Introduction

The competition is designed to support and encourage the development of photographic skills in young people through:

- Experimenting with photography
- Creative interpretation of the chosen topic
- Expression of ideas through the medium of photography

Our theme this year is Animals. There are many lovely animals around locally for you to take a photo of - maybe your pet or a friend or relatives pet. Maybe you want to take a picture of a wild animal like a squirrel or a deer. We will accept pictures of birds fish and reptiles as well. There is plenty of scope so Happy Photographing.

Who can take part?

This competition is open to **all** young people resident in or attending schools in the CR3 & CR6 area. Cash prizes and awards will be given in three age groups.

- KS1 (5-7 years)
- KS2 (7-11 years)
- KS3 (11-14 years)

Competition Guidelines

Task To produce a photograph as a .jpg file based upon the theme '**Animals**' in colour or black and white.(Ideally the file should be able to produce a 4" x 6"/ 10 cm x 15cm size print).

The photograph should be taken locally.

The photograph must be the original work of the entrant without assistance from parents/ guardians or carers.

Complete the Entry Form. (Unfortunately, entries received without a form cannot be included). Only one photograph entry per person.

Important Notes:

- Files in .pdf format and photos modified by photo imaging software (such as Photoshop) will not be accepted.
- Photographs which include people under 18 years old **must** be accompanied by written permission from the parent, guardian or carer of the person photographed. (see Entry Form Attached)
 - **Judges** 3 Judges with appropriate skills, appointed by the Rotary Club of Caterham, who will look at the technical merit; content and composition as well as imagination and style.
 - **Prizes** There will be cash prizes for the winner and 2 runners up in each of the age groups. Certificates of merit will also be awarded to other participants at the discretion of the Judges. All winners and runners –up will be notified by 11th April 2025.

Only under exceptional circumstances will the organisers enter into correspondence about the Competition and the results.
