Message from The President

Dear Readers,

I am happy to present the VEC Trust Annual Report 2023-24.

This is to announce proudly that amid a crunch of financial resources, our Trust has completed 10 years successfully devoting to the welfare of local distressed people. We created value for society through several socio-economic activities to the best of our efforts.

VECT medicinal plant garden is an effective endeavour, and it will serve larger communities in the future. We look forward to continuing MNL and other regular educational and cultural programs. We anticipate an extension of social and financial support to the underprivileged having due support from government and non-governmental organizations.

I congratulate the Secretary for the publications of two research papers and the conduct of one research methodology workshop as a resource person.

Organic bio-farm projects of the Trust get into trouble due to the whimsical nature of the rain. The signal of nature is clear – change in climate worldwide. Bankura, being a draught-prone district of the State demands a vibrant irrigation system. Utter dependence on rainwater largely affects the agricultural sector. Kangsabati Reservoir Project 1956-57 which is also not functional in many areas was set a long time ago in the southern Bankura. Unless a large-scale technological intervention in water resource management in this area is undertaken by the Government, the farmer will not survive even at the subsistence level. We need to develop a community organization by the farmers of Bankura to voice out for agriculture support system and reform in irrigation system.

The government of India dreams of developing India in 2047. Capacity building of the people through educational and skill development programs can enhance the trajectory of growth and development. A large-scale intervention of the Government is required to make technological breakthroughs in our agriculture sector. The prosperity of the farmers will bring prosperity to India.

I wish for a self-reliant future for Indian peasants.

Secretary's Report

[Report presented in 10th Annual General Meeting, 2023-24 dated 25.04.2024]

Dear Members,

I hereby present the Secretary's Report of the Trust in its 10th Annual General Meeting.

On the eve of the 10th anniversary of our trust formation, I would like to thank all the members, supporters and stakeholders for being with us. Cooperation and collaboration have made our journey pleasant.

We continue our running projects. VECT bio-farm is having turmoil due to irregularities in rainfall. In our MVF project, we have lost production of ground layer crops during the early season of the year due to unwanted rainfall. On the other hand, winter turns into a dry spell. To resolve the problem, we have introduced a drip irrigation system in our MVF project.

Plantation of new varieties is being made in our medicinal plant garden. Progress of the Gobindpur Tropical Plantation project appears quite satisfactory so far. Production of organic fish, fruits & vegetables was down this year.

Our social support activities like educational aid donation programs, MNLP, fishery training programs, and health-related programs are run successfully. Nearly 650 people are benefitted out of these programs.

To promote ethnic and tribal culture, we organised again Santali Dance program and Paala Keertan. This year, we sponsored the Tusu Festival, a folk and ethnic festival observed mainly by tribal communities.

Like previous years, events on sports, yoga, and cultural programs are conducted. Independence Day is celebrated involving local primary school children.

Two research papers have been published. The secretary was invited as a resource person to a workshop on research methodology organised by Swamy Vivekananda University (SVU), Kolkata.

We thank Rautora Siva Kaali Mandir Committee (RSKMC), SVU, Kharagpur Asattoron Pratibandhi Foundation (KAPF) for their collaboration and support

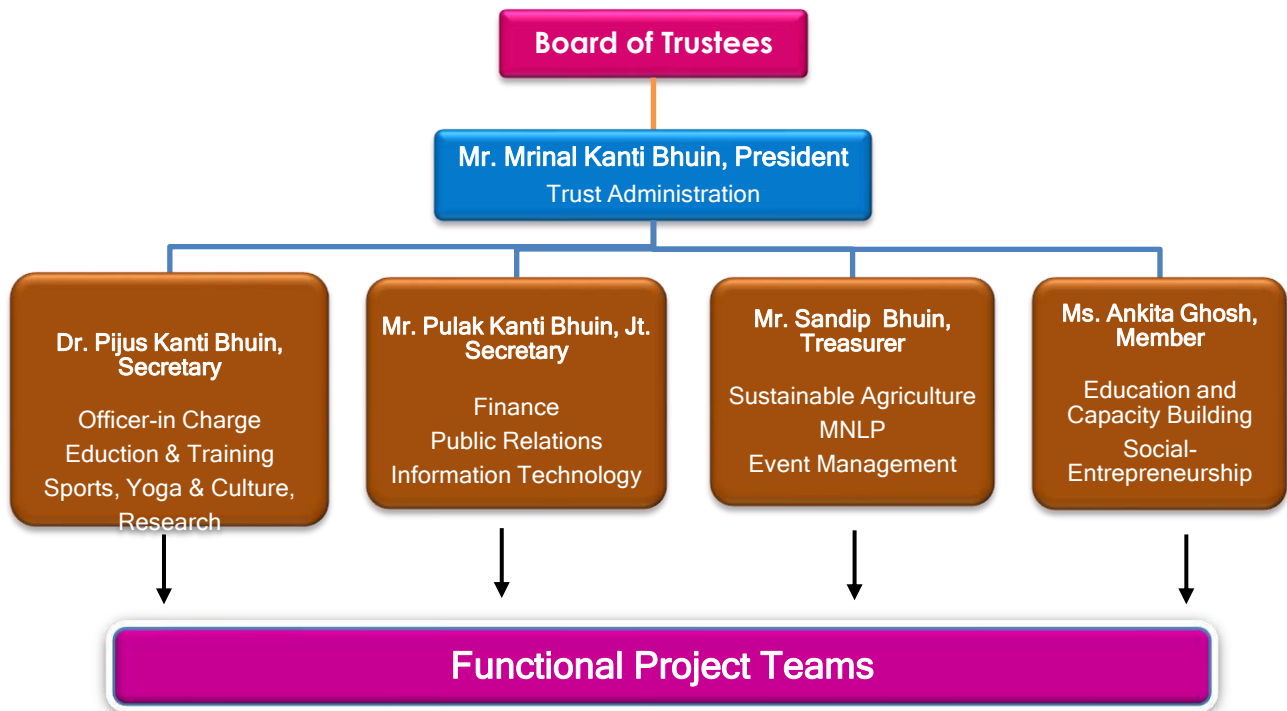

Impact 2023-24

A brief outline of the trust activities during the year in thrust areas is given below.

EDUCATION, TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

Fishery Training Program: A fishery training program was organized on 12 August 2023 by expert Mr. Sukumar Dey of Ramsagar, Bishnupur at the village Rautora *on Multilayer Crop Production in Ponds*. He discussed the timings and procedure of cultivating three varieties of fish crops at the three water layers of a pond. He demonstrated how to check the health of the crops and apply remedial measures. Nearly 30 local fish farmers in the locality participated in the program.



Health Awareness Program: A Health awareness program was organized on 15 December 2023 evening at Dumurpal village of Bankura District for the residents regarding the danger of plastic use in our health system. The Secretary of the Trust addressed the villagers along with the local ASHA worker explaining the dangers of using plastics and the contamination of microplastics in food, drinks and water.

A total of 50 local people attended the program. Children were provided small refreshments.

Preparing for Organic Biopesticides: Bipul Kant Bhui, organizing member of the organic biopesticide project attended nearly 100 flying visitors around the year regarding the knowhow of biopesticides preparation using cattle urine, neem leaf extract, and organic manure. VECT Bio-farm regularly uses this biopesticide as and when required.

SUPPORT TO UNDERPREVILEGGED

Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program

The Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLP) was continued regularly at the village Rautora where on average 130 plates of pure vegetarian porridge, sweets, etc. were served each month to the needy and distressed people. The date of MNLP is fixed on the day of the new moon (*Amaboshya*) each month.



Educational Aid Donation

An educational aid donation program for underprivileged school children was organized on 12 January 2024 to celebrate the birthday of Swamy Vivekananda in the village of Rautora. Nearly 50 selected primary school children (Class I to Class IV) from the locality donated several educational aids like books, geometry boxes, coloured pens, pencils, notebooks, pens, etc. The Secretary organized the program.



Community Support: A team of five members led by Mr. Sandip Bhuiin extends the support to resolve local disputes and litigations concerning land, irrigation, marriage and property. Relentless support is provided to educationally deprived poor for applying for various government schemes, information dissemination, legal advice, and protection of various rights including women's rights free of cost from the Trust office and other locations.



Social Support: The trust supported organizing the annual para sports competition 2023



organised by Kharagpur Asattoron Pratibandhi Foundation (KAPF) on January 21, 2024, at Kharagpur Silver Jubilee High School ground, Kharagpur. Dr. Bhuiin conducts most of the sports events for specially-abled participants. He inspired the participants to come forward to the prize distribution ceremony at the end of the day. The Trust donated

a sum of Rs.1000/- to KAPF for organizing the events.

Financial Help: A financial assistance of Rs. 7,000/- was provided to Mr. Madhu Bhumij, a poor scheduled tribe of Rautora village to perform rituals (*Shradh*) on his mother’s death.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

VECT Bio-Farm: During the financial year 2023-24, three projects namely, Balika Krishi Udyan (producing multi-layer organic vegetables and fruits), Fakir Bandh Fishery Project (producing organic breeds of local fishes), and VECT Medicinal Plants Gardens (produce plants for ayurvedic medicines) are run at the village Rautora under VECT Bio-firm. Last year we dropped the organic manure-producing unit.



Balika Krishi Udyan: The problem of weeds (*Saccharum spontaneum*) is removed to a large extent. The plantation of new fruit trees (coconut) is made occupying the place of two dead mango trees (died of termite attack in the roots). The garden is nourished by bio-fertilizers and organic pesticides.

This year no mango tree produces any fruit due to the biennial bearing nature of the trees. However, the production of other fruits and vegetables (banana, turmeric, yam, gourd, beans, brinjal, spinach chili, mango ginger, etc) was satisfactory.

Fakir Bandh Fishery Project: Fishery production this year was at par with expectations.



Belated rain caused a crisis in water level maintenance. Like previous years, we dropped the initiative to produce fingerlings due to uncertainty in the water supply. However, the production of other local breeds like Rohu, Katla, Mrigal, Grass-carp, Black crop, etc. was good and recovered the loss made during the last year.

During the winter, we also faced the problem of oxygen supply in the water. Oxygen supply is made artificially for three days using water pumps which recycled the pond water into the pond forming

a sprinkling fountain.

Multilayer Vegetable Farming: Multilayer vegetable Farming (MVF) at the village of Rautora introduced in the year 2021 was continued. Like the previous year, our ground-layer



production was lost due to unwanted rainfall from September to December. Later part of the year (Jan-March) which was a dry spell, we introduced a drip irrigation mechanism where water is delivered directly to the roots of the vegetable plants through narrow tubes. It

conserves water. We encouraged local farmers to apply this mechanism which is a very cost-effective and time-saving technique.

During the winter, we were able to produce a good amount of organic tomato, brinjal, cilantro, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, radish, etc. The produce of our vegetable farming is supplied to the MNLP across the year. Bipul Kanti Bhui as the in-charge of the project made tremendous effort to make it successful.

VECT Medicinal Plants Garden: A small nursery has been formed to make the plants strong



and healthy before planting them in our Medicinal plant garden. This year, we were able to grow and supply several medicinal plants, namely, Hibiscus, *Gudhal*, *Aloe vera*, *Brahmi* and *Mandookparni*, *Akanda*, etc. Seasonal medicinal herbs like *Kulehara*, *Adrak*, *Haldi*, *Galanjal*, *Mango Ginger*, etc. are produced and supplied to the needy without any cost. More than 120 patients benefit.

Plantation at Gobindpur village: The plantation program of tropical plants (400 plants) undertaken during last year at Gobindpur village has made us happy. Growth of the plants especially Teak, Mahagony, Mango, Red Silk Cotton, and Black Plum, were remarkable. The health of the plants is inspected regularly and found extremely well. Plants are nourished by organic compost only.



Generation of Employment: We have employed 3 regular semi-skilled workers on the VECT-Bio-farm and fishery projects. All our agriculture-related projects have generated about 1500 labour days during the year.

ETHNIC AND TRIBAL CULTURE

Pala-Keertan: The trust sponsored and organized a Pala-Kirtan Program at Rautora village on 15 April 2023 on the occasion of Chaitra Sankranti. Pala Keertan is a form of narration and shared singing regarding a religious idea. The Keertan was performed by *Sumitra Das and Sampradaya* of Bibarda, Bankura District. The story played through Leela Kirtan is *Maan Bhanjan* where Lord Krishna appeases Radha for his failure to reach their rendezvous as promised. The moral values deliberated through the songs and stories appeal to the listeners to generate love for humanity. An audience of 300 people enjoyed the program.



Santali Dance Program: The Trust organized a *Santali Dance* program at village Rautora on 13 November 2023 during the annual festival time. The program was performed by *Mahishdobra Adibashi Nritya Gosthi*, of Mahishdobra, Gourbazar, Bankura district. Though the program started late at night (around 9 pm) but was able to entertain around 600 audience with its music and rhythmic dance. All the artists and support staff were served dinner.



Tusu Festival: The Trust sponsored Tusu Parab (festival) at village Rautora on 15 January 2024, which was performed by the local Bhumij community, a scheduled tribe of southwestern Bengal. A deity of Tusu is placed and villagers, especially women, sing the

Tusu songs the whole night celebrating the joy of harvesting crops. They also recall goddess Tusu for her blessings during their tough times. In the early morning, they immerse the idol and take a bath in the cold water of rivers or ponds. People wear new dresses and eat Pithas (a boiled cake made of rice flour). Nearly 80 villagers participated in the program.



Cultural Program: A cultural program was organized and sponsored by the trust jointly with



Rautora Sarbojanin Shivakaali Mandir Committee on 14 November 2023 during the Diwali festival at Rautora village. In the first half of the program, Local children perform singing, dancing, recitation, elocution, etc.

In the second half of the program, a professional organisation, called '*Sur o Jhankar Orchestra and Dance Troup* of Jayrambati, Bankura district led by Mr. Jayanta Ghosh performs a singing and

dance program for three hours. A live orchestra of singing, dancing, and music is very popular in the locality. To control the audience of 2000 people who arrived from nearby villages, a separate team of volunteers was set. The program was ended successfully.

Celebration of Independence Day:

Independence Day 2023 is celebrated by the trust at Rautora office premises inviting the teachers and students of Rautora Primary School children. Smt. Krishna Bhuiin represents the Trust and hoisted the national flag. She addressed the students recalling the duties and responsibilities of students towards the nation.



Nearly 200 students are offered a small refreshment.

YOGA AND SPORTS

International Yoga Day: The trust celebrates International Yoga Day 2023 in the village of Gunnath with the local children. Dr. Bhuiin demonstrated few asanas for regular practice. Children are advised to take the right posture and mental setup for practicing yoga and meditation. 20 children attended the programs. A small refreshment is offered to them.

Annual Sports Meet: The Trust organized the Annual Sports Meet 2022 at Rautora village



on 15-16 November 2023. 16 sports events were organized for young as well as adults. Nearly 120 participants from localities including housewives participated in the program. The top three winners of each category are rewarded

with prizes on 17 November. The event was quite successful in cherishing joy and communal harmony.

5. **Financial Support to Social Entrepreneurs:** Promising social entrepreneurs in the vicinity will be provided financial aid to set up his/her business units.

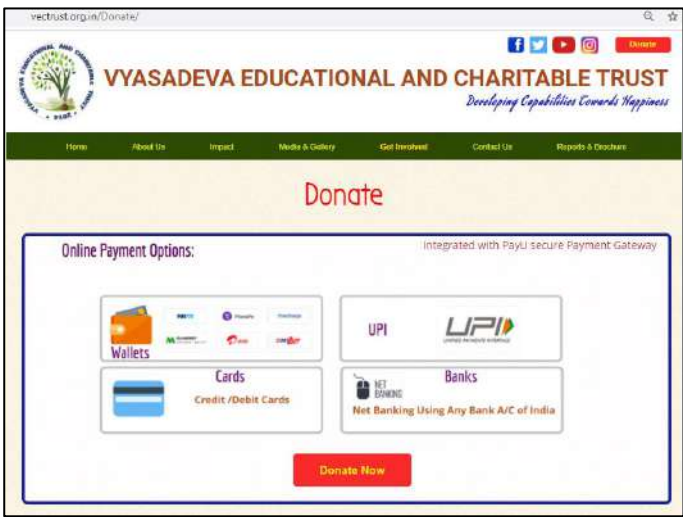
