






Around the Motorway Services walk

A circular walk over arable fields, of about 4¾ miles (7.5 km), starting at the pump on Toddington village green. An interesting contrast of being near travellers on the motorway and railway, but also being in the countryside away from the conurbation & people! Farm livestock may be in some of the fields you cross where dogs must be kept



under close control. Mostly on field edges or tracks but some arable fields may be muddy in places, particularly after wet weather. Much of the walk is over land managed by Heathcote Farms Ltd who request you support their environmental work by respecting the county code. Your Village Needs You!

Do you care enough about future Development in your local community to get involved in its planning?

The Parish Council is considering developing a Strategic Plan that would be used by the Parish Council to determine its position across a broad spectrum of planning and development issues that will require consideration over the next few years.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS can be created by communities which, if adopted, form part of the LOCAL PLAN. The Local Plan becomes the guiding document against which planning and development decisions are taken by the Local Authority. A Local Plan is a Statutory obligation on the Local Authority. By developing a Neighbourhood Plan and having it formally adopted, communities like Toddington can input into the Local Plan and Central Bedfordshire Council is then obliged to take the plan into account when making decisions that impact our community. The adoption process is long and extremely time consuming; many communities do not have a Neighbourhood Plan. Toddington very nearly had one in the recent past but unfortunately it was not adopted - although there is a great deal of relevant material that can still be used.

Following the Local Elections in May 2024 Central Bedfordshire Council decided to rewrite the Local Plan, and as such it is not expected to have a formalised Plan until 2028/29. This gives Toddington an opportunity to develop its Neighbourhood Plan - and have its voice heard by the Local Authority in the years to come.

It is unlikely that local communities will get much direction of intent from the Local Authority for some time, which creates the potential for ambiguity and/or a lack of focus on the very important subject of Planning and Development in our Village.

To overcome this, the Parish Council is considering creating a Strategic Plan along the lines of a Neighbourhood Plan - the objective being to develop a document against which the Parish Council and community can view planning and development matters and communicate with the Authority and other stakeholders. It would be an internal document, not intended to be adopted by Central Bedfordshire Council, but could form the basis of any Neighbourhood Plan the Parish might want to create in the future.

To enable the Parish Council to develop this document it would be very helpful to have a few interested residents join a Working Party facilitated by the Parish Council. We want to gain residents' views and engagement on the key subject areas to ensure we operate as inclusively as possible.

Subject Areas for inclusion would be: The Natural environment, Housing/Development, Employment, The Village Centre, Transport infrastructure, Education, Health, Youth facilities, Recreation/Open Spaces, Access, Heritage.

Please be aware that your involvement in the project will need some of your time and commitment over the next 18-24months.

Souper thoughts for colder days

A recipe for spicy parsnip soup

Ingredients:

- 800 grams parsnips peeled and chopped
- 1 cooking apple peeled and grated,
- Teaspoon ground cumin and coriander and turmeric and ginger
- · Salt and pepper

- 2 cloves garlic crushed
- 2 onions sliced
- 40gms butter1 and half litres stock(veg or chicken)Salt and pepper

Directions:

Gently cook onion and garlic until soft add spices and some salt and pepper then parsnips stir together and add stock, cook until all are well cooked then add the apple for a few minutes, whiz or sieve, taste for seasoning and serve.

However.....use this as a basis for all sorts of soup. Try frying an onion add any veg you have in the fridge and maybe a bit of bacon and other odds and ends, add some flavourings, spices/herbs/bit of spicy sauce then add stock (cubes are good but be aware of saltiness) cook them and whizz/sieve (or not) taste for seasoning and perhaps a spoonful of cream or plain yogurt or crème fraiche and perhaps croutons (squares of fried or baked bread) or a sprinkle of fresh herbs.

Or what about a minestrone, tomatoes and veg thickened with pasta or rice or beans, surely the result of cooking what you had to hand in your Mediterranean kitchen.

There are thousands of fun recipes out there for all kinds of soup from all over the world. Try them but only be limited by your imagination!!!



The Minister's Letter

Apologies, this is not a letter from a minister but just a mere Christian.

You may not have met the Methodist minister Seung-wook, he doesn't live in Toddington and is here for just a day or two each month. He is a lovely man but he, like so many ministers of all denominations, is responsible for more than one church and has to share himself out to his scattered flock.

However, that does not mean that there is not a Christian presence in the village. You may not have met Seung-wook or even the Anglican minister, Linda, but you most certainly will know, or have met, other Christians. Some will worship in other churches in or outside of the village, others may meet with fellow believers in their own home, but one thing they all share is a desire to share God's love. They are your neighbours, people you meet on a walk, at the park, in the surgery, at the school – they are everywhere! They all have experienced God's love and want others to experience it too.

The churches here in Toddington all run or host a multitude of events for children, young people, adults and even older adults. At

the Methodist church we have just completed a 5-week holiday club attended by over 60 children and young adults. The Anglican Church has begun hosting a Community Fridge and the Baptist Church will once again be opening their doors to welcome tots and their carers to Hurly Burly. These are just examples, look at each of the churches pages in this magazine to see all the things that churches are doing to share their love of God and to serve their community.

In a world where there is apparently very little regard for others and so much suffering, God calls us to love, love our brothers and sisters, love each other, love others, and even love our enemies

Jesus told the believers that they were to be 'salt and light' (Matthew 5: 13-20) to their communities. Without salt food can seem a little bland and without the 'saltiness' of our church communities then perhaps our village might be a little less palatable too.

Don't wait until you next meet a minister in passing to reassure yourselves that God is present and at work here in our community - they can be few and far between – but the doors of your local churches are open to welcome you.

TODDINGTON COMMUNITY GARDEN

The garden has been looking amazing of late, sunflowers, marigolds and nasturtiums added welcome colour and vibrancy to our otherwise 'green' space. We were just feeling pleased with ourselves when we realised that the nasturtiums growing alongside the brassica cages were providing easy access for newly hatched cabbage-white caterpillars through the nets along a leaf-to-leaf bridge. As an organic garden



we are unable to use the kinds of pesticides which might have dealt swiftly with the problem and instead have spent many, many hours hunting and removing the dreaded, cabbage munching pests! We won't make the same mistake next year!

POPCORN

If you have visited the garden at all over the last few months, you may have marvelled at our amazing crop of, what appears to be, sweetcorn. Don't be taken in. It is not sweetcorn but popcorn that we are trying for the first time this year. Popcorn differs from normal sweetcorn in its starch content. It has a higher starch content making it a lot tougher and less sweet than the sweetcorn we normally eat. It is the starch content which causes the 'pop' to make popcorn.



It is different to look at too! Don't be tempted to pick it

to use as sweetcorn – you will be disappointed – it will be tough and not at all sweet.

MULTI FACTOR AUTHENTICATION

I have written about passwords already so hopefully now some of you will have taken the time to consider if you are using a strong password. especially for your primary email account!

MFA (Multi Factor Authentication) sometimes called 2FA (Two Factor Authentication) is a way to add extra security to your online accounts. Instead of just using a password, it requires something else to confirm it's really you. This second "factor" could be a code sent to your phone, your fingerprint, or even a special app.

So even if someone steals your password, they can't get into your account without this extra step. It's like adding another lock on your door to keep your information safer.

Here are some reasons why MFA or 2FA is good for personal cyber security.

- Enhanced Security: MFA adds an extra layer of protection beyond just a password, making it much harder for hackers to access your account even if your password is compromised.
- Prevents Unauthorized Access: Even if a hacker steals your password, they would still need the second factor (like a one-time code sent to your phone) to access your email or accounts.
- Mitigates Phishing Attacks: MFA can stop phishing attempts in their tracks, as attackers won't have the second factor needed to gain access, even if they trick you into giving up your password.
- Low Cost, High Impact: Enabling MFA is typically free and easy to set up, but it provides a significant increase in your overall cybersecurity defences.

So why am I mentioning it? Lots of digital services now enforce MFA or suggest it. However, there are many email users out there who have not activated or can't activate MFA for one reason or another. In my experience this is often for the older internet provider email addresses such as BT, NTL, Virgin, Sky, Tiscali etc. but not limited to these. Other email accounts do offer MFA but it is not turned on by default. You must look in security settings of your account to set it up. Sometimes this is not so straight forward for the legacy email accounts, so if you need help setting up MFA for your main email account just give me a call and together we can secure your online world.






