Secretary's Report

[Report presented in 8th Annual General Meeting, 2021-22 dated 18.04.2022]

Dear Members,

I hereby present the Secretary's Report of the Trust in its 8th Annual General Meeting. I am pleased to inform you that we have not stopped our endeavors to reach out to the needy and underprivileged people inspite of the inexorable attack of the coronavirus. In tune with the 'Mask-up India' campaign of the Government of India, we undertake four Covid19 Awareness Camps in the Bankura district where 1500 kits containing masks and hand soap are distributed among the poor villagers.

The first time the trust obtains approval of conducting a state-level webinar on the theme 'Unequal Pay: Gender Discrimination at Workplace' by the National Commission for Women, Government of India, New Delhi. The program was conducted successfully and produced a high-quality research outcome.

Our social support activities like cloth donation, free schooling, MNLP, fishery training programs, and health-related programs are run across the year. Nearly 650 people are benefitted out of these programs.

VECT Bio farm has done an impressive job in growing vegetables through the MVF project. We took a new initiative to collect pond sediments and spread them in the paddy fields as an alternative to chemical fertilizer. Our fishery and bio-compost projects were also run successfully. We are continuously disseminating the know-how of organic farming to local aspirants. We have set up a medicinal plants garden at Valika Krishi Udyan. We aim at planting more varieties of medicinal plants in near future.

Our regular programs on sports, yoga, and cultural events are continued in a limited way. This year we consider Kaathi-Nach as a special program to promote tribal and ethnic culture. We relentlessly tried to revive the spirit and enthusiasm of the COVID19-affected people.

It seems that the hard time is over. We shall remain indebted to all our supporters and donors who stand up with our side in implementing the trust programs. I sincerely thank the support team for their relentless effort in materializing the programs.

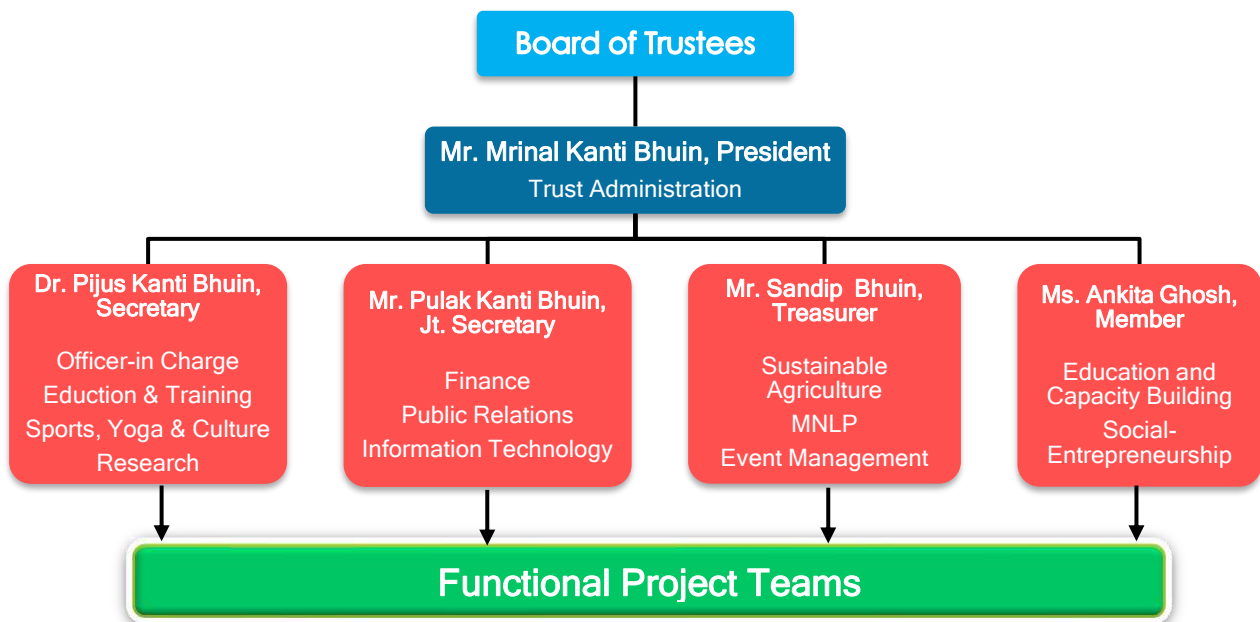

Impact 2021-22

We faced challenges during the fourth wave of the COVID19 pandemic till the beginning of the year 2022. However, our activities across all the concerned fields continue overcoming the difficulties.

EDUCATION, TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

Free Tuition: Government-sponsored schools were completely closed till February 2022. Primary school children belonging to socioeconomically underprivileged families get detached from regular studies and practices. Like previous years, we arranged for free tuition and special learning sessions like model building, sit-and-draw programs, recitation, etc. In our free schooling program, 30 children of Satsagaria Primary School

regularly attended the sessions. Ankita Ghosh led a team of three volunteers who provided free tuition to these students from August 2021 to January 2022.

Fishery Training Program: Like previous years we organized a fishery training program at the village Jhaktor, Bankura District on 2 August 2021 on the *Nourishment of Fingerlings*



and small baby craps following the COVID protocol. Fishery expert Mr. Sushant Raj was invited to the program as a speaker. He explained the preparation of water and food supply mechanisms for the baby

carps. Nearly 40 local fish farmers participated in the program. Villager of Jhaktor Bandh volunteered their pond as a training ground.

Health Awareness Program: A Health awareness program was organized on 11 October 2021 at Satsagaria Primary School of Bankura District with the support of local workers for the school children regarding home hygiene, cleanliness, and environmental hazards. Dr. P. K. Bhui addressed the children by showing photographs of how to combat the spread of bacteria and viruses. A total of 45 local school students attended the program. Children were provided small refreshments.



Preparing for Organic Biopesticides: This project is run across the year and kept open for visitors under the supervision of Bipul Kant Bhui at the village of Rautora. Visitors are explained how to prepare biopesticides using cattle urine, neem leaf extract, and organic manure using cow dung, gram seed dust, and molasses. Nearly 100 visitors visited the site and vegetable plant garden and acquired knowledge about the use of biopesticides. Vegetables are grown and protected using these pesticides.



SUPPORT TO UNDERPRIVILEGED

Covid Awareness Camps

In tune with the 'Mask-up India' campaign of the Government of India, the Trust organised three Covid19 Awareness Camps in four villages of Bankura District of the State West Bengal to enhance awareness among the rural people fighting against the COVID19 pandemic.

Camp 1: A camp was organised on 16 May 2021 at the Trust office of village Gunnath where 300 packets of masks and hand soaps were distributed among the passer-by and underprivileged villagers. They were made aware of the proper use of masks, right washing of hands and maintenance of social distancing. Local people queued for the kit and eagerly listened to the general guidelines. A group of six local school boys volunteered for the programs.

Camp 2: A Covid awareness camp was organised on 3rd June 2021 at the village Rautora of Indpur Block, Bankura District. 400 kits containing masks and hand soaps were distributed among the rural poor of two villages - Rautora and Satsagaria. People get explained the benefits of facemask use and the need for washing hands. Villagers appreciated the program and agreed to follow up on the general guidelines for the COVID19 Protocol. A group of local volunteers helped to carry out the program successfully.

Camp 3: On 6 June 2021, a Covid19 awareness camp was organised by the Trust at the village Manipur of Taldangra Block, Bankura District. 300 kits containing masks and hand soaps were distributed among the socio-economically underprivileged dwellers and passers-by. People were

requested to maintain general guidelines for combating the pandemic. They are explained the benefits of facemask use and regular washing of hands. Four local volunteers supported to organise the program successfully.

Camp 4: Nearly 500 kits containing masks and hand soaps were distributed at Khirpai village on the 8 June 2021 morning. Passers-by and residents are demonstrated the general guidelines of wearing masks, use of sanitizers, and social distancing norms. Localities deeply accept the campaign and promised to follow up on the COVID19 Protocol. The program was successful in drawing attention to the spread of COVID-19 and its subsequent effects on human life. Local villagers come forward to organise the mob and maintain discipline.

Cloth Donation Camp: A cloth donation program was undertaken by the trust for young boys belonging to the underprivileged section of society. 200 students from 20 surrounding villages aged 12-18 were invited and donated t-shirts abiding by the COVID-19 protocol. Local administrators and respected villagers were invited to grace the occasion.

Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program: The Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLN), was again discontinued from April 2021 to August 2021 due to the 4th wave of the COVID19 pandemic. However, we resumed the program in October with 200 plates of food and continued.

Caring Responsibilities: Mr. Amar Kumar Majhi, a poor villager of Rautora faced a fatal accidental injury. He was supported physically and financially for his entire medical treatment and post-operating recovery.

Financial Help: Financial Assistance of Rs. 4000/- was given to 8 distressed people. Beneficiaries are (1) Mr. Kutubuddin Mandal, village Rautora (Rs. 2000/-), (2) Mr. Ajal Mandal, village Rautora (Rs. 500/-), (3) Mr. Lulu Hari, village Dumurtor (Rs. 300/-), (4) Mr. Dhiru Hari, village Dumurtor (Rs. 200/-), (5) Ms. Aarati Hari, village Dumurtor (Rs. 500/-), (6) Phulchand Mandi, village Mahishdobra (Rs 100/-), (7) Mr. Milan Soren, village Mahishdobra (Rs.100/-), and (8) Sadananda Bauri, village Manipur (Rs. 200/-).

Social Support: Kharagpur Asattoron Pratibandhi Foundation (KAPF) organized an annual para sports competition on January 4, 2022, at Kharagpur. The trust supported organizing sports events across the day for specially-abled participants and completing the event successfully. The Trust donated a sum of Rs.500/- to KAPF for organizing the event.

VECT Bio-Farm: Last year, we restructured our sustainable agriculture mission and brought three projects namely Balika Krishi Udyan (producing multi-layers organic vegetables and fruits), Fakir Bandh Fishery Project (producing organic breeds of local fishes), and Organic

Compost Unit (producing vermicompost and organic manure) under VECT Bio-Farm. During 2021- 22, we introduced a new project called VECT Medicinal Plants Gardens.

Valika Krishi Udyan: Mango plants were being nurtured with bio-fertilizers and organic pesticides (tobacco leaf extracts). The plantation of green vegetables resumed in August. Our production of organic vegetable crops like, green-vegetable, okra, pumpkin, sesame, cucumber, various guards, etc. were quite satisfactory.



All the products were supplied to our MNLP.

Fakir Bandh Fishery Project: Our Fakir Bandh Fishery Project has produced the expected volume of local breeds like Rohu, Katla, Mrigal, Symprenous, and Grass-carp fishes this year. The project is quite successful in producing Indian common carp, generating employment, training the local fish farmers, and conserving water. The proven profit encouraged the local farmers and pond owners.

Organic Compost Unit: This project run successfully this year headed by Mr. Bipul Kant Bhui. We produced nearly 10 quintals of compost and 3 liters of organic pesticides from the compost extract. A separate vegetable garden was arranged to produce pumpkins using organic manure produced in our project. We also arranged to spread pond sediments (30 tractors) in the agricultural field to reduce the use of chemical fertilizers and make the product organic.



Multilayers Vegetable Farming: Multilayers Vegetable Farming (MVF) introduced last year in the village of Rautora was very successful in producing 6 quintals of bottle gourd. The objective of this project is to encourage local farmers in producing organic vegetables in small landholdings at minimum cost. It attracts many vegetable farmers to understand the intensive cropping technique that entails multiple uses of resources - irrigation water, fertilisers, insecticides, and protection from cattle. Mr. Bipul Kant Bhui demonstrated the know-how of the MFV technique to local aspirants.



VECT Medicinal Plants Garden: Earlier we produced several medicinal plants in Valika Krishi Udyan. However, we have earmarked a separate plot for growing numerous medicinal



plants, namely, *Gudhal*, *Aloe vera*, *Brahmi* and *Mandookparni*, *Akanda*, *Giloy*, *Sahjan*, *Bel*, *Tej Patta* etc. across the year. We have planted seasonal medicinal herbs like *Kulehara*, *Adrak*, *Haldi*, *Galanjal*, etc. Several awareness

programs on the use of medicinal plants like *Giloy*, *White Akanda*, *Aloe vera*, *Neem*, and *Tulsi* are conducted for the local villagers. Visitors are provided the medicinal plants and products free of cost.

Generation of Employment: We have employed 3 regular semi-skilled workers on the VECT-Bio farm. Our bio-farm projects have generated about 1500 labour days in four running projects across the year.

ETHNIC AND TRIBAL CULTURE

Kaathi-Naach Program: Kaathi-Naach is a dance program performed by local tribes and ancient habitats of the Bankura District. This rhythmic group-dance program was performed by youngsters holding a handkerchief in their hands along with tribal musical instruments (like Madol, Kuri-drum, etc) The Trust organized a Kaathi-naach program at the village Rautora on 12 September 2021 which was performed by local artists of ‘Danga’ village. Artists were given a financial reward and provided delicious dinners. The program was very successful in attracting thousands of villagers.

Pala-Kirtan: The trust organized and sponsored a Pala-Kirtan program at the village Rautora jointly with Rautora Sarbojanin Shivakaali Mandir Committee during the Diwali festival. Mrs. Krishna Chakraborty, a famous kirtan singer (kirtan is the song dedicated to Lord Krishna

and Lord Radha) played the Pala-Kirtan. The program was organized with the due permission of the local administration. However, due to the COVID19 pandemic situation, we restricted the sitting arrangements for the audience so that the social distance is maintained. We successfully organized the program where nearly 400 people attended.

Harinnam Sankirtan: Several Bengali festivals are celebrated with Harinaam Sangkirtan, ie, praying Hindu supreme God (Hari) through chorus songs along with traditional musical instruments. The trust patronized a Harinaam Sangkirtan program played by local tribal castes who learned musical art traditionally on 18 March 2022 on Holi (also known as Dol Yatra). A canopy for

taking rest at the end of the program was set and refreshments for all the artists are served.

Cultural Program: A small cultural program was organized at the Rautora village jointly with Rautora Sarbojanin Shivakaali Mandir Committee during the Diwali festival to encourage local school children for showcasing their talents in singing, dancing, recitation, elocution, stand-up comedy, acting, etc. We strictly followed the COVID protocol during the program.

International Yoga Day: The trust celebrates International Yoga Day 2021 in the village of Rautora with the local primary school children. Students are advised on how to do physical exercise with the right postures., Due to COVID-19 restrictions, only 12 students attended the program.

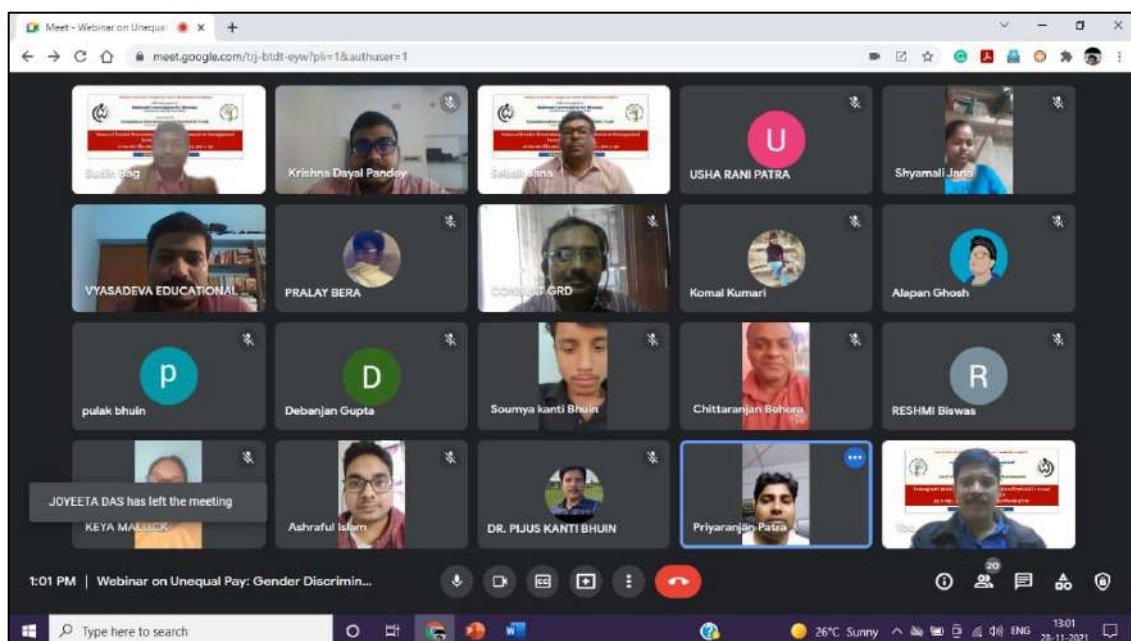

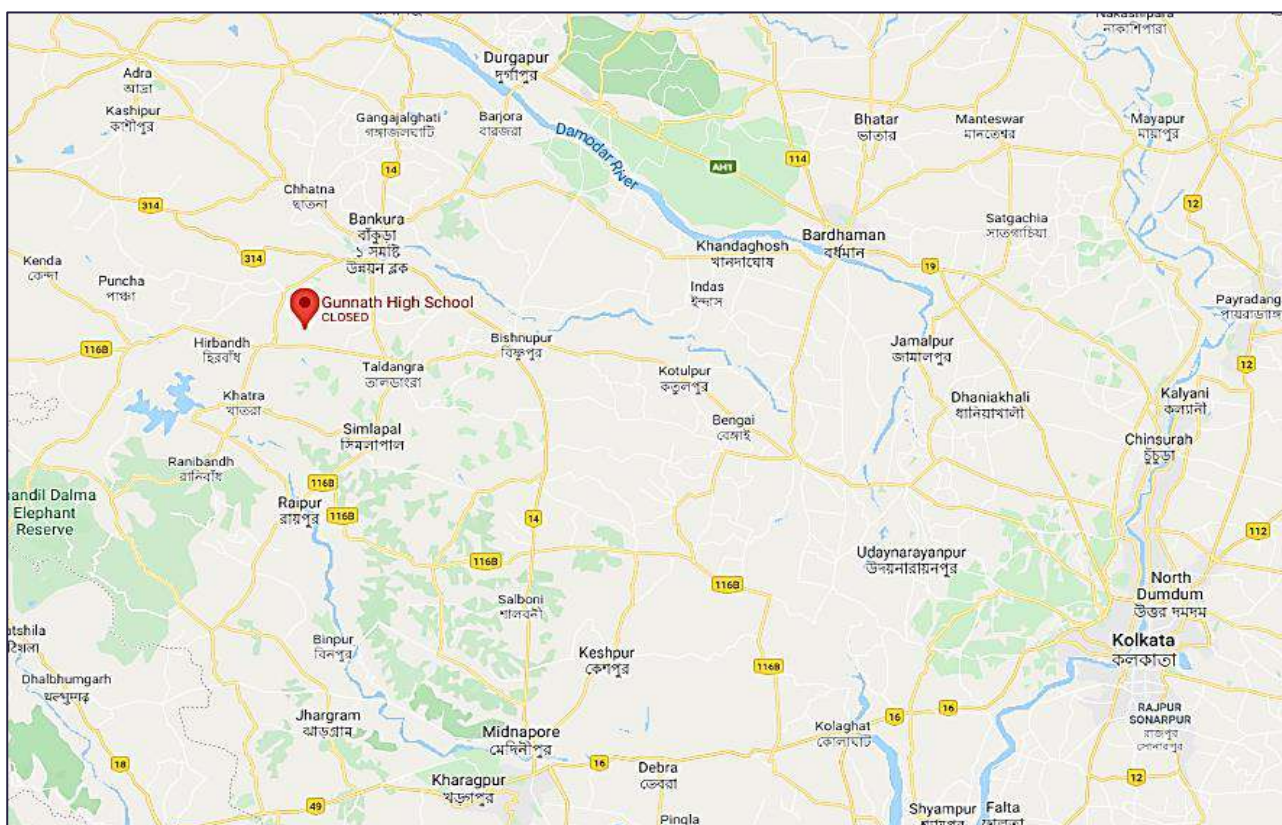

 - vi. **Financial Support to Social Entrepreneurs:** Promising social entrepreneurs in the vicinity will be provided financial aid to set up his/her business unit.

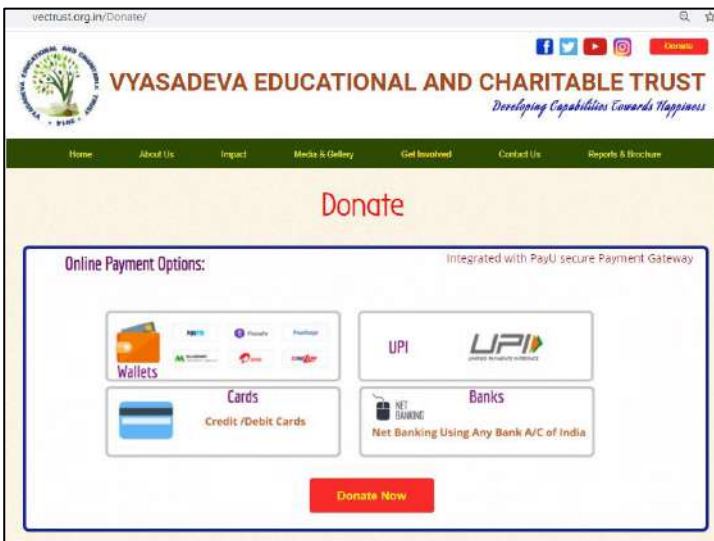
