Secretary's Report

[Report presented in 11th Annual General Meeting, 2024-25 dated 5.04.2025]

Dear Members,

I am pleased to present the Secretary's Report for the year 2024-25, marking the 11th year of VEC Trust's service to rural communities. Despite challenges, this year witnessed several impactful initiatives across education, livelihood, health, agriculture, and culture.

Two fishery training programs were organized at Rautora, benefitting 40 local farmers. We conducted a mental health awareness session for teenage girls and a spiritual wellness program, emphasizing the teachings of Shri Ramkrishna Paramhansa.

Our regular Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLP) served nearly 120 plates each month to the needy. We organized a cloth donation camp for 40 women during Diwali and joined a food and clothing drive for 80 street dwellers. Community support led by Mr. Sandip Bhui continued throughout the year. We also supported KAPF's para sports event and offered financial help to Dumurpal Ashram.

Under the VECT Bio-Farm, we operated three projects:

- ***Balika Krishi Udyan*** produced a good yield of fruits and vegetables.
- ***Fakir Bandh Fishery Project*** achieved decent fish production despite challenges.
- ***Medicinal Plants Garden*** benefited over 120 patients with herbal supplies.

The "Plant for Mother" campaign saw distribution of 120 saplings, and the Gobindpur plantation project showed excellent growth. About 1500 labour days were generated, employing 3 regular workers. The MVF project is continued due to climatic hurdles.

Cultural highlights included a Baul Sangeet program and Diwali cultural events featuring children's performances. We celebrated Independence Day, Yoga Day, and held a successful Annual Sports Meet with 140 participants. All events reinforced community participation and youth engagement. One research paper, "*The Role of Health and Hygiene Factors in Adolescent Girls' Health*", was published this year, adding to our academic outreach.

As we move ahead, we carry both the learnings and the aspirations of growing trust. I thank all our members, volunteers, and partners for their continued support.

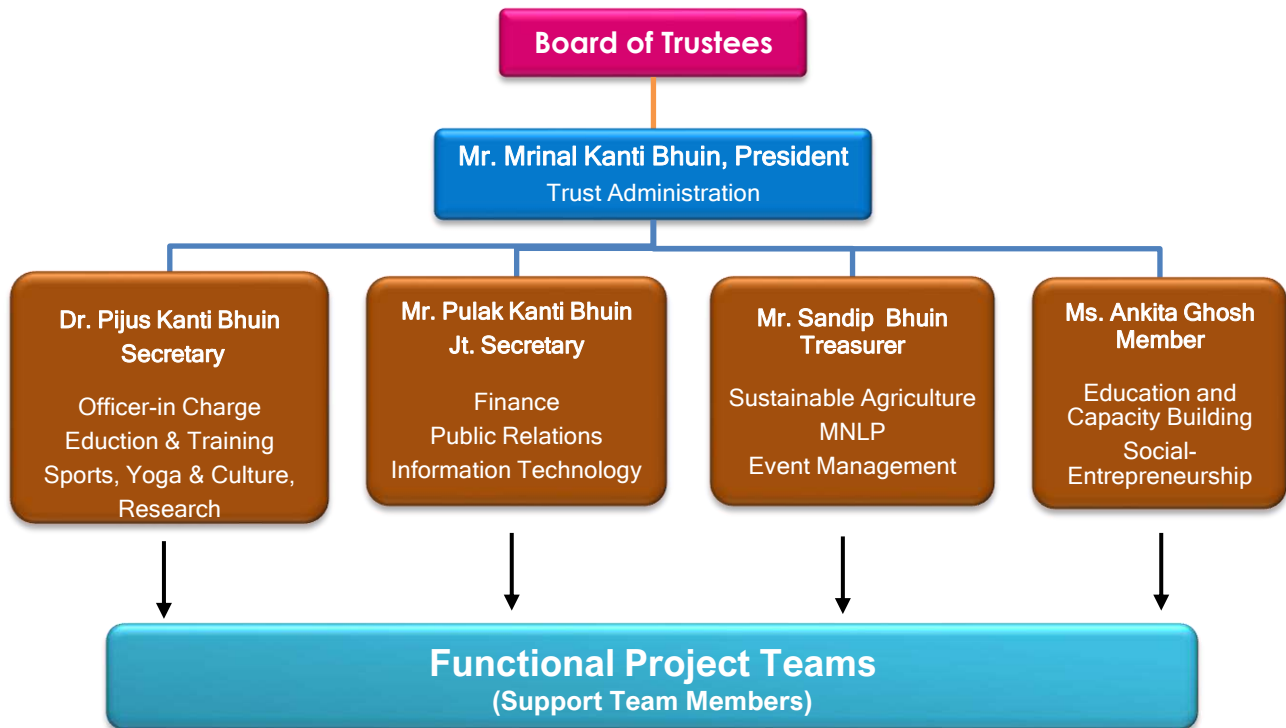

Impact 2024-25

A brief outline of the trust activities during the year in thrust areas is given below.

EDUCATION, TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

Fishery Training Program: Two fishery training programs were conducted on 31 August 2024 and 3 February 2025 by experts from Mr. Shibu Dutta and Mr. Biplab Mandal, Panchmura, Bankura at the village Rautora on *Fingerling Crop Production* and *Nourishment of Fingerlings in Ponds*. Mr. Bipul Bhui volunteered organizing the programs. The Experts demonstrated how to check the health of the crops and apply remedial measures. Nearly 40 local fish farmers participated in these two programs.



Health Awareness Program: A Health awareness program was organized on 17 February 2025 at Khirpai village of Bankura District for teenage girls on *Strengthening the Mental Hygiene*. Bhuban Mohankar, an expert, addresses girls regarding mental health issues faced by them. A total of 30 girls attended the program and they were provided with small refreshments.



Spiritual Health Awareness Program: The Trust conducted a spiritual health awareness program on 2 November 2024 at Rautora Village of Bankura District regarding the thought of Shri Ramkrishna Paramhansa towards social life of



family men. Smt. Aarati Ghosh of Garhbeta addressed the audience with her own life-experience. Nearly 50 people attended the programme.

SUPPORT TO UNDERPREVILEGED

Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program: The Monthly Nutritious Lunch Program (MNLP) was continued regularly at the village Rautora where on average 120 plates of pure vegetarian porridge, sweets, etc. were served each month to the needy and distressed people. The date of MNLP is fixed on the day of the new moon (*Amaboshya*) each month. Local villagers volunteered preparing and serving the food.



Cloth Donation Camp: A cloth donation camp was organized on the eve of Diwali festival (1 November 2024) for underprivileged women at the village Rautora. 40 distressed women of the village were donated with new *sarees* by the President and other members. Siddheswari Bastralaya of Kharagpur sponsored partial costs of the sarees. Rautora Shiv Kali Mandir Committee helped to organize the program.



Food and Cloth Donation to Street Dwellers: The trust joined a food and cloth donation programme organized by Siddheswari Bastralaya, Kharagpur to the street dwellers on 6 October 2024. Nearly 80 street dwellers, beggars, vagabonds were given food and 50 street children were given new clothes.





Community Support: A team of five members led by Mr. Sandip Bhui extends the support



to resolve local disputes and litigations concerning land, irrigation, property and communal issues. Relentless support is provided to socio-economically deprived poor for applying for various schemes, information dissemination, legal advice, and protection of various rights free of cost across the year.

Social Support: The trust supported organizing the annual para sports competition 2024-25 organised by Kharagpur Asattoron Pratibandhi Foundation (KAPF) on 23 February 2025, at Kharagpur Silver Jubilee High School ground, Kharagpur. Dr. Bhui conducts most of the sports events for specially abled participants.



Financial Help: Financial assistance of Rs. 5,000/- was provided to Dumurpal village Ashram for organizing the annual program during February 2025.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

VECT Bio-Farm: During the financial year 2024-25, three projects namely, *Balika Krishi*



Udyan (a unit of fruits and vegetable production), *Fakir Bandh Fishery Project* (a unit of organic breeds of local fishes), and *VECT Medicinal Plants Gardens* (a unit ayurvedic medicinal plants) are run at the village Rautora under VECT Bio-firm. We have discontinued the Muti-Layer Vegetable Farming (MVF) due to implementational failure against adverse weather conditions.

Balika Krishi Udyan: The vegetable and -fruits garden is re-fenced using bamboo to block



cattle and trespassers. The mango trees are nurtured, and the garden is nourished by bio-fertilizers and organic pesticides. Except Mango, the production of fruits and vegetables (banana, turmeric, yam, gourd, beans, brinjal, spinach chili, mango ginger, etc) was satisfactory.

Fakir Bandh Fishery Project: Unlike previous years, the production of other local breeds like Rohu, Katla, Mrigal, Grass-carp, etc. was relatively better. However, uncertainty in the rain-fed water supply, the production of fingerlings failed. Three ponds dedicated to this project performed satisfactorily in terms of fish productions. Mr. Bipul Bhui taken the charge of running the project.



Support to a Plant for Mother: In connotation with the Plant for Mother Campaign (*Ek Ped*



Maa Ke Naam) on World Environment Day, 5 June 2024, the trust also initiated distributing fruit trees to local interested farmers. A total of 120 saplings were distributed to support the national campaign named as “*Maayer Name Ekti Gaach*”. Beneficiaries were overwhelmed to accept the plants and grow.

VECT Medicinal Plants Garden: This year, we were able to grow and supply several medicinal plants, namely, Hibiscus, Gudhal, neem, ashwagandha, Bel, Aloe Vera, Brahmi, Gulancha and Mandookparni, Akanda, etc. Seasonal medicinal herbs like Kulehara, Adrak, Haldi, Galanjai, Mango-Ginger, etc. are produced and supplied to the needy without any cost. More than 120 patients benefit from garden accessing different medicinal plants.



Plantation at Gobindpur village: The plantation program of tropical plants (400 plants) undertaken during last year at Gobindpur village has made us happy. The growth of the plants especially Teak, Mahogany, Mango, Red Silk Cotton, and Black Plum, were remarkable. The health of the plants is inspected regularly and found extremely well. Plants are nourished by organic compost only.

Generation of Employment: We have employed 3 regular semi-skilled workers on the VECT-Bio-farm and fishery projects. All our agriculture-related projects have generated about 1500 labour days during the year.



ETHNIC & TRIBAL CULTURE

Baul Sangeet: The trust sponsored and organized a Baul Sangeet Program presented by Maa Tara Lokageeti and Baul Sampraday, Bibarda at Rautora village on 2 November 2024. Madhusudan Das Baul and Mousumi were the leading singers of the troop. A crowd of 1000 people enjoyed the program.



Cultural Program: A cultural program was organized and sponsored by the trust jointly with



Rautora Sarbojanin Shivakaali Mandir Committee on 2 November 2024 during the Diwali festival at Rautora village. School Children performed dance, recitation, elocution, singing etc. All performers are rewarded.

Celebration of Independence Day: Independence Day 2024 is celebrated by the trust at Rautora office premises inviting the local children. Koushik Bhui organized the program and hoisted the national flag. Nearly 100 children attended the program, and they were given a light refreshment.



YOGA & SPORTS

International Yoga Day: The trust celebrates International Yoga Day 2024 in the village of Rautora with the local children. The Secretary of the trust demonstrated a few



asanas for regular practice and explained the role of asanas in healthy life. Children are encouraged to demonstrate gymnastics and make it a habit for regular practice. Best performers are rewarded with prizes. Nearly 50 children attended the programs. A small refreshment is offered to them.

Annual Sports Meet: The Trust organized the Annual Sports Meet 2024 at Rautora village



on 1-2 November 2024. 20 sports events were conducted for young as well as adults. Nearly 140 participants from localities including housewives participated in the programs. The top three winners of each category are rewarded with prizes on November. The event was quite

successful in cherishing joy and communal harmony.
