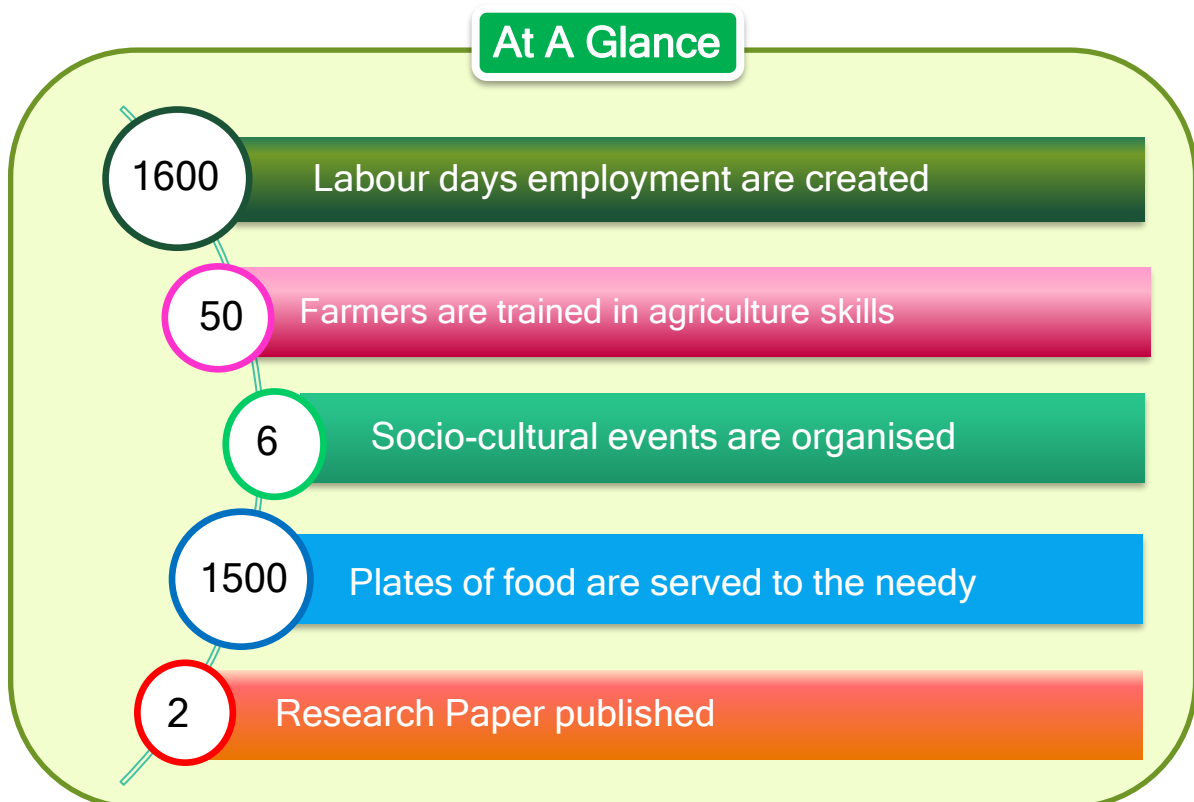

Secretary's Report

[Report presented in 9th Annual General Meeting, 2022-23 dated 08.05.2023]

Dear Members,

I hereby present the Secretary's Report of the Trust in its 9th Annual General Meeting.

I am happy to inform you that the normal functioning of the trust has resumed across all our projects in the new normalcy arena.

We could not do well in VECT Bio farm projects due to shortfall and wrong timings of rain. MLF project has made a loss since the stagnant water of vegetable fields does not get drained out. The fishery project has at least recovered its cost. The medicinal plant garden has made a tremendous impact in creating awareness and reliable sources of natural medicines. A new initiative is undertaken for the plantation of tropical plants at Gobindpur village in 2 acres of land. However, due to some unavoidable reasons, organic compost production is closed this year.

Our social support activities like educational aid donation programs, MNLP, fishery training programs, and health-related programs are run successfully. Social and communal activities run across the year. Nearly 700 people are benefitted out of these programs.

To promote ethnic and tribal culture, we organised a *Chhou* dance program which was performed by the *Orang* tribes of Purulia to get the essence and flavour of the folk dance in its original form. People love it.

Like in previous years, events on sports, yoga, and cultural performances are conducted. Independence Day is celebrated involving local school children.

Two research papers are published by the Secretary of the trust – one of which is in Scopus indexed journal. It is a good milage for the research endeavour.

We convey our sincere thanks to our support team for their philanthropy and humane attitude. We also thank our donors and members of the Rautora Kaali Mandir committee for their cooperation and mutual support.

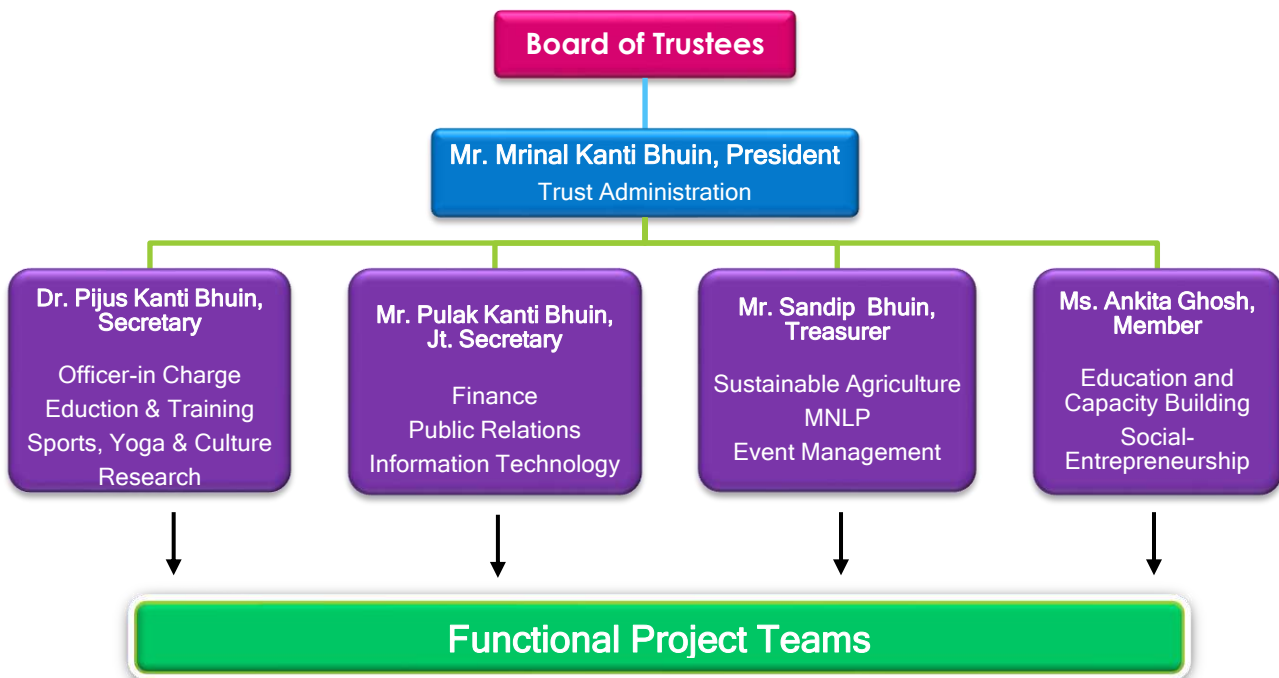

Impact 2022-23

Our work begins in the arena of the post-COVID new normalcy age. Efforts are made to inculcate the trust programs across the thrust areas.

EDUCATION, TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

Fishery Training Program: A special program on fishery training was organized on 13 May 2022 by fishery expert Mr. Sushant Raj at the village Rautora on *Water Preparation and Feeding*. Mr. Raj demonstrated how to mix natural ingredients with water and explained the feeding techniques for different corps. Nearly 25 local fish farmers participated in the program.



Health Awareness Program: A Health awareness program was organized on 10 September 2022 at Rautora village of Bankura District with the support of local workers for the school children regarding home hygiene and the danger of burning plastics. The Secretary of the Trust addressed the children along with the local ASHA worker by demonstrating how to wash hands before meals. A total of 50 local children attended the program. Children were provided small refreshments.



Preparing for Organic Biopesticides: This project is run across the year and kept open for visitors under the supervision of Bipul Kant Bhui at the village of Rautora. Visitors are



explained how to prepare biopesticides using cattle urine, neem leaf extract, and organic manure using cow dung, gram seed dust, and molasses. Nearly 80 visitors visited the site and vegetable plant garden and acquired knowledge about

the use of biopesticides. Vegetables are grown and protected using these pesticides.

SUPPORT TO UNDERPREVILEGDGED

Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program: The Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLP) was continued regularly at the village Rautora where on average 130 plates of pure vegetarian porridge, sweets, etc. were served each month.



Educational Aids Distribution: An educational aids distribution program for meritorious school children was organized on 12 January 2023 to celebrate the birthday of Swamy Vivekananda at the village Rautora.



Nearly 40 selected schoolgoers from (Class I to Class VIII) from the locality donated several educational aids like books, geometry boxes, coloured pens, pencils, notebooks, pens, etc. The president of the trust handed over the aid and inspired the children to study well and be successful in life.

Financial Help: A financial assistance of Rs. 10,000/- was provided to Mr. Turu Khan, a poor landless resident of Rautora village on his daughter's marriage.

Social Support: Kharagpur Asattoron Pratibandhi Foundation (KAPF) organized an annual para sports competition on December 17, 2022, at Benapur High School ground, Paschim Medinipur. The trust supported organizing sports events across the day for specially-abled participants and completing the event successfully. The Trust donated a sum of Rs.500/- to KAPF for organizing the event.



Community Support: Relentless support is provided to educationally deprived poor for applying for various government schemes, information dissemination, legal advice, and protection of various rights free of cost from the Trust office and other locations.



SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

VECT Bio-Farm: Three projects are running under VECT Bio-firm namely, Balika Krishi Udyan (producing multi-layer organic vegetables and fruits), Fakir Bandh Fishery Project (producing organic breeds of local fishes) and VECT Medicinal Plants Gardens. We have dropped the Organic Compost Unit this year due to the non-availability of the right manpower and raw materials. However, a new project of plantation of tropical trees at Gobindpur village is undertaken this year.

Balika Krishi Udyan: The garden is nourished by bio-fertilizers and organic pesticides.



However, a section of the garden was covered by weeds (*Saccharum spontaneum*). The problem is solved by employing manual workers who uprooted the plants. Production of oranges and lemons gets started this year. Production of other fruits and vegetables (banana, turmeric, yam, gourd, beans, brinjal, spinach chili, mango ginger, etc)

was satisfactory.

Fakir Bandh Fishery Project: Fishery production this year was just upto the mark. Due to a shortfall of rain production does not meet expectations. We could not produce fingerlings as planned. However, the production of other local breeds like Rohu, Katla, Mrigal, and Grass-carp was just sufficient for the cost of production.

Multilayer Vegetable Farming: Multilayer Vegetable Farming (MVF) at the village of Rautora introduced in the year 2021 was continued. However, due to the wrong timings of rainfall in



the month of September-October, our vegetable production, especially ground layer plants, got spoiled. The production got delayed and the quality of the vegetables was not good. The cost of production was not accrued from the cultivation.

VECT Medicinal Plants Garden: We were able to grow and supply several medicinal plants,



namely, *Gudhal*, *Aloe vera*, *Brahmi* and *Mandookparni*, *Akanda*, *Giloy*, *Sahjan*, *Bel*, *Tej Patta*, etc. across the year. Seasonal medicinal herbs like *Kulehara*, *Adrak*, *Haldi*, *Galanjal*, *mango ginger*, etc. are produced and supplied to the needy. Visitors were explained the use and benefits of different medicinal plants. The garden benefitted more than 100 visitors.

Plantation at Gobindpur village: A new plantation program of tropical plants like Teak, Mahagony, Red Silk Cotton, Mango, Black Plum, Arjuna, etc, was conducted in a fenced land of Gobobindpur village, Bankura District with due permission of the owner of the land. A total of 400 plants were planted using purely organic compost.



Generation of Employment: We have employed 3 regular semi-skilled workers on the VECT-Bio-farm and fishery projects. All our agriculture-related projects have generated about 1600 labour days during the year.

ETHNIC AND TRIBAL CULTURE

Chhou-Dance Program: The western part of Bengal (Bankura and Purulia Districts) is famous in the world for a performing dance called *Chhou* where dancers wear face masks representing a character mainly from Hindu Gods and Goddesses. A story relating to



Puranas or local hot issues is acted by male dancers having strong physical fitness with the support of a group of musicians and vocal artists. The Trust organized a Chhou-dance

program at village Rautora on 27 October 2022 during the annual festival time. The program was performed by *Herbona Orang Para Adivasi Jangalmahal Chhou Academy, Borabazar* of Purulia district and led by famous Chhou artist Mr. Sanjay Orang. The program was mesmerizing, picturesque and best in its quality. More than 2000 audience applauded the program and demanded more to occur in the near future.

Baul-Gaan Program: The trust sponsored and organized a Baul Gaan (a folk song on spirituality and salvation) program at Satsagaria village during the Diwali festival. Seven Artists of *Adi Nityananda Lokageeti and Baul Sampraday* headed by Mr. Nityanda Das and Ms. Madhumita Das of Bibarda, Bankura District sang popular baul songs and made the crowd dance with the rhythms. Nearly 500 people attended the programs



Cultural Program: A small cultural program was organized at the Rautora village jointly with the Rautora Sarbojanin Shivakaali Mandir Committee during the Diwali festival to encourage local school children to showcase their talents in singing, dancing, recitation, elocution, stand-up comedy, acting, etc.



Celebration of Independence Day: Independence Day 2022 is celebrated by the trust at Rautora office premises inviting the teachers and students of Rautora Primary School children. The head teacher of the school delivered a speech inspiring the students to love the country and countrymen. Students are offered sweets at the end of the program.



SPORTS & YOGA

International Yoga Day: The trust celebrates International Yoga Day 2022 in the village of Rautora with the local children. Dr. Bhuiin demonstrated few asanas for regular practice. Children are advised to take the right posture and mental set up for practicing yoga and meditation. 30 children attended the programs. A small refreshment is offered to them.

Annual Sports Meet: The Trust organized the Annual Sports Meet 2022 at Rautora village



on 29-30 October 2022. 18 sports events were organized for different age groups. Nearly 130 participants from localities including housewives participated in the program. The top three winners of each category are rewarded with prizes on 30 October. The event was quite successful in cherishing joy and communal harmony.
