

It was a very enjoyable time, with so many people giving generously of time, effort and talent to aid the cause.



The Toddington Music Society hosted The President's concert in church on Saturday afternoon and the talent, skill and wide range of music offered by the young performers, musicians and soloists were amazing. There was a huge buzz at the end of the first half as people shared their admiration of the inspirational talent of the young musicians.



The Friends of St, George celebrated St George's Day in style on Tuesday afternoon on 23rd April, with about forty people thoroughly enjoying a special St George's afternoon tea. The decorated tables were set so beautifully with a tempting variety of

sandwiches, scones, jams, cake and cups of tea. It was a wonderful time.

We could not have done this without you! Thank you for your generosity of giving. An amazing sum of £500 was raised by the Friends Afternoon Tea to help fund the upkeep of the church building, and the Gift Weekend raised at least £2,000 towards the life and work of the church. Life at St George of England, Church

Life at church continues to be very busy. We were delighted to welcome the Lower school for a special Easter service. Such a joyful time and a wonderful memory. Year four children told the Easter story and the whole school sang enthusiastically and so beautifully. I continue to lead a weekly Collective Worship session in school and love the opportunity to share in their achievements. Everyone works so hard.

With the temporary closure in March of Chalgrave Church for restoration repairs the two church congregations joined together for benefice services over the Easter season. It was a bit strange not being at Chalgrave for Easter Day, but it was a lovely bonus to share worship time together.

On Sunday April 28th the Bishop of Bedford came to both churches for Sunday morning services and enjoyed a chat and a catch up with everyone. The Toddington morning service was a Confirmation Service in which three adults stepped forward to make their commitment to Jesus. What a privilege it has been to share their journey of faith.

The Alpha course is a very special time of fellowship with group members getting to know each other better, forging new friendships, whilst learning more about Jesus' life and teachings. When the course finishes we hope to continue together as a home group.

April Youth Group sessions have focused on the environment with a wonderful new bug house being created in the church grounds. Messy Church celebrated St George with lots of crafts too.



The life of a vicar is never dull and the recent gas leak outside the vestry created some interesting conumdrums. Three days with Cadent teams working hard, sorted the issue but structural repairs on consecrated land are never straightforward so I was regularly liaising with the Diocese for permissions to proceed. We now have a new gas supply pipe in the vestry and a relocated meter. Next stage is to consider improvements to the men's facilities at Wilkinson Hall.. besides dealing with the restoration of roof beams at Chalgrave church.

Thank you so much for your continued donations to the Foodbank. This is such a worthy charity and several of our families in the village are benefitting from the Foodbank provision. Donations can be left at

church, or at 22 Leighton Road. It is incredible how much has been collected over recent months. Dee and Malcolm co-ordinate the collections and deliver each week to the foodbank. The thank you's on

The roof beam restoration project in the Nave is now finished and the scaffolding has



been removed. Bucket loads of decayed wood dust were removed and rotted beam ends were replaced with adjoining strong new oak timber supports.



Scaffolding now fills the Chancel for exploration

and repair work to be carried out. I had the privilege to climb up to have a closer look and it is high! (a day in the life of a



Vicar!). The ceiling eaves have been opened up to reveal the extent of the decay.

The South side of the church is in a worse condition than the North and needs several support beams to be replaced. Sadly, another major roof beam has rot and needs replacing.. more expense and disruption but the



work needs to go on to preserve the church for future generations to come.

It has been lovely to share Benefice services at Toddington whilst Chalgrave Church was closed but it is good to return now. Bishop Richard visited on 28th April and folks enjoyed a friendly chat with him, and his wife Helen, over a cuppa afterwards. Thank you so much to the wonderful team who cleaned and prepared the church.

War Memories - Len Smith

I remember a Wellington bomber crashed in the field near Harlington Rd. The pilot had a badly cut head and another crew member had a broken leg, both were taken to the L&D Hospital. The other survivors were taken by Dr. Fawcett to Conger House as they had only minor injuries. The next day I went down the road and watched the RAF sorting through the wreckage, which was spread all over the field.

Then, Sgt McCarthy, the local policeman, came to the school, lined us up in the playground and told us that if anybody had any pieces of the wreckage it must be returned immediately. He was a frightening character, I remember playing football in the Rec and we were making no more noise than you would expect from about 20 kids, when somebody said, 'here comes McCarthy'. We carried on playing in complete silence until he had walked past pushing his bike.

On the opposite side of Harlington Road, a Dornier 17 was brought down and landed in the field. The aircraft appeared to be in good condition with only the undercarriage damaged. It was guarded by the Home Guard (Dads Army) who were in full uniform with rifles and fixed bayonets. Another aircraft made a forced landing in the field behind Dropshort Farm, it was a Polish pilot and tutor, both were unhurt.

When the 57-day continuous bombing of London took place in autumn 1940, I stood on top of Conger Hill one night with my dad and uncle Alf, and the sky looking South was completely lit up by the fires burning in London. Searchlights could be seen in the distance, moving around the sky looking for enemy aircraft. Bombs were dropped in Toddington, but not on any specific target. An enemy aircraft was being chased by a British fighter and unloaded his bombs to lighten his aircraft and gain more speed.

We used to watch our Wellington bombers, Halifax's, Lancaster's and US B17's flying over. One evening we were outside the house when bombs started falling. My Dad pushed me down on the path by the side of the house, when the bombing stopped, we ran down the road to Uncle Alf's into his cellar. It was a German bomber being chased and he'd dropped his load to lighten his aircraft, the bombs fell in a line from Tebworth to Toddington.

War Memories - Kath White

My earliest memories are of lying in bed at night and hearing the drone of aircraft engines flying overhead, I was about 3 years old and one evening whilst I was being bathed by the fire, a German plane dropped several bombs around Toddington. One landing in the conger at the back of our home. These bombs made large craters in the fields, which remained for many years after the war. I can remember playing in the

My brother, Ted, took me to the Green to see the soldiers in the village. They had built a large round raised container and filled it with water. A soldier was floating a rubber dingy and several children had rides.

We walked across the Green to Leighton Road, passed the Council school and past the Wesleyan chapel and hall. The soldiers were camped in the field next to the hall, and I recall a soldier sitting on a step outside, eating his food. We stood quietly on the pathway watching him as he ate, he offered me a piece of fruit cake.

Another time Ted took me to see the remains of a crashed fighter plane down by Dunedin Farmhouse. I recall an engine and a bent propellor.

Some people had air-raid shelters, but we didn't I remember hearing the airraid siren and the all-clear which might have been near Mr. Petts garage on the green.

Many London evacuees stayed in Toddington we had one lady stay with us and another two ladies stayed with Mr. Piper, in our Lane. Each child was issued with a gas mask, which was kept in its own cardboard box. "It's not to be played with" said Mother. Once I was allowed to try it on, it smelt strongly of rubber, thankfully it was never needed.

Blackout curtains were a must, Mother would carefully cover every window at night before she lit the lamp. Air-raid wardens checked that no light showed. Sergeant Gordon was our Policeman, and one evening he marched my eldest brother home, for swearing outside the Picture house in Gas Street.

At the end of the War we had a Street party, the children were seated at the tables in the Lane and all the grown-ups were there too to enjoy the celebrations. There were paste sandwiches, jelly and cake.



The garden is always open for people to pop in, do a bit of weeding, harvesting or to just enjoy a bit of peace.

Strawberry Sponge Cake

It is still a cold and wet April at the moment but by the time you read this the sun will be warm and strawberries will be in season, although this is fun to make and delicious all year round. This genoise sponge is not, I think, exciting by itself but a great base for cream and icing and it is very, very light.

Ingredients:

- 4 eggs
- 125gms caster sugar
- 125gms plain flour, sifted Pinch salt

- 30gms melted butter
- 300gms strawberries
- 30gms icing sugar 250ml double cream

Directions:

Heat the oven to 180 c 160fan 4gas Prepare a 23cms cake tin with non-stick baking paper or sheet or cake tin liner.

Whisk the sugar and eggs until a very pale very thick froth. (I use my machine and set a timer for 7 minutes, you could use a hand held whisk or do it by hand if you have the arm muscles of a Victorian cook.) Then in a bowl gently fold in the sifted flour a bit at a time. Fold it over until the flour is no longer visible then fold in the melted butter. Don't mix so hard you push the air out. Pour into the prepared tin and cook for about 25 minutes until it is nicely golden and the mixture is beginning to shrink from the edge of the tin. Leave to cool.

Meanwhile put six or seven larger strawberries and the icing sugar in a blender and whizz to a puree, you could mash them hard by hand instead.

Whip the cream until standing in soft peaks. Mix with the strawberry puree.

When the cake is cool cut it in half horizontally, spread at least half the strawberry cream on the lower layer, put the top half back on and spread the rest on top and decorate with strawberries cut or not as you wish.







PASSWORDS... *@*!-8*#!

We all have them (even if you don't think you do!), we all use them and most of us would admit to reusing a password. These days online accounts are used for everything from email to buying stamps and paying the gas bill. So here are some top tips on how to keep them strong and keep your online world secure.

Secret Code, NOT BIRTHDAY: Your password is like a key to your online stuff. Don't use birthdays or pet names – anyone who knows you could guess it!

Mix it Up: Strong passwords have a variety of uppercase & lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols (# @ \$) to make them tougher to crack.

Longer is Stronger: The longer your password, the better! Aim for 12+ characters, like a secret sentence with no spaces.

Use a Password Manager: Software that uses a secure database on your device, helping keep track, allowing you to use more unique and strong passwords.

One Per Treasure Chest: Don't use the same key for all your doors! Make a unique password for each website or account. This keeps them all safe.

Write it Down, But Hide it Well: Remembering passwords is hard! Write them down, but hide them well. Not a sticky note on your computer! Maybe a hidden notebook or ask a trusted family member to keep them safe (perhaps in a code that triggers your memory, without revealing the passwords themselves).

Beware the Shoulder Surfers: Don't type your password in public if someone might be peeking! Shield the keyboard and be careful on shared computers.

Using a password manager can be very helpful in keeping track of your accounts and passwords. Using one will allow you to use stronger unique passwords for more or all of your accounts. Internet browsers such as, Chrome, Edge and Firefox will offer to save passwords when you enter them. These passwords can be viewed later in a list found in the browser's settings. This saved list should be secure provided your computer also has a password/pin when you turn it on. The saved password list should only be accessible to you or those who know the computer password.

I know it is hard to keep unique passwords for all accounts, but my suggestion is if it really seems too much, please make sure your main email account(s) password(s) is/are secure. Email accounts are often used as a recovery method for other online accounts and thus could provide a gateway for a malicious actor to access other services. If there is one online service you should concentrate on, it is recommended that your primary email account be the one. Some email providers such as outlook.com and gmail.com have a 'Security Check-Up' in the account area that will help with more advanced options such as Multi-Factor Authentication (Subject for another article...), recovery numbers, connected apps etc.


