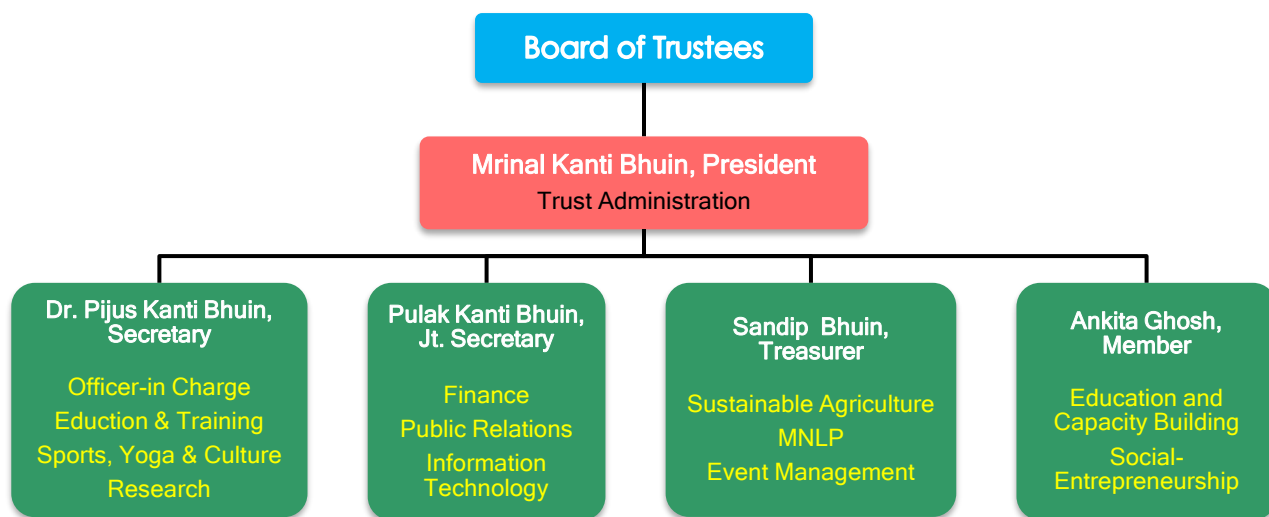

## Impact 2020-21

Our activities were limited to sustainable agriculture during the COVID19 lockdown period from April to May 2020. However, we initiated our functioning in other fields gradually in unlock period abiding by COVID19 protocol.

### **Education, Training and Capacity Building**

**Health Awareness Program:** A Health awareness program was organised on 12 September 2020 at Khirpai Primary School of Bankura District with the support of local ICDS worker Smt. Krishna Bhui for the adolescent girls on how to maintain health and hygiene practices in the home. Dr. P. K. Bhui addressed the audience regarding their role and responsibilities in home and locality to combat the COVID19 pandemic. A total of 35 local adolescent girls attended the program, and they were offered a small refreshment.

**Home Campaigns:** The trust formed a home visit team of five members who visited nearly 400 households of eight villages of Bankura District, namely, Raotara, Satsagaria, Dumurpal, Danga, Mahishdobra, Jhanktor, Gharathar and Chowranbaid during August-September 2020. A printed flyer (available on our website) is supplied and explained how to protect ourselves from the spread of COVID19. Villagers appreciated our drive.

**Free Tuition:** Due to the complete closure of government-sponsored schools, students, basically primary school children belonging to socioeconomically underprivileged families, deprived of regular learning. The trust has taken an initiative to provide free tuition for those children regularly at the Satsagaria Jr. High School. Ankita Ghosh led a team of three members to provide free tuition to 20 children of Rautora and Satsagaria village for four months - September to December 2020 considering all COVID guidelines. Children are instructed with modern teaching methodology and pedagogy. The learners enjoyed the learning and regain their deficiency.

**Fishery Training Program:** A fishery training program was organised at the village Rautora, Bankura District on 16 August 2020 on *Nourishing Fingerlings* following the COVID protocol.

Fishery expert Mr. Manik Karmakar explained to the trainees regarding feeding, disease control and water treatments for the fingerlings of local breeds. 25 local fish farmers participated in the program. Mr. Sudarshan Konar of Rautora village volunteered his pond as a training ground.

**Preparing for Organic Biopesticides:** A small demonstration programs were organised at the village Rautora showing how to prepare biopesticides using cow urine and neem leaf extract, and organic manure using cow dung, gram seed dust and molasses. Bipul Kant Bhui demonstrated the entire process on 27-28 November 2020 (3 - 5 pm) which was eagerly attended by 40 local farmers. He explained the cost-effectiveness and potential benefits of this biopesticide and organic compost in organic vegetable farming.

## ***Support to Deprived and Underprivileged***

**Food Donation Camp:** The Trust organized an essential food-items donation camp for the distressed people affected by the COVID-19 crisis on 16 April 2020 at Satsagaria Jr. High

School, Bankura following the safety measures. A kit containing rice, potatoes and pulse is donated to each of the 200 people who were invited from the nearby villages. Local administration was invited. The Officer-in-Charge of Indpur Police Station graced the program with his presence.

**Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program:** The Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLP), was discontinued from April 2020 to November 2020 due to the outbreak of COVID19 pandemic across the country. However, we resumed the program in November with 200 plates of food and continued to February 2021 on an expectation of normalcy. However, the program was again suspended in March 2021 due to 2<sup>nd</sup> wave of COVID19 attack.

**Caring Responsibilities:** Mr. Arun Kumar Bhui, a mentally challenged person and left alone by relatives of Rautora village, is provided food and medicine throughout the year.

**Financial Help:** Mr. Abdul Jabbar Mandal of Kurpa village is donated by Rs.1000 /- for cancer treatment on 6 September 2020 and Mr. Shanti Brahmachari of Jhactor village is donated Rs. 1500/- for treatment of his physical ailments 21 January 2021.

**Social Support:** Local villagers are provided constant social and mental support fighting against the COVID19 pandemic and accessing government benefits in terms of hospitalization, arrangement for

transportation, preparing documents, etc.

### ***Sustainable Agriculture***

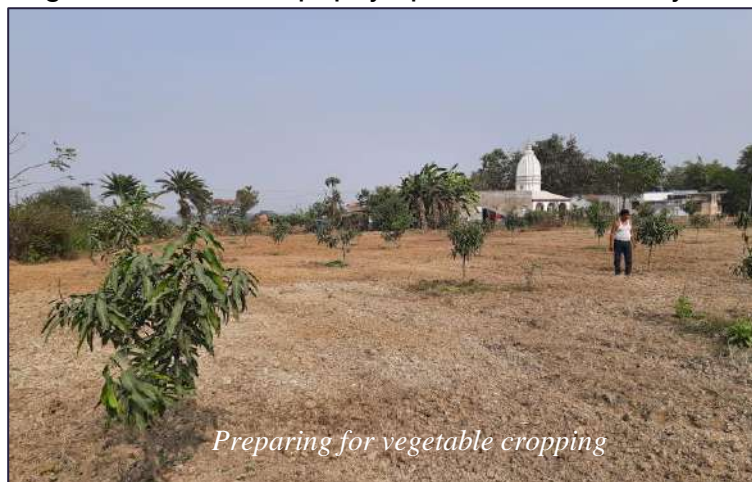
Last year, our sustainable agriculture program was brought under the ambit of one umbrella - VECT Bio Farm. During the last financial year, we ran three projects under this program - Balika Krishi Udyan (producing multi-layers organic vegetables and fruits), Fakir Bandh Fishery Project (producing organic breeds of local fishes) and Organic Compost Unit (producing vermicompost and organic manure). Due to resource scarcity, we suspended Oyster Mushroom cultivation activities. However, we introduced a new project this year - Multilayers Vegetable Farming.

**Valika Krishi Udyan:** VECT Bio farm continued its activities under this project. Mango plants were being nurtured with the bio-fertilizers, organic pesticides and support stands to protect from the storm. Fortunately, cyclone Amphan could not damage our agriculture production too much.

Papaya trees started producing fruits during the first quarter of the year, but, unfortunately, from August onwards few papaya plants started to dry out by some unknown disease. Dr. Rajib Das,



Horticulture Officer of Taldangra Block visited the garden on request and diagnosed that plants were virus-infected. He strictly advised to eliminate the infected plants and bury them. Gradually, all the plants are eliminated and the project failed. The weeds are cleaned up and the soil was got ready for vegetable cropping.

Plantation of vegetables resumed in September. Our production of organic vegetable crops like, green-vegetable, okra, pumpkin, sesame, cucumber, various guards, etc. were quite satisfactory. All the products were supplied to our MNLP.

We dropped the plan of producing the Aloe Vera plantation due to the failure of our initial trial of preparing sapling from the leaf cut. We also discarded the plan for hatching local catfish spawn and fingerlings due to the COVID19 pandemic situation.



**Fakir Bandh Fishery Project:** Our Fakir Bandh Fishery Project has produced the expected amount of organic fishes this year. The project is quite successful in producing Indian common carps, generating employment, training the local fish farmers and conserving water. The proven profit encouraged the local farmers and pond owners.

**Organic Compost Unit:** Due to excessive heat, irregularity of weather and damage of compost pit shed by the cyclonic storm Amphan our production of vermicompost was abridged. We could

produce nearly 6 quintals of compost and 1 liter of organic pesticides from the compost extract. Rather, we look for an alternative form of organic manure using cow dung, molasses, gram-dust (*Besan*) and germinate it in a pit for a month to produce a large amount of organic farming. The project was initiated in November 2020 by volunteer Mr. Bipul Kant Bhui.

**Multilayers Vegetable Farming:** A trust introduced a new form of vegetable farming called - Multilayers Vegetable Farming (MVF) where crops will be produced in three layers. The

objective of this project is to encourage the local farmers in producing organic vegetables in small landholdings at minimum cost. This is an intensive cropping technique that entails multiple uses of resources - irrigation water, fertilisers, insecticides and protection

from cattle. Mr. Bipul Kant Bhui agreed to take up the project jointly with the Trust as a training expert and stakeholder of the farm in his agricultural land of Rautora village, Bankura.

The project is quite successful in its Phase- I where the bamboo stage is erected and plantation of vegetables using complete organic resources are done. For the upper layer where a netted ceiling was prepared, we planted cucumber, pointed guard, bitter guard, sponge guard, peer

guard, and peas. Down the line, plantation for the second layer and third layer will be done in phase - II and Phase - III respectively. The second layer of crops will be produced above the soil where we could produce okra, brinjal, various green vegetables, and in the third layer we

planned for producing turmeric, ginger scented ginger, corn and sweet potato, yam, etc. The multi-layer farm has drawn huge attention in the locality farmers and nearly 100 farmers expressed their interest in it.

**Generation of Employment:** We have employed 3 regular semi-skilled workers in our bio-farm projects across the year and another 4-6 workers are hired on a need basis. About 1000 labour-days are created through these three projects.

### **Promoting Ethnic and Tribal Culture**

**Celebration of Bhadu Festival:** A local festival called '*Bhadu Parab*' was celebrated on 17 September 2020 at the village Rautora. Bhadu festival is celebrated in the memory of Princess of Kashipur who died at an early age. An idol of princess Bhadu is placed under a canopy prepared by colorful sarees. She is offered various sweets and fruits. Throughout the night, generally adolescent girls sing *Bhadu Songs* purely written on heavenly qualities of the princess - her kindness, beauty, compassion and love for others. Like many other ethnic cultures, the festival is now endangered. We tried to revive the culture in the locality. We offered a delicious meal to 70 underprivileged children the next day to the program.

**Baul Sangeet:** *Baul songs* are one of the rich cultural heritage of Bengal. The *Baul* is a distinct discipline of life where people leave their families and stay in ashrams, put on saffron dresses - a symbol of sacrifice and dedication, and lead a simple pious life. Begging is the only means of living-hood and singing the Baul songs is the root to reach the almighty. The songs of Baul represents the different notion of spirituality, salvation and social harmony.

Due to the COVID19 pandemic situation, we curtailed our cultural program to a limited audience at the village Rautora. We organised a small cultural program in the evening on 19 November and Baul Sangeet program on 20 November 2020. Mr. Sushil Baul and his associates were invited to present Baul sangeet to a limited audience who strictly followed the COVID protocol of social distancing and sanitization.

### ***Sports, Yoga and Meditation***

**Health Program - 2:** A virtually organised Health Camp was organised by SVHYC on 06 June 2020 on basic practices of yoga to build immunity to fight against COVID-19. Online video demonstration of Mr. Anindya Kr. Das was streamlined through electronic media among all the enrolled participants. Nearly 60 participants enjoyed and learned from the program.

**Yoga & Sanitizer Distribution Camp:** Like previous year, Swamy Vivekananda Health and Yoga Centre (SVHYC) organised a yoga program on 12 January 2021 on the occasion of the birthday of Swamy Vivekananda at the Khirpai Primary School on 'Strengthening Immunity through Yoga' to stay healthy and immune during COVID-19 situations. Selected YouTube video clippings on yoga for improving immunity were played through an audio-visual display. Nearly 30 school children participate in the program. At the end of the Yoga program, small packs of hand sanitizer and surgical masks were distributed among 500 villagers to spread awareness and prevention.

**Annual Sports Meet:** Like the previous years, the Trust organized Annual Sports Meet at Rautora village on 17-18 November 2020 incorporating 20 sports events among the school children and young adults.



A sport organising team of 8 youths was formed and head by Dr. P. K. Bhui. The team managed the entire program. A prize distribution ceremony was organized on 19 November for winners of all sports categories followed by a cultural program on dancing and singing.

### **Research Works**

**Publication of Papers:** Two research articles are published in UGC-Care listed journals by Dr. P. K. Bhui as first author and co-author during this financial year. During the last financial year, required surveys were done and research papers were articulated for publication. These studies were all about finding out the role of NRHM in making any significant improvement of the health services rendered to rural people of West Bengal.

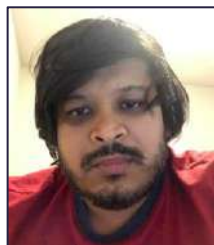

VEC Trust has undertaken the following plans for the forthcoming financial year 2021 -22.

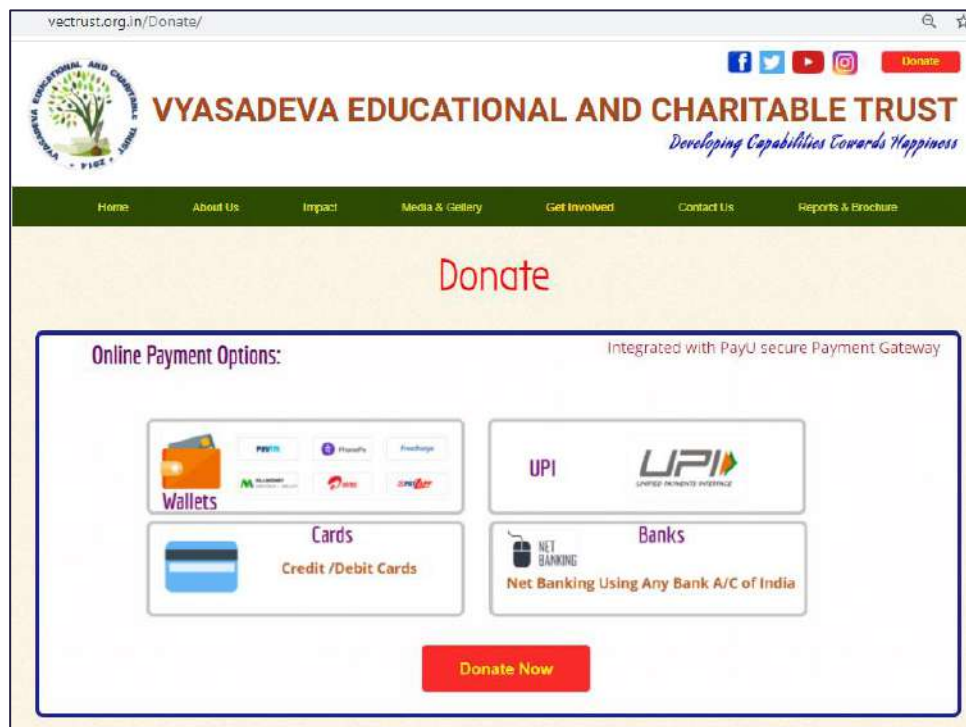

  - 3.   - 5. Research Works:** Scope of planting medicinal plants will be explored through research studies. Alongside, research projects on local issues of tribal households will be examined.
  - 6. Financial Support to Social Entrepreneurs:** Promising social entrepreneurs of the vicinity will be provided financial aid to set up his/her business unit.

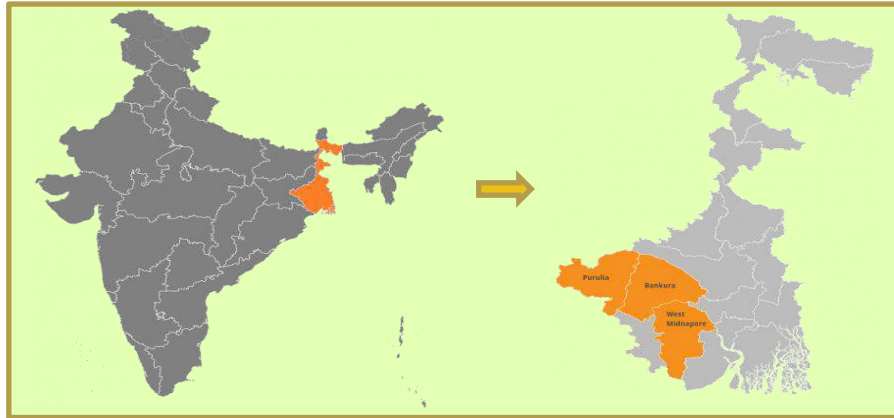

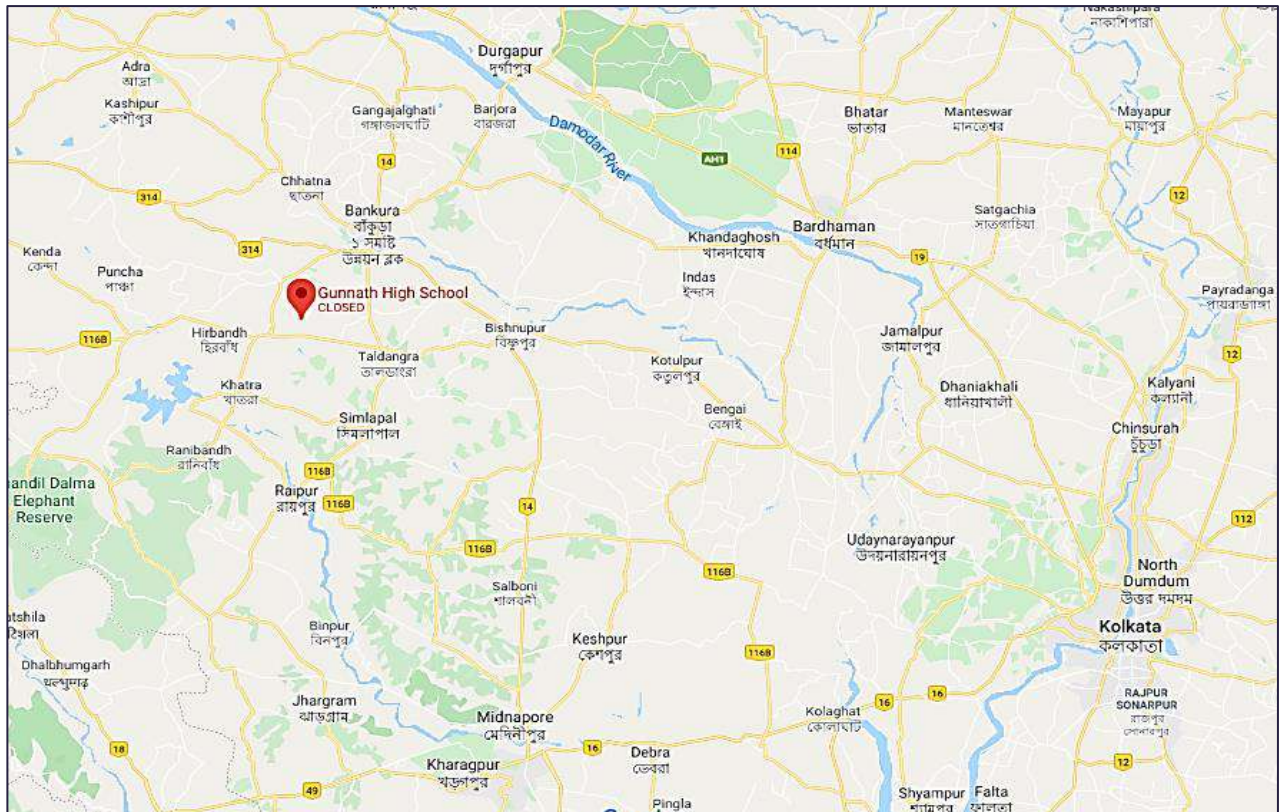
