## **Toddington Tennis Club**

Toddington Tennis Club has been established for over 50 years and is located behind the conifers at the rear of the Recreation Ground, Luton Road in Toddington. We currently have 3 carpet, floodlit courts which were fully renovated in December 2017 and one hard court, plus a clubhouse with a kitchen, lounge area and toilets/showers. We are lucky enough to have a very skilled LTA Level 4 coach, Paul Hobday, who provides Junior coaching for all abilities on Wednesdays after school, during school holidays and is available for individual coaching for both junior and adult. Adult group coaching is also available subject to demand. We are always looking to welcome new members into our club and our rates are very reasonable. There is a special introductory rate of £115 for the year for new adult members, £65 p.a. for juniors/students in further education (free for 9 year olds and under) and only £80 p.a. for weekday adult members. We run adult social play tennis on Tuesday and Thursday Evenings from 7pm and on Sunday Mornings from 10am and also enter Mens, Ladies and Mixed teams into the South Bedfordshire league.

If you are not a member of the club, but would still like to play tennis occasionally, you can book a court at £10 per hour during daylight hours. Courts 1-3 (carpet courts) have restrictions to cater for usage by our club members (social sessions, league & tournament matches and for coaching sessions) but court 4 (hard surface) is available to book throughout the week and weekend (48 hours notice needed). My normal days of availability for "Parish duties" will be Monday, Wednesday and Thursday with services on Sundays of course; but I will be as accommodating as possible for any pastoral or life event occasions that arise. My intention is to be as visible and available within the parishes as possible whilst remembering that I am still only part time.

## **Understanding Our Surveys**



## Building the Evidence for Toddington's Future

In recent editions of the Toddington Village Magazine, we've been keeping you up to date with the progress of the Toddington Neighbourhood Plan (TNP) – the community-led project helping to shape how our village evolves in the years ahead. As part of this work, two important surveys have now been completed: the Housing Needs Survey and the Green Infrastructure Survey.

Both surveys play a really important role in helping us understand what matters most to residents and what Toddington truly needs.

The Housing Needs Survey, which went out in mid-October and closed in early November, will enable a clearer picture of the types of homes our community requires – from starter homes and family houses to downsizing options for older residents. This information will help make sure that future development genuinely meets local needs rather than being shaped only by wider market pressures.

The Green Infrastructure Survey, carried out in mid-November, focused on the green spaces that make Toddington special – our parks, play areas, footpaths, green verges, woodlands and open countryside. It helps highlight which areas bring the most value for recreation, nature, wellbeing, and local character. This work also ties in closely with Central Bedfordshire Council's consultation on Local Green Spaces, where residents can help identify and protect the areas that deserve special recognition in planning policy.

A big thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the surveys and share your views. Your feedback is vital in helping us make sure the Neighbourhood Plan reflects what's really important to the people who live here.

The results from both surveys will be published in early 2026 and will form a key part of the evidence base for the draft Neighbourhood Plan. They'll directly inform policies on housing, the environment, and sustainable growth – helping us shape a plan that truly represents Toddington's future.

# An update from your local Member of Parliament BLAKE STEPHENSON MP



Since my last column, a lot has been going on in Mid Bedfordhire and down in Westminster. I've been taking as many opportunities as possible to speak in the House of Commons to make sure our voices are heard, speaking on issues including scrapping Stamp Duty to support young people buy their first homes and older people to downsize if they choose, encouraging the Government to axe the Family Farm Tax which is hurting our local farmers, and calling for more to be done to put victims at the heart of our criminal justice system – and much more.

I've also been spending time in Toddington meeting local people, whether that's the incredibly friendly local horse owner community, to support the local 'pass wide and slow' campaign and to chat about the many benefits of horse riding, or popping into one of our fantastic local cafes, such as Soper & Co., to support our great local businesses. It was also lovely to meet the wonderful residents volunteering for the Royal British Legion at the Methodist Church Hall, selling poppies ahead of Remembrance Day and enjoying a lovely cuppa and a slice of homemade cake

In my last column I mentioned the ongoing work to finally rebuild the footbridge at the train station in nearby Harlington. I know that many people in Toddington regularly use the station and that the lack of step-free access is incredibly frustrating. I have been told that provisions have been made to retro-ft step-free access if funding becomes available. It's frustrating that it wasn't all rolled into this single project, but I will continue to push for step-free access to be delivered as soon as possible. 



## **Ingredients**

- 350g white flour (strong preferably)
- 2 level tsps easy yeast
- pinch salt
- 50g white sugar
- 150ml milk
- 110g butter
- 1 egg beaten
- 100gms mixed dried fruit
- 40gms dried apricots chopped
- 25gms glace cherries/dried cranberries
- grated zest of 1 lemon
- 25 gms almonds chopped (I skip these)
- 150 gms marzipan

- 110 gms icing sugar,
- 1 tablespoons lemon juice

## **STOLLEN**

## AN ENRICHED FRUIT LOAF FOR CHRISTMAS

You can buy stollen but a freshly made one (thanks to Delia) is a whole different Christmas treat. Traditionally it has a thick roll of marzipan running through the middle but I like small squares of marzipan scattered throughout like the fruit. We even made bun sized stollens at Messy church with the children choosing which dried fruits they wanted -or not. The recipe takes a lot of time but not much effort.









## **Instructions**

Mix flour, yeast, sugar and salt in a bowl. Gently warm milk and butter (on stove or microwave) until the butter is melted, cool until tepid add beaten egg and mix with flour ( if too wet add more flour). Flour the table knead the dough and then add fruit and knead until "springy and elastic". Put it back in the bowl cover with cling film or plastic bag and put it in a warm (but not hot) place until doubled in size (usually about 2 hours)

Make the marzipan into a sausage or chop into squares. Turn out the risen dough, gently flatten, put the marzipan sausage in the middle (or scatter the squares), shape into one or two loaves. Put on a lined baking sheet, cover again, put it to rise again, heat the oven to 190 or gas 5. When the dough is again light and springy (30 –60 minutes) bake for 35–40 minutes. You can test by tapping the bottom of the loaf, a hollow sound means its cooked.

Make the icing by mixing icing sugar and lemon juice, let the stollen cool a bit before spreading the icing. It may drip!! Delicious drips!!

#### LOOKING TO THE FUTURE.

If you are thinking of entering jam or chutney for next year's Summer Fete I recommend Preserves by Pam Corbin as an interesting book with some good basic recipes and some unexpected ones too.






