Toddington Parish Council is the closest tier of government to our community, and we have the responsibility of making decisions on behalf of the people of the Parish. We sit directly under our Unitary Council Central Bedfordshire.

Often the first point of call for resident's queries and concerns, the Parish Council takes our duty to serve the people of Toddington seriously and we want to see our village flourish. Therefore, we encourage people to come forward to let us know what they want from us and suggest ways that we could do things better.

Over the last year or so – we have hosted several events – Queen's Platinum Jubilee Event, The King's Coronation Event last Summer at Luton Road Recreation and the Toddington Christmas Events on the Village Green.

We have been involved in the Queens Canopy Planting Event around the village.

Benches have been installed around the Village – to celebrate the Queens' Platinum Jubilee at Crowbush and a Memorial bench in the Memorial Gardens for the late Queen Elizabeth II. Also, a new circular bench has been installed around The Village Green sign.

New Christmas Lights on the large tree have been installed and we have planted a new real Christmas Tree on the Green and look forward in the coming years, once established, this becoming a focal point during the festive season.

On-going Projects

Over the coming months we will receive an upgraded play park with all new equipment for the Community to use with further landscaping expanding this area. Within the area will be some areas for seating and picnic tables.

The Glebe will also see some changes with improved parking and improved green infrastructure, with additional planting complemented with additional benches, interpretation table, and signage boards.

We are looking to improve several of our village assets during the year – such as The Village Sign, and improvements to the Memorial Garden and will keep you updated as these projects progress.



Other ways to get Involved

You don't have to be a Councillor to get involved in Parish work, if you want to keep abreast of decisions, all of our



meetings are open to the public and there is an opportunity for public participation if there is something in particular that you want to bring to the Council. All our meetings are publicised on our noticeboards at the Village Green, by the Post Office and outside the Village Hall, as well as on our Website. You'll also find our minutes published on the Website.

In addition, our Annual Parish meeting in April is a little less formal, a time when we award our Grants and Recognition Awards will be presented. The meeting usually ends in a few nibbles and drinks and offers the opportunity to speak to Councillors in a relaxed atmosphere.

St George of England Church, Toddington

The special, 800 year old Anglican parish church of St George, sits alongside the Village Green, at the heart of the Village, where it has stood for so many years. Many people will have come to the church to be married, baptised, to pray, worship, to be confirmed, to sing in the choir, play the organ, or for a whole variety of reasons. Folks remember climbing the church tower to look out across the village and the recent school visit on Shrove Tuesday to Conger Lane stirred many memories of times past when Old Boys had done the same visit many years before, with the church bell ringing out at 12 noon.

The church has been part of many peoples' lives over the years and has witnessed many rites of passage. The church oozes history with medieval wall paintings, the external frieze of animals, Cheyne Chapel, and memorial to Lady Wentworth, and - as recent photos on Facebook have shown - people connect with the history, and the memory of connection. The church is important to many people.

Recent restoration work inside the church revealed the beautiful handiwork of tradesmen hundreds of years ago who formed the sturdy stone church walls - so strong and meticulously crafted. It was fascinating to discover some memorial plaques behind the main altar dating back to the 1600's, which were previously unseen.

We are keen that the church is a welcoming church, a place of respite and solace, a place of peace for those who need it, but also a place where we can gather together at special times, as family and community, to worship on a Sunday, for special services or occasions, or to listen to a concert another time, for mums and their children to pop by to look around, for visitors from afar to come and connect. People have different reasons for coming... but the church is an important place. As church, we seek to do what Jesus would have done.. to love and to care, to support and to offer hospitality. Some people who visit may have a deep faith whilst others might be searching but whatever the situation – we want to offer you a warm and caring welcome.

In Wilkinson Hall, the Church Hall, we offer a wide range of activities as we seek to reach out to serve the community. We look to encourage, and we offer many opportunities to meet over food and hospitality with monthly Ploughman's lunches and Coffee mornings, cake stalls and refreshments, the Alpha course meal, monthly Messy Church for our younger members and families which always finishes with tea, youth group for 9 plus years young people which also has a food snack time with a chat. Jesus often spoke of meeting with others over a meal and it is a wonderful time to share, support, and get to know each other.

The building of Wilkinson Hall was funded by a bequest, and it was dedicated on All Saints Day in 1992. We offer a range of activities in the Hall including seated Pilates on Monday afternoons twice a month, Knitting group on Tuesday mornings, monthly Fellowship Time and time with Friends on Thursday afternoons, Painting for Pleasure group on Friday mornings, plus various sales, events, and fundraising activities throughout the year. The Hall is a valuable facility and has recently been refreshed and redecorated and is due to be fitted with new curtains. Situated in the Church grounds it is very convenient for church events and is also available for hire.

Fundraising events have become a regular part of church life, to help meet the Diocesan Parish Share annual payment, to fund repairs, resources, and to support those in need. Led by Dee, Churchwarden, and fundraiser extraordinaire, we have a regular schedule of events, but we would value any new fund-raising ideas you can suggest, to help support the running of this beautiful, ancient church. Please keep an eye out for information about the special Celebration of St George Gift Day Weekend 20-21 April, and 23 April Afternoon Tea.

All Saints Church, Chalgrave

The beautiful church of All Saints Church Chalgrave has been looking very different these days with scaffolding in the Nave reaching high to the roof and plastic sheeting covering the pews, and the organ, while structural investigations have been taking place to check the interior roof area.

We are currently having our Sunday 9:30am services in the Chancel where there is a very special feeling, as we sit in the choir stalls, joining in our worship together. Despite the restoration work, it is important and special to gather together, and we warmly invite you to join us.

During 2023, restoration work was completed at one end of a chancel roof beam, but the issue highlighted the need to check the beams in the Nave.

Recent investigations revealed there are several roof beams in need of urgent repair, so scaffolding has been erected, and now the structural engineer has identified the work as urgent, it will hopefully be underway soon.

Unfortunately, the work will be very costly....in excess of the initial investigative quote of £27,000. We will apply for grants to help cover the costs, with guidance from the diocese, and pray that any applications will be successful. Unfortunately, many grant bodies won't consider grant applications if the work has already begun so the urgency of this work may preclude some applications. 'Any, and all' donations for the repairs, or fundraising ideas, would be greatly appreciated. Sadly, while the restoration work takes place, we can't offer any of our usual fundraising and social activities in church.

Our Pop Up Tea Room continues to be popular and is held at Chalgrave Memorial Hall in Tebworth on the 4th Wednesday of the month. We serve soup, quiches, sausage rolls, scones and lots of yummy cakes. It's a wonderful opportunity to have a chat and make some new friends. All age groups are welcome. Next dates are: April 24th, May 22nd, June 26th, July 24th. No pop up in August.

Save the date: Saturday, November 9th for our Christmas Craft Fair at Chalgrave Memorial Hall. Back again this year by popular demand. ③

How we began... TCBC owes its existence to a voluntary group formed in 1999, celebrating the new millennium; one of the ideas put forward was the possibility of starting a club. This did not actually go ahead but Eddie Hedley sent out flyers to see who was interested and with such good interest the Village hall was booked, a donated carpet and 2 sets of bowls found. Initially Derek Payne knew how to play the game and the club started to grow. Funds grew and we now have 4 carpets that can be played at once. In time we joined Bedfordshire Carpet Bowl Association to play against other teams.

Social side... Obviously there is the social aspect of coming to normal sessions to play and enjoy each other's company but we also have a summer get together such as an Afternoon tea, there have been days out in the past and also a Christmas meal each year. We are always open to new ideas for social events too.

The broader carpet bowls community... For many years various members and their partners have attend the annual English Carpet Bowls association's Festival of Carpet Bowls at Potters Resorts in Norfolk (famous for hosting the annual televised World Bowls Festivals) This 4 day festival is enhanced by the all-inclusive food and drink, lovely accommodation and entertainment provided as well as the bowls.

We also participate in day events at Barton Village Hall playing against other Bedfordshire teams in competitions for Singles, Pairs, Triples and Rinks (4 in a team) which are well attended and exciting to be involved with if you chose to do so. We have matches in the Bedfordshire league against other clubs throughout Bedfordshire and some members as previously stated play in the Eastern Counties Carpet bowls Leagues for the Bedfordshire team too.

Welcome to Toddington Library

Who are we and what do we offer?

Before it became our beautiful library on 9th June 1972, the building itself had been around for over a century with records to show that in 1910 it was a family run bakers shop. Toddington Library is easily accessible, welcoming and is vital in reducing social isolation. We have a car park to the rear of the building and 2 disabled parking spaces at the front. We are located on the green at 9 Market Square (Next to the Oddfellows).

Our library boasts something for everyone! It is a meeting place for many: including a book group, discussion group and a family history group. The walk4health group started out as a casual walk for the over 55's and now has an average of 45 people

attending every week. We also have regular coffee mornings taking place on the third Saturday of every month and our weekly Knitting and Jigsaw group which currently meets on Tuesday and Friday mornings. The library has also hosted the Librarian Theatre, book launches and author visits which are always very well attended.

Let's not forget the youngsters! We have free crafts every day of all school holidays suitable for all ages. We also provide other activities such as Bee-Bots (our friendly programmable robots), jigsaws and ticketed events. School/nursery visits are encouraged too alongside our popular Rhyme and story time which is held every Thursday 10-11am. For slightly older children we host a Lego Club on Saturday mornings which is followed by a Board Game Club. And for even older children, our library is the perfect place to study – providing free internet usage and access to 7 computers with printing and photocopying facilities.

Toddington Community Garden

The garden is situated behind the Wesley Hall at the Methodist Church and is run by a small group of volunteers.

The garden was started nearly 9 years ago with an aim to provide edible and organically grown fruit and vegetables. To start with the area was an overgrown patch of grass that had been used as a dumping ground over the last 100 + years. The amount of old metal we have found (and which keeps appearing!) is incredible.

Every year we provide the village with vegetables, fruit and herbs – all free for anyone to come and pick throughout the growing seasons. The garden is

open access and has paths around the outside that can be used by wheelchairs and prams with care. We also have seating so people can sit and read or relax in what is a very sunny and peaceful space.

Our volunteers are in the garden on Wednesday mornings from 10-11.30 and Friday afternoons 2-4 and we are always pleased to have visitors or volunteers to help out!

Our plans for this year include growing more salad crops and even some popcorn! Herbs are always popular, and we have lots of edible flowers too. We usually grow tomatoes, runner beans, courgettes, peas, kale, carrots, strawberries, raspberries and much more.

We also have plans for a nature and wildflower area to attract the bees and other beneficial bugs and wildlife.

Club Update

Toddington Rovers Football Club are proud this year to support the membership of 200 children living within Toddington and the surrounding villages.

One of our main ambitions is to provide a safe and enjoyable opportunity for children to come together to enjoy the sport and to engage with each other, never has this been more important and we are proud of our club officers and coaching community in their pursuit to provide both physical and psychological benefits to members.

This year there have been two new U7s teams coming from our early year's academy led by our new coaches Aran Braybrooke, Richard Lugamayer and Gareth Fear. We are also thrilled that our Walking Football team led by Dave Dixon and our adult team led by Harry Drummond are building upon last season and both sets of players enjoying a fine season. Club Development Plan

Over the past 3 years, club officers have been working on ways to improve the facilities we have in Toddington. We have secured a long-term service agreement for The Glebe with the Parish Council and this has enabled us to apply and be awarded a grant from the Football Foundation. We have been awarded a six-year grant of £54,000 to be utilised on grass pitch remediation, and in addition the football club will be investing a further £27,000 over the same period. This is just the beginning of an exciting time to be part of Toddington Rovers, the club are working with the Parish Council to improve car parking provisions at the Glebe and hope to share some further news in the near future.







HOW TO SPOT EMAIL FRAUD

With the rise of artificial intelligence (AI), fake emails are getting more convincing all the time. But there can be some signs that an email isn't genuine, so look out for:

- Urgent offers or prompts to "click here/now" for quick responses.
- · Lack of personalized address, indicating unfamiliarity with the recipient.
- · Spelling and grammar errors, although phishing emails are becoming more refined.
- Familiar-looking imagery or design that feels off.
- · Encouragement to click on unknown links; instead, visit the organization's website directly.
- Requests for personal data.
- Suspicious email address or false 'Display Name' resembling but not matching the official company's address.



This 'Display Name' can be easily changed to anything the scammer wants. e.g. NHS, Royal Mail, Gas Utility.



If you have opened a suspicious email, clicking on the display name will normally reveal the true full email address. This could be a compromised or fake account.



Be aware, these points can also apply to genuine senders, it is possible that a friend has had their email compromised and their account is being used to send fraudulent emails. Be aware of unsolicited requests for money, and personal details, they may include an emotional story referencing an illness or bereavement in an attempt to convince the victim. A common example at the moment is for a scammer to request a victim purchase Amazon vouchers and send them to the email address. Once this is done and the vouchers have been sent it is difficult or impossible to get money back from Amazon or the Banks. If in doubt delete the email or ask a trusted friend or family member to review the email with you.
