



Significant events of IAF in 2024 include "Exercise Vayu Shakti" at the Pokhran range near Jaisalmer (Rajasthan), 'Exercise Tarang Shakti' India's largest multinational air exercise to date at Sular and Jodhpur. India's First Private Military Aircraft Plant was also inaugurated at Varodra. IAF also achieved significant milestones like participation of an all women contingent at Republic Day Parade 2025. Award of President's Standards and President's Colours to four units of IAF in 2024 (a historic first for the IAF) and inauguration of Weapon Systems School are the other important events.

IAF also commemorated its 92nd anniversary with a grand air show over Chennai's Marina Beach. The show attracted an unprecedented crowd of approximately 1.5 million spectators, setting a record for the largest gathering at an air show in India.

IAF provided the logistical and operational support, facilitating civil aviation and providing humanitarian aid and disaster relief (HADR) coverage. Arrangements were in place to help veterans to visit Kumbh. During the 9th Armed Forces Veterans' Day celebration at the Manekshaw Centre in New Delhi Chief of the Air Staff Air Chief Marshal AP Singh stressed that modernization and strengthening operational capabilities remain essential to addressing the challenges posed by evolving warfare. The CAS paid tribute to the contributions and sacrifices of all veterans. In his message he underscored the importance of preserving the legacy of those who had built the foundation of the IAF.

AIR CHIEF MARSHAL AP SINGH, PVSM, AVSM TAKES OVER AS CHIEF OF THE AIR STAFF



Air Chief Marshal AP Singh took over as Chief of the Air Staff (CAS) at a ceremony at Air Headquarters (Vayu Bhawan) on 30 Sep 2024.

The CAS was commissioned on 21 December 1984 in fighter stream of the IAF. He is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Defence Services Staff College and National Defence College. He is a Qualified Flying Instructor and an Experimental Test Pilot with more than 5000 hours of service flying on a variety of fixed wing and rotary wing aircraft.

His operational tenures include being the Commanding Officer of a MiG-27 Sqn and Air Officer Commanding of an air base. As a test pilot, he led the Mig 29 Upgrade Project Management Team at

Moscow, Russia. He was also the Project Director (Flight Test) at National Flight Test Centre looking after flight testing of Tejas. During his career spanning four decades, the CAS has tenanted staff appointments as Air Defence Commander at HQ South Western Air Command and Senior Air Staff Officer at Eastern Air Command. Prior to taking over as Chief of the Air Staff, he was the Vice Chief of the Air Staff.

The CAS is a recipient of Param Vishisht Seva Medal (PVSM) and Ati Vishisht Seva Medal (AVSM). In his address to the IAF, Air Chief Marshal AP Singh said that he is honoured and privileged to have been entrusted with the responsibility of leading the Indian Air Force. Extending greetings to all Air Warriors, Non Combatants (Enrolled), DSC personnel, civilians and their families, CAS expressed absolute faith and confidence in their unstinted support and dedication towards maintaining IAF's operational capability at an all-time high.

He conveyed sincere gratitude to the vision of air veterans and attributed the success of the IAF to their superior efforts and dynamic leadership. Highlighting certain focus areas towards building a 'Sashakt, Saksham and an Atmanirbhar' IAF, he urged the Commanders to adopt a nurturing leadership and enhance cohesion and jointness. He called for attention on the current uncertain geo-political situation and said, "It is important that the IAF remains operationally capable, ever vigilant and a credible deterrent." The CAS exhorted all air warriors to follow traditions of the great service and ensure that together we all "Touch the Sky with Glory".

AFA GETS NEW PRESIDENT



Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari, PVSM, AVSM, VM (Retd) takes over as president AFA and Chairman of Marshal of the Air Force and Mrs Arjan Singh Trust on 30 Sep 2024 from Air Chief Marshal RKS Bhaduria PVSM AVSM VM (Retd).

He was 27th Chief of Air Staff succeeding Air Chief Marshal Rakesh Kumar Singh Bhaduria. He is born to Shri Rambhau Ganapat Chaudhari, his mother was a school headmistress. His grandfather was a teacher at the Zila Parishad school at Koli, a village in Hadgaon taluka. He studied in primary school at Nanded. He subsequently moved to Pune and enrolled in a military school. He is married to Smt Neeta Chaudhari. They have two sons. His elder son is a Fighter Pilot in the Indian Air Force. His younger son is settled at USA. Post retirement President AFA is settled at Hyderabad.

GP CAPT SHUBHANSHU SHUKLA



Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla will be the second Indian to travel to space since Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma's journey in 1984. His participation in Ax-4 is expected to provide valuable experience that will benefit India's Gaganyaan mission. Axiom Mission 4 (Ax-4) is the fourth mission to the International Space Station (ISS) by Axiom Space (a private spaceflight company). This mission which has been planned in collaboration with NASA is scheduled for launch no earlier than April 2025. The mission will utilize a Space X Crew Dragon spacecraft. During his maiden mission, Subhanshu Shukla plans to perform yoga aboard the ISS aiming to

explore its potential benefits in microgravity. He also intends to showcase India's cultural diversity by carrying items representing various regions and sharing Indian cuisine with the crew.

AIR MARSHAL SP DHARKAR, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM: VICE CHIEF OF AIR STAFF



Air Marshal Sujeet Pushpakar Dharkar, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, took over as Vice Chief of the Air Staff on 03 October 2024 after relinquishing appointment as the Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief of EAC. Prior to this, he was the Senior Air Staff Officer at HQ SWAC. He has earlier been the Director General of the Defence Space Agency at Bengaluru, Air Defence Commander at HQ EAC and Assistant Chief of the Air Staff (Training) at Air Headquarters. Air Mshl Dharkar is a fighter pilot with more than 3600 hrs of flying experience.

AIR MARSHAL SURAT SINGH, AVSM, VM, VSM: AOC-IN-C EAC

AIR MARSHAL PK GHOSH, AVSM: AOA





AIR MARSHAL VENKATARAMANAN RAJASEKHAR, AVSM: AOM



Air Marshal Venkataramanan Rajasekhar, AVSM has taken over as AOM on 01 Feb 25. He was commissioned in IAF on 07 September 1987. He is an alumnus of IIT, Bombay. His senior level appointments include CTTO TC, Commandant MILIT and Director General (Systems). He is also appointed as Commodore Commandant, AFTC.

INDIA LOSES A RATAN: “THE RATAN”



Sh. Ratan Tata was a prominent business tycoon, philanthropist, and luminary figure whose success story shall continue as an inspiration for generations. He was born into an affluent industrial family with a rich legacy. He was the great-grandson of Jamsetji Tata, the founder of the Tata Group. He controlled over 30 companies operating in over 100 countries across six continents and had an estimated personal net worth of ₹10000 Crore. Yet he lived an unpretentious life.

He, like his great-grandfather and founder Sh Jamshed Tata was a firm believer that businesses need to go beyond the interest of their companies and support the communities they serve.

Tatas have been regularly supporting and funding various projects. Some of their major donations include 50 million dollars to Cornell University, 50 million dollars to Harvard Business School, 25 million dollars grant to IISC for advancing research in nanotechnology, aerospace engineering, and data science; Large donations for Cancer Research and Treatment particularly through the Tata Memorial Hospital; Funds for Development and augmentation of 10 cancer care facilities across various states in India; Rs 1,500 crore for COVID relief efforts etc.

Late Sh. Ratan Tata also made regular donations into various sectors like Empowerment of Women, vocational training and entrepreneurship support for Dalits and tribes; Environmental Sustainability initiatives like Clean Energy Projects, Water Conservation; Tsunami Relief (2004), Flood Relief Efforts; Kerala floods in 2018, Promoting Mental Health Awareness; Affordable Housing Initiatives, helping young 21st-century start ups, entrepreneurs by investing in many new-age tech-driven startups including Ola Electric, Paytm, Snapdeal, Lenskart and Zivame.

He touched the lives of many, often avoiding the limelight and focusing instead on meaningful, personal connections. He gave away new trucks to genocide survivors of 1984 riots without charging a penny and helped them restart their businesses from scratch. During the 26/11 Mumbai Attack, Sh. Ratan Tata visited each employee's family affected by the attack and formed the Taj Public Service Welfare Trust to provide relief to those affected by the terrorist attack.

He decided to make affordable TATA NANO, world's cheapest car, when he witnessed a family of four riding precariously on a scooter in early 2000. While the Nano didn't become a commercial success as hoped, it showcased Tata's deep concern for ordinary people and his desire to innovate for the greater good rather than solely for profit.

In the late 1990s, when Tata Motors' passenger car division was struggling, Ratan Tata considered selling it to Ford. During a meeting in Detroit, Ford executives reportedly belittled Tata's efforts, suggesting that Ford would be “doing Tata a favor” by buying the division. Insulted, Ratan Tata walked away from the deal and decided to turn Tata Motors around. Years later, in 2008, Tata Motors acquired Jaguar and Land Rover from a financially troubled Ford. The acquisition was a success and is seen as a powerful example of resilience and business turnaround.

He was also well known for his kind and empathetic nature, for animals. Tata Group's Headquarters in Mumbai, which is aptly named Bombay House, is open to all stray dogs in that area and they are given free food and shelter on any given day. In his will, he has not only left his wealth for his brother Jimmy, and half-sisters Shireen and Deanna Jejeebhoy, but also to his beloved pet dog Tito (a German Shepherd) and his house staff, among others. Now that shows the golden heart that Ratan Tata had!

COMBAT AIRCRAFT ENGINES – THE NEED FOR ATMANIRBHARTA



Aero engines form the heart of an airborne platform, be it aircraft, helicopter, drone or missile. Technology, in particular for combat aircraft engines, be it manufacture or MRO, is unique and demands a high level of expertise”



This article serves to provide a knowhow on the very basics of a combat aero engine, the current issues being faced in design, development and manufacture within Bharat and a possible way forward.

As we are all aware, it is in the public domain that significant articles and newspaper clippings have been published on India's critical need for developing a combat aircraft aero engine to meet the urgent requirements of powering our indigenous combat aircraft, the LCA. I had already published two basic articles on the LCA and now thought it prudent to give an overview on aero engines for the benefit of the larger populace of our air veterans and air warriors community.

A basic combat aero engine comprises of a Low Pressure Compressor, High Pressure Compressor, Combustion Chamber, Turbine and an Afterburner. Each one is called a **module** of the engine, interconnected by shafts from front to end. Likewise, there would be approximately 50-60 **Accessories** that control the engine. Examples are Fuel Control Unit, Actuator Controls, Afterburner Controls, Digital Computer and the like.

Organisations like Gas Turbine Research Establishment (GTRE; a subset of DRDO) have been entrusted with the responsibility to design and develop such engines with HAL being given the responsibility to manufacture. Today, many private partners are in the play to support this critical venture. Academia like IITs have also pitched in to resolve many key issues of aero engine design particularly with framing computer laws, material issues involving Hot-end Components like the turbine.

In spite of all these efforts, the very infamous Kaveri Gas turbine engine could not find its place into the LCA. However, the dry Kaveri engine has been successfully integrated and flown into one of our key missile programmes. OEMs like SAFRAN, GE, Euro Jet and Rolls Royce have offered succour to India to participate in combat engine development programmes, but the success rate has been very poor. Probably issues related to contract, Budget, technical knowhow arrangements and similar areas have had a telling effect on this programme.

As a result of this, OEMs like GE have taken advantage and sold their available engines to meet our immediate requirements of the LCA. But then at what cost? The GE F-404 powers the LCA Mk1 and the upcoming LCAMk1A. Squadrons are flying with these engines currently. We need to set up our own full-fledged MRO either with HAL or with IAF to realise long term cost optimisation. Similarly, the choice of the GE F-414 engine with its 98kN thrust with likely increase to the 100kN class is yet to fully fructify. The Naval LCA is another lost case for want of a suitable aircraft and a high power engine for deck take-off and landing.

Hence, the programme to go in for a Rafale (Marine) class of aircraft for the Indian Navy.

There is the AMCA of course, 5th generation class of aircraft with Super Cruise Capabilities staring at us a decade down the hill and looking for a suitable engine.

All this demands that we as a Nation get ourselves together, put the best brains into a thought process, lay out a road map, take assistance from a chosen OEM and realise our intended goal. War Gaming exercises on this subject (involving retired IAF officers, private industry, Certifying agencies, DRDO) have been conducted and results forwarded to the Government for suitable consideration. Time alone will tell, the next steps in the process which our top leaders at the Government, Military and R&D will have to decide.

Air Cmde KI Ravi, AVSM VSM who is an M. Tech from IIT Madras has specialisation in aircraft propulsion and hypersonic aircraft design. He was part of the team that was trained at SAFRAN in France for the MRO of the M 53-P2 engine of Mirage 2000 and set up the facility at 4 BRD (Kanpur). He was also involved with ADA during the negotiations with GE for the F-414 engine which resulted in the purchase of initial EIGHT engines for the DRDO trial of LCAMk-II and also AMCA.

AIR CHIEF MARSHAL SK KAUL PVSM MVC, EX PRESIDENT AFA



It is with profound sadness that we announce the demise of former Chief and Ex President Air Force Association, Air Chief Marshal Swaroop Krishna Kaul, PVSM, MVC who passed away at the age of 89 on 19 February 2025. He was the Chief of Air Staff from 31 Jul 1993 to 31 Dec 1995.

He was President AFA from 31 Dec 95 to 31 Dec 98 and known for his ability to inspire, unite and lead the veteran community with both grace and determination earning the respect and admiration of the veteran community.

He was born on 20 December, 1935 in Lucknow to a Kashmiri Pandit family. He joined the National Defence Academy in 1951 (5th JSW course) and was commissioned into the IAF in December 1954 (63 Pilot's Course).

Kaul's combat experience began during the 1965 War where he flew multiple ground-attack missions against Pakistani forces in Chhamb, Pasrur and Chawinda. During the 1971 war he led decisive strikes on the Dacca Governor's House and University accelerating Pakistan's collapse. For his fearless leadership he was awarded Maha Vir Chakra (MVC) one of only 19 IAF officers to receive this honour.

WG CDR A K GOSWAMI (RETD): WHO STOLE CO'S PEAK CAP



About fifty years back (1984), as a young Flight Lieutenant I was posted in a newly raised forward base support unit. We were just eight officers in the unit and had worked shoulder to shoulder with our men day and night, to bring up our unit to the inspection standard for the forthcoming inspection by AOC-in-C.

The D – Day arrived. At 0715 hrs all airmen in the ceremonial uniforms formed a perfect hollow square. Four officers donning white web-belts and peak caps had taken their respective positions. Two tall young officers were positioned to escort the VIP to the saluting dais. **Pilot Officer Asthana**, the adjutant, with six month service, was running around to do a final check of the parade contingent.

The **CO, Wing Commander Narayana Swamy** was visibly tense and was awaiting a telephone call from the guard room informing the arrival of the AOC- in-C at the unit gate.

Precisely at 0728 hrs the telephone rang at CO's office to inform the CO that the VIP had entered the unit gate and was being driven to the Parade Ground. As Wg Cdr Swamy replaced the receiver of the phone, he extended his hand to the hat-stand to grab his **Peak Cap** and rush to stand at the head of the parade formation. His hand hit the empty wooden hat hanger. The peak cap was not there! With heart pounding against his chest CO went to position himself at the head of the formation in full ceremonial uniform **sans the peak cap**.

The VIP's car glided to a stop just behind the saluting dais. The escorts marched to lead the VIP to get up on the saluting dais. But instead of climbing the carpeted steps of the saluting dais, AOC – in – C came around and stood face to face with the CO. He took one full minute to slowly look at the **CO from head to foot and then from foot to CO's bare head**. However, no words were exchanged. The AOC – in - C turned back and stood ramrod at the centre of the saluting dais. After presenting a General Salute, the CO marched to the dais and reported to AOC – in - C, **“Parade Aapke Nirikshan Ke liye Hazir Hai Shreeman”**. AOC – in – C stepped down from the dais and proceeded to inspect the parade formation with the CO following him on a slow march. The **UNIT BAND** from civilian labourers who used to play in marriage processions in their spare time belted out the unit's slow marching tune, **“Pyar Kia toh Darna Kya”**.

After the parade, CO invited the AOC – in – C into his office for a small briefing session. As the CO was entering his office, his eyes almost popped out. **His Peak Cap, as usual, was hanging from the hat stand!**

The rest of the inspection went off like clock-work. After seeing the VIP off, the CO returned to the ante-room of the Officers' Mess where all the officers were waiting for him. The CO took his seat. He remained silent for a couple of minutes to mentally figure out the words to say to the assembled officers. Finally, he gravely said, **“Gentlemen, who stole my Peak Cap this morning?”** A complete silence followed. After complete silence for a while CO spoke again, “Gentlemen! You are the officers of the elite armed forces of India. If you have done something wrong, you should have enough moral courage to own up.” More silence followed. When the silence became deafening, **Pilot Officer Asthana, the Adjutant,**

slowly got up and said, “Sir, I had taken your Peak Cap”. CO demanded, “Why”. Asthana admitted that in the morning he rode his bike to his office with the helmet on his head and in a hurry, he forgot to carry his Peak Cap. He said, “Sir, you had been out on the corridor and your peak cap was hanging at the hat stand. I was sure that, as a Pilot Officer if I stood at the parade without a peak cap, I would have been thrown out of service unceremoniously. On the other hand, I knew that you were the CO and if you had forgotten your peak cap no one would tell you anything. So I took your Peak Cap from your hat-stand, put it on and joined the parade.” For the CO, the logic was unnerving.

He remained silent for a long moment and then asked the rest of the officers. “Tell me, what should I do with this chap?”

There was another long silence until the CTO, senior most officer and a pious fellow from ranks, spoke up. He said, “Sir, in my life I have not come across such an incident and I am sure it will not happen again anywhere. He has committed a great blunder. But we request you to **forgive him and let it pass.**” CO pondered for a minute and finally said, “Well, as you say. We all will have a **glass of beer and Asthana will stand.**”

WOUNDED SOLDIER EVACUATION FROM ISRAEL



Havildar Suresh R, 33, sustained severe head injuries while stationed in the Golan Heights war zone under the UN Peace Keeping Mission (Israel - Hamas conflict). He was successfully evacuated and brought to R&R hospital in Delhi. The evacuation operation was carried out by **IAF using a C-130 Air Ambulance**. The Critical Care Air Evacuation Medical Team, comprising of Lt Col Singh and two trained paramedics from Base

Hospital, Delhi Cantonment, ensured that Havildar Suresh received state-of-the-art medical care. **IAF Air Ambulance took off from Tel Aviv (Israel) at 1.20 AM (IST) on 26 September 2024 and landed at Jamnagar at 10 AM**. The soldier was then airlifted to Palam, and by 3 pm, Havildar Suresh was safely transferred to Army Hospital R&R, New Delhi.

The successful operation highlights the efficiency, **dedication and the close coordination by IAF and Indian Army** who together, navigated a highly uncertain situation in war zone, to bring one of their own back to safety.

DIGITAL TRANSACTIONS

The shift toward digital cash transactions has been transformative for India's economy, promoting financial inclusion, efficiency and transparency. However, addressing the digital divide and ensuring cyber security will be critical for sustaining and expanding these benefits.

Various easy and convenient modes of digital payments, including Bharat Interface for Money-Unified Payments Interface (BHIM-UPI), Immediate Payment Service (IMPS) and National Electronic Toll Collection (NETC) have registered substantial growth and have transformed digital payment ecosystem by increasing person-to-person (P2P) as well as person-to-merchant (P2M) payments.

Total Digital Transactions Number has increased substantially from 2071 crores in FY 2017-2018 to 18,737 crores in FY 2023-2024.

INDIA, US INK DEAL FOR 31 PREDATOR DRONES



India and the United States have signed a ₹34,500 Crore deal for **31 Predator drones (MQ -9B, 15 for Navy, 8 each for IAF and Army)** developed by General Atomics Aeronautical Systems to enhance the surveillance capabilities of the Defence Forces. The agreement includes establishing Maintenance, Repair and Overhauls (MRO) facilities in India and also involves **collaboration with Bharat Forge** for UAV components and consultancy for combat drone development.

The MQ-9B Sky Guardian **variant can fly for over 40 hours** with a maximum range exceeding **6,000 nautical miles**. It is equipped with multiple sensors for high-resolution imagery, radar, and signals intelligence, providing real-time situational awareness.

The MQ-9B can carry **variety of weapons**, including precision-guided munitions like the Hellfire missile, Joint Direct Attack Munitions (JDAM), and laser-guided bombs, making it highly effective for strike missions.

GALLANT AIR WARRIORS : CPL VICKY PAHADE AND CPL SANJAY DHABI

On 04 May 24, two Air Warriors, **Corporal Dabhi Sanjay Hiffabai ESSA (Environmental Support Services Assistant)** and **Corporal Vicky Pahade (Communication Technician)** traveling in a Ashok Leyland Stallion Vehicle deployed on ration collection duty were ambushed by three terrorists.

Due to heavy and concentrated small arms fire and grenade attack from two sides, **Cpl Dabhi Sanjay Hiffabai ESSA** was hit by bullets in his right hand and got inflicted with multiple splinter injuries on face and upper body.

Unmindful of his gunshot wound and profuse bleeding, he maintained his composure, tactically adjusted himself and opened retaliatory fire from left side window from his weapon (AK-103) on the terrorists forcing the terrorists to retreat into the nearby jungle. Despite extreme adversities, he established communication with the unit from his personal mobile and informed about the situation at ambush site resulting in launch of immediate evacuation team with required medical aid.

Similarly his co passenger, **Cpl Vicky Pahade** also received heavy and concentrated small arms fire onto him and suffered grievous gunshot wounds in head, neck as well as chest. However, unmindful of his physical condition, he also maintained his composure, situational awareness and opened retaliatory fire from his weapon (AK-103) onto one of the terrorists who was firing at their vehicle from higher ridges. Because of his retaliatory fire, the terrorist had to hide which allowed the armed air warriors seated behind to open fire on terrorists in a coordinated manner, thereby saving the precious lives and collateral damage to the service property.

However, Corporal Vicky Pahade succumbed to his injuries later at Command Hospital Udhampur. As a mark of respect to the bravery displayed by both the warriors in the face of enemy they were awarded with Presidential awards: **Cpl Sanjay Dabhi Hiffabai Shaurya Chakra** and **Late Cpl Vicky Pahade VM (Gallantry) [Posthumous]**.

UNVEILING OF STATUE OF AVM HARJINDER SINGH PVSM MBE (RETD)



Late AVM Harjinder Singh, PVSM, MBE joined IAF in 1932 as a Hawaii Sepoy and was subsequently commissioned in 1942 in Tech GDP Branch. He was appointed as Commanding Officer of 1 BRD in 1949 and excelled to become AOC-in-C, Maintenance Command in 1955. Also, he along with his dedicated and skilled team produced first AVRO 748 A/C. He also contributed in manufacturing of the first ever IAF aircraft named K-1 and K-2. He was awarded PVSM on 26 January 1962 for the distinguished service of exceptional order. **His statue was installed and unveiled on the Republic Day 26 Jan 25 by the Chief Guest, AVM Kapil Razdan VSM (Retd) in the presence of AOC, CO's, PSOs of AF Stn Kanpur along with large number of Air Veterans and their families in the complex of AF Association Kanpur Branch.**

MILITARY AIRCRAFT: FIRST PRIVATE SECTOR PRODUCTION



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and his Spanish counterpart Mr Pedro Sanchez jointly inaugurated the TATA Aircraft Complex for manufacturing of C-295 aircraft at TATA advanced systems limited (TASL) Campus in Vadodara, Gujarat on 28 October 2024.

In 2021, Ministry of Defence signed a ₹21,935-crore agreement with Airbus Defence and Space SA, Spain, to supply 56 C-295 (a 5-10 ton transport aircraft designed for tactical

operations) to replace the Indian Air Force's aging Avro-748 aircraft. Under this contract, **16 aircraft are to be delivered fully assembled from Spain, while the remaining 40 are to be assembled in India at the new TASL facility in Vadodara. According to officials, the first aircraft produced locally in Vadodara will be completed by September 2026, the remaining 39 aircraft by August 2031.**

The Vadodara facility is not only tasked with assembling the aircraft but is expected to handle the complete production lifecycle, from component manufacturing to assembly, testing, and final delivery, with a future potential to support maintenance and upgrade services. Other than the aero-engine and avionics, which are sourced by Airbus from other OEMs, the other structural parts will mostly be made in India. **Of 14,000 detailed parts used in one aircraft, 13,000 parts** would be made in India from raw material.

AYUSHMAN BHARAT PRADHAN MANTRI JAN AROGYA YOJANA (AB PM JAY)

AB PM JAY is a national public health insurance scheme of the [Government of India](#) that aims to provide free access to health insurance coverage for low income earners in the country.

Features of PM-JAY include - Providing a cover of [Rs. Five 5 lakh](#) per family per year for medical treatment in empanelled hospitals, both public and private.

Offering [cashless payment](#) and [paperless recordkeeping](#) through the hospital or doctor's office; using criteria from the [Socio Economic and Caste Census 2011](#) to determine eligibility for beneficiaries .

No restriction on family size, age or gender. All pre-existing medical conditions are covered under the scheme; it covers 3 days of pre-hospitalisation and 15 days of post-hospitalisation, including diagnostic care and expenses on medicines; the scheme is portable and a beneficiary can avail medical treatment at any PM-JAY empanelled hospital outside their state and anywhere in the country.

Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY (AB PM-JAY) has now been expanded to cover all senior citizens aged 70 and above, regardless of their **income**. All eligible senior citizens will get free health insurance coverage of **Rs 5 lakh annually**.

AEROSPACE MEDICINE

The 63rd annual conference of Indian Society of Aerospace Medicine Institute (ISAM) was held at Institute of Aerospace Medicine (IAM), Old Airport Road, Bengaluru from 05 to 07 December 2024. The event was inaugurated by VCAS, Air Marshal SP Dharkar on 05 December 2024, in the presence of military and civilian dignitaries from Bengaluru and other parts of the country. Air Marshal Rajesh Vaidya, DGMS (Air) delivered the presidential address highlighting various collaborative achievements of the medical services of the Indian Air Force.

The prestigious Air Marshal Subroto Mukherjee Memorial Oration was delivered by Dr VR Lalithambika.

The Air Vice Marshal MM Srinagesh Memorial Oration was delivered by Wg Cdr Karthik Kalyanram (Retd) from Rishi Valley Rural Health Centre. Other highpoints included 'The Jemi Harmusji Framji Manekshaw Panel' featuring guest lectures by notable experts including Dr SL Vaya, Dr Hanumantray Baluragi.

The conference celebrated the multi-faceted discipline of Aerospace Medicine and showcased the innovative efforts of IAM in furthering aerospace medicine initiatives in India.

WHY PAN 2.0



PAN 2.0 project has been recently launched by the Income Tax Department which aims to streamline and modernize the process of issuing and managing PAN and TAN making it more user-friendly and efficient. The project addresses the requirements of taxpayers, focusing on consolidation of multiple platforms/portals and efficient services to PAN/TAN holders.

There will be NO (R) NO change in the existing Permanent Account Number (PAN). The 10 digit alphanumeric number issued by the Income Tax Department is set to have the following upgrades:-

- Enhancement of the QR code feature for new and old cards.
- Your application process will be online.
- Merger of all existing identification numbers to make PAN as the common identifier for businesses.
- PAN data vault system - will be created for all entities using PAN data, for data protection and cyber security purposes.

Existing PAN cards will continue to be valid under PAN 2.0. Existing PAN holders **NEED NOT** mandatorily apply for the new card but could upgrade their PAN. The allotment or update or correction of PAN will be done free of cost and e-PAN will be sent to the registered email ID of the individual. For a physical PAN card, the applicant has to apply along with a fee of Rs 50 (domestic).

FIRST WOMAN DIRECTOR GENERAL, ARMED FORCES MEDICAL SERVICES



Surgeon Vice Admiral Arti Sarin, AVSM, VSM becomes the first woman DG, Armed Forces Medical Services. Prior to assuming the appointment on 01 October 2024, she has held the coveted appointments of DGMS (Navy), DGMS (Air) and Director & Commandant AFMC Pune.

She is an alumni of AFMC. She attended the Timpany School, Visakhapatnam. Her father and brother were naval officers.

She is married to Surgeon Rear Admiral C S Naidu, AVSM, VSM, a hepatobiliary surgeon who served in the Indian Navy for 38 years.

SAINIK SCHOOL AT JAIPUR

Honourable Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh formally inaugurated Sainik School, Jaipur in Rajasthan on 23 September 2024. It is part of the Government's vision to set-up 100 new Sainik Schools across the country in partnership with NGOs, state governments and private schools. These new schools will be in addition to the existing 33 Sainik Schools already functioning under the erstwhile pattern.

Ministry of Defence has accorded approval to 45 new Sainik Schools under the partnership mode. These new schools, besides their affiliation to respective education boards, will function under the aegis of Sainik Schools Society and follow the Rules & Regulations. In addition to their regular affiliated board curriculum, they will impart education of Academic PLUS curriculum to the students of Sainik School pattern.

In September 2023, Sainik Schools Society had signed a Memorandum of Agreement with Shri Bhawani Niketan Shiksha Samiti for the establishment of a new Sainik School at Jaipur. The school has already started functioning in the present academic year.

NEW BANKING LAWS – FOUR NOMINEES ALLOWED

New Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2024 allows bank account holders to nominate up to **four** people for their bank accounts and fixed deposits including PPF. This bill also introduces a concept of "**successive and simultaneous**" nominations to reduce hardship to customers amid rising unclaimed deposits (app Rs 78,000 Crore at the end of March, 2024). Currently, banks allow only one nominee for savings bank and fixed deposits, which is proposed to be raised upto four.

Depositors can choose between the **same nominations**, where shares are divided among nominees, or **successive nominations**, where the nominees are listed in order, and the claim proceeds are paid to each nominee in turn if the previous nominee is unable to receive the benefit. However for the **lockers**, only successful nominations will be allowed.

DEMISE OF AIR VETERAN - TAMIL ACTOR 'DELHI' GANESH



Veteran Ganesh served in the Indian Air Force from 1964 to 1974 as Corporal before quitting in favour of films. Delhi Ganesan (01 August 1944 - 09 November 2024), known professionally as **Delhi Ganesh**, was an acclaimed actor in Tamil cinema and serials. He acted in more than 400 films in 48 years in cinema. Ganesan was born in Keezhapavur, a town in present-day Tenkasi district of Tamil Nadu. His early education was in Vallanadu, present-day Thoothukudi district.

Honorable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, in a message on X, stated he was "deeply saddened by the passing of the illustrious film personality, Thiru Delhi Ganesh Ji."

WORLD'S LONGEST TRAFFIC JAM

Life came to a standstill on 14 August 2010 in China's capital Beijing on Beijing-Tibet Expressway (China National Highway 110). For 12 days, people were stuck in such a jam that the vehicles did not move even an inch. The vehicles lined up to 100 km. This jam is the longest jam in the history of the whole world so far. Trucks carrying construction materials from Mongolia to Beijing for the Beijing-Tibet Expressway that was under construction blocked Beijing's exit for 12 days. Finally, the world's longest jam ended on 26 August 2010.

AIR MARSHAL SUBROTO MUKERJEE'S LEGACY: SUBROTO CUP



Subroto Mukerjee was born on 05 March 1911, in Kolkata. He was one of the first Indians to receive training as a pilot at the Royal Air Force College in Cranwell, England, in 1930 and was one of the first batch of six Indian pilots commissioned into the Royal Indian Air Force in 1932.

In 1954, he became the **first Indian Chief of the Air Staff**. Air Marshal Subroto Mukerjee's (1911- 1960) legacy is remembered in the IAF through the **Subroto Cup**, a premier inter-school football tournament at international level.

The **Subroto Cup International Football Tournament** is one of the oldest and most prestigious inter-school football tournament in India. The tournament is organized by the Indian Air Force (IAF), with the support from Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, the All India Football Federation (AIFF) and the School Games Federation of India (SGFI). Matches are played on prominent grounds in Delhi, including the Dr. Ambedkar Stadium.

The tournament has three categories; Sub Junior Boys (U-15), Junior Girls (U-17) and Junior Boys (U-17). It attracts school teams from all across India, along with international teams from countries such as Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Afghanistan, and even far-off nations like Brazil and Ukraine.

63rd edition of the Subroto Cup International Football Tournament was conducted from 05 Aug 24 to 11 Sep 24 at New Delhi and Bengaluru. The Junior Girls (U-17) and Junior Boys (U-17) categories were held at Delhi and Sub Junior Boys (U-15) category was conducted at Bengaluru from 19 to 28 Aug 24.

A total of 107 teams including teams from Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Nepal participated in this year's edition. **School children from far flung areas, diverse backgrounds and nationalities lived and played together bringing about an overall integration in line with the fundamental objectives of the tournament.**

A NOBLE INITIATIVE BY VETERAN



I Wg Cdr Thomas Verghese (Retd) staying in Jal Vayu Vihar (Bangalore) shall like to share a true incident. We had an elderly lady living alone in Jal Vayu Vihar. Her son was staying outside. One day her son rang up at 11 AM. Son gets no response. He drives into Jal Vayu Vihar, rings the doorbell. No response. Breaks open the door. Mother was lying on the floor (Probably for 12 to 18 hours).

Wg Cdr Verghese mentioned that to deal with such issues, we have created the free **SKY Blue Alerts service app**. Every member of a group must indicate their 'OK' status by pressing an icon on the app by 10 AM each day. If the member forgets or fails, an automated alarm system will remind the elder (this is work in progress). If there is still no action, it is an alert for other group members or volunteers to

contact the member who failed to respond. This is a modified concept of the Indian Air Force of the 1980s where each unit reports its OK status by sending **SKY BLUE MESSAGE** to its higher formation daily. We are working to expand the capabilities of the app so that it can be used to reach out also to paid service providers.

The objective of this initiative is to enable elders to retain their self-respect and dignity, encourage elders to be contributing members, and encourage the younger generation to enjoy the joy of volunteering.

GUKESH D - YOUNGEST WORLD CHESS CHAMPION



India's chess prodigy Gukesh Dommaraju, also known as Gukesh D who had earlier become grandmaster at the young age of twelve years, has made the country proud now by winning the World Chess Championship at 18 years of age and he has become the **YOUNGEST WORLD CHESS CHAMPION**.

He has defeated **China's Ding Liren** with a score of 7.5–6.5, in the 14-game World Chess Championship final held at Singapore. He has become the second Indian, after five-time champion Viswanathan Anand (dethroned in 2013) to win the World Chess Championship.

Gukesh learned to play chess in 2013, at the age of seven and eventually began structured one hour sessions three times a week. He dropped out of school after Class IV, that is, in elementary school, to focus on his chess hour sessions three times a week. In 2017, his father quit his job to travel with Gukesh to various tournaments. Gukesh was sponsored by his parents' friends at this time. His extraordinary talent was recognized institutionally early on, and he became one of the many beneficiaries of the robust Indian chess ecosystem.

Gukesh was born on 29 May 2006 in Chennai into a Telugu family from Andhra Pradesh. His mother, Smt Padmakumari, is a microbiologist, and father, Dr Rajinikanth, is an ENT surgeon who moved to Chennai to pursue his medical career. Gukesh studied at the Velammal Vidyalaya School in Mel Ayanambakkam, Chennai. Gukesh's family hails from the village of Chenchuraju Kandriga, near Satyavedu in the Tirupati district of Andhra Pradesh.

SUNITA WILLIAMS: ASTRONAUT OF INDIAN ORIGIN



Sunita Williams' Journey to the Stars and Back encourages young minds to dream big and reach for the stars, proving that with passion and dedication, anything is possible. She is an American astronaut and United States Navy officer. Sunita Lyn Williams was born on September 19, 1965, in Euclid, Ohio, USA. She comes from a diverse background, with her father of Indian origin and her mother of Slovenian descent.

She was selected as a NASA astronaut in 1998. She first went to space aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery in December 2006. During this mission, she set a record for the longest spaceflight by a woman at the time, spending 195 days in orbit. Her second mission was aboard a Russian Soyuz spacecraft in July 2012 wherein she became the first person to complete a triathlon in space and set another record for the most spacewalks by a female astronaut.

Recently Sunita Williams, alongside Butch Wilmore, embarked on a mission aboard the Boeing Starliner's first crewed flight, called the Crew Flight Test. However due to unexpected technical challenges the crew's rerun to earth was delayed. Her recent return from the International Space Station (ISS), after an extended 286-day mission, marks another significant chapter in her remarkable journey.

IAF SUPPORT AT KUMBH



Indian Air Force (IAF) extended valuable support to the civil administration for the successful execution of Maha Kumbh 2025, one of the world's largest religious gatherings at Prayagraj, India. IAF provided the logistical and operational support, facilitating civil aviation and rendered Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief (HADR) coverage.

Air Force Station Bamrauli served as the 24X7 hub for civil and chartered flight operations. Its Instrument Landing System (ILS) was maintained at CAT-II standards to enable seamless operations during the low-visibility conditions.

The IAF also supported infrastructure projects in Prayagraj, including the construction of a four-lane highway connecting Kaushambi to the airport and a railway overbridge at Begum Bazar. It also collaborated with the Airports Authority of India (AAI) for the expansion of the civil airport terminal.

An IAF Coordination Team for rescue was stationed at the Mela site equipped with advanced equipment/facilities to provide first aid and casualty evacuation in emergencies.

IAF : CASUALTY EVACUATION AT ZULUK NEAR GANGTOK



On 20 Dec 24, in a well coordinated casevac operation, IAF & Indian Army Helicopters evacuated a total of 10 passengers of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) from Zuluk near Gangtok to Military Hospitals (MH), Gangtok and Bengdubi. Having received the information at 1115 hrs, that a bus carrying personnel of SSB had met with an accident, the IAF launched two Cheetah and one MI 17 V5 helicopters from Bagdogra airbase in less than an hour. The casevac operation was conducted in marginal weather from the Zuluk helipad which is at an elevation of approximately 9000 feet.

IAF : EVACUATION EFFORTS AT JOSHIMATH



In a coordinated swift effort, IAF enabled timely deployment of rescue agencies, NDRF, SDRF & NDMA teams at Mana Uttarakhand towards Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR). The airlift of Drone-Based Intelligent Buried Object Detection System (DIBODS) equipment played a crucial role in expediting recovery efforts. The IAF deployed Mi-17 1V and Cheetah helicopters which inducted rescue personnel and evacuated critical casualties from Mana to Joshimath.

AERO INDIA – 2025



Aero India 2025, the 15th edition of Asia's premier Aerospace and Defence Exhibition (10- 14 February 2025) was held at Air Force Station Yelahanka, Bengaluru.

Aero India was inaugurated by Honourable Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh Jee with participation from over 900 exhibitors including 150 foreign companies and delegates from more than 90 countries. **Defence Ministers' Conclave** was conducted which facilitated strategic discussions aimed at strengthening defence ties and exploring new avenues for collaboration.

The main highlight was **Historic Aircraft displays** with rare simultaneous presence of the Russian Su-57 Felon and the American Lockheed Martin F-35 Lightning II fighter jets, showcasing the two most advanced Fifth Generation Fighter Aircraft (FGFA) from rival countries together in India.

NATIONAL PENSION SCHEME -VATSALYA EXTENDED TO MINORS

While traditionally aimed at **working / employed adults**, the National Pension Scheme (NPS) has now been **extended to minors**, encouraging early financial planning for long-term benefits of family savings. A FUTURISTIC MOVE: CHANGE IN NCERT CURRICULUM (CLASS VI)

The objective of this initiative, jointly undertaken by the Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Education, is to inculcate the values of patriotism, devotion to duty and courage & sacrifice among the school children and participation of youth in Nation building.

The **National War Memorial** was set up to inculcate a sense of high moral values, sacrifice, national spirit and belongingness in each and every citizen and to pay befitting tribute to the soldiers, who laid down their lives defending the Nation. The inclusion of poem on "National War Memorial" is a part of an action plan initiated towards branding National

War Memorial (NWM) as an iconic National monument.

The chapter titled '**Veer Abdul Hameed**' honours the Brave heart Company Quarter Master Havildar (CQMH) Abdul Hameed who made supreme sacrifice fighting for the Country during the India-Pakistan war of 1965 and was awarded the Country's highest gallantry award Param Veer Chakra (posthumously).

IAF'S HERITAGE FLIGHT PALAM: MOVES TO JET ERA

IAF plans to restore two retired **MiG-23s** for air display and add these to its Heritage Flight. This move will propel its Heritage Flight into jet era. The Vintage **Flight**, based at Palam Air Force Station in New Delhi, was established in 1981-82 and was renamed in 2020 as **Heritage Flight**. The Flight serves as a bridge between the IAF's past and present, showcasing the evolution of Indian aviation.

Currently, the Heritage Flight operates three World War II-era aircraft: the de Havilland DH-82 Tiger Moth, T-6G Harvard and Douglas C-47 Dakota. While the Tiger Moth is of British origin, the Harvard and Dakota are American-made. The IAF also plans to induct a restored super marine Spitfire, a legendary British WW-II fighter that served with the IAF, along with an HT-2 trainer, the first basic trainer designed in India. These vintage aircraft are used for ceremonial fly pasts at major events such as Republic Day and Air Force Day, as well as Air shows and significant Military events.

LARGEST AIRPORT IN WORLD: KING FAHD INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT located in Dammam, Saudi Arabia, sprawls over an impressive 776 square kilometers, making it the largest airport in the world by land area. It is larger than the city of Mumbai or even the entire country of Bahrain.

LONGEST AIRFIELD IN INDIA: INDIRA GANDHI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT has the longest runway in India which measures about 4,430 meters and holds the capacity to handle up to 100 flights per hour.

CR RAO WINNER OF INTERNATIONAL PRIZE IN STATISTICS 2023 EQUIVALENT OF THE “NOBEL PRIZE”



Callyampudi Radhakrishna Rao (1920 – 2023) a distinguished Indian-American statistician was honored with the 2023 International Prize in Statistics, considered the field's equivalent of a **Nobel Prize** in July 2023.

At age of 102 years, he received this honor at the International Statistical Institute's World Congress in Ottawa, accompanied with \$80,000 prize money.

Born in 1920 in Karnataka, India, Rao began his academic journey at the Indian Statistical Institute and later earned a Ph.D. from Cambridge University. He

founded **The Indian Econometric Society (ITES)**.

His extensive career includes over 400 research papers, numerous books, and contributions to fields such as genetics, anthropology, and economics. Rao received *38 honorary doctoral degrees* from universities in *19 countries*. He was a member of *eight National Academies in India*, the United Kingdom, the United States, and Italy and many more. Rao was earlier awarded the *United States National Medal of Science*, that nation's highest award for lifetime achievement in fields of scientific research, in June 2002. He is Padma Shri, Padma Vibhushan and Bharat Ratna.

Dr Rao passed away in Buffalo, New York on 22 August 2023, aged 102.

DR S SOMNATH BESTOWED 'WORLD SPACE AWARD 2024'



Dr S Somnath, Chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has been honoured with the prestigious International Astronautical Federation World Space Award for 2024 in a ceremony held at Milan (Italy) recognizing ISRO's successful Chandrayaan-3 mission (a historic milestone in lunar exploration of the South Pole).

The International Astronautical Federation (IAF) praised the Chandrayaan-3 mission for its innovation and cost-effective engineering, symbolizing India's dedication to space advancements.

The award recognizes individuals who make significant contributions to space science and technology. In 2023, this prestigious award was

bestowed upon Elon Musk, founder and CEO of Space X, for his groundbreaking contributions to space exploration.

DEFENSE SECURITY PERSONNEL - PENSION ACCOUNT

Droupadi Murmu awarded the **President's Colours** to the College of Defence Management (CDM), Secunderabad on 20 December 2024, marking a historic milestone in the journey of the institute since its establishment in 1970. The President complimented the college's enduring legacy and its dedication to providing officers with the skills to effectively manage complex military operations, logistics, and resources while embracing new-age technologies and strategies. The President emphasized upon the need to be adaptive towards absorption of emerging and disruptive technologies and lauded the role played by CDM in preparing the future strategic leadership towards imbibing the same.

INDIA'S WONDER RAIL BRIDGE



India's inaugural Cable-Stayed railway bridge, named **Anji Khad**, is situated in the picturesque state of Jammu and Kashmir and extends across the mighty Chenab River. This bridge forms a crucial part of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project, which is expected to significantly enhance connectivity and faster development in the region. The **Anji Khad Bridge** (length 725 meters, width 15 meters with Height **331** meters above **riverbed**) can accommodate trains

travelling at speeds of up to 110 km/h. The bridge is supported by a single pylon which is 1,086 feet tall, (similar to the height of a 77-story building).

ARMY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY : AIR FORCE AND NAVY WARDS

Army Institute of Technology (AIT) was established in the year 1994. It is located on the Dighi campus, about 25 km from Pune and is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University. Until the last year, children of Army personnel only were eligible for admission to the institute. However, (AIT) has now started admitting children of Air Force and Navy personnel into Engineering programmes. This has been approved by Army Welfare Education Society (AWES). As per the approved quota, AIT enrolled 11 wards of Indian Air Force (IAF) personnel and five of Indian Navy (IN) personnel in its Bachelor of Engineering (BE) programmes for 2024-25 academic year, besides 2 wards of IAF and one of Navy in its Master of Engineering (ME) programme. The decision was made at the highest level of Armed forces and is another step towards jointness and tri-services integration.


ARMED FORCES VETERANS DAY : CELEBRATIONS



On 14th January 2025, the Indian Armed Forces celebrated the 9th Armed Forces Veterans' Day, honoring the invaluable contributions of veterans to the nation's security and sovereignty. There are issues digitising the data. We are slowly but surely learning. Things are progressing and in the right direction. There is one SPARSH cell at every station of Indian Air Force, as well as other bases, to correct whatever issues one may have.



INDIAN ARMY & INDIAN AIR FORCE INK MOU WITH GATI SHAKTI VISHWAVIDYALAYA



WHY LOCKHEED C-130 HERCULES USE PROPELLERS INSTEAD OF JET ENGINES

IAF operated C-130 Hercules transport aircraft uses propellers instead of jet engines because they are better suited for the aircraft's primary role of versatile, tactical airlift operations that require **short takeoffs and landings (STOL)**. Unlike Jet engines which are optimized for high-speed, high-altitude flight, the C-130 often operates at lower speeds and altitudes where turboprops are more effective which in turn is crucial for missions like **paradrop, search & rescue operations and aerial refueling**.

AIR FORCE BOYS SPORTS SQUADRONS (AFBSS)

The Air Force Boys Sports Squadron (AFBSS) is located at Jalahalli, Bengaluru. The IAF and the Sports Authority of India jointly run this program which offers free education, lodging and sports training for boys up to class 12. The program aims to identify and develop potential sports talent to improve India's chances of winning medals in the future international competitions.

To foster sporting talent in **Wrestling** and **Boxing** at the grassroots level IAF conducts enrolment Rallies for prestigious AFBSS. These induction rallies promise to create future champions who will not only represent India in global sporting arenas but also uphold the values of discipline and perseverance that the IAF is known for.

SQUADRON LEADER AJJAMADA BOPPAYYA DEVAYYA MVC IN ACTOR AKSHAY KUMAR FILM – SKY FORCE



Ajjamada Boppayya Devayya was born to Dr. Bopayya on December 24, 1932, in Karnataka's Coorg. He was commissioned in IAF in 1954. When the outbreak of the 1965 war happened, Ajjamada was working as an instructor at the Air Force Flying College.

During the **1965 India-Pakistan War**, Devayya (called 'Wings of Fire') was part of a strike mission targeting the Pakistani airbase Sargodha when his aircraft was intercepted by Pakistani pilot Flt Lt Amjad Hussain PAF F-104 Star fighter. Despite his plane being damaged, Sqn Ldr Ajjamada Devayya managed to bring down Pakistan's Star fighter piloted by Flt Lt Amjad. While Flt Lt Amjad of PAF ejected from the plane and parachuted in Pakistan territory, Ajjamada reportedly lost communication with the Indian Air Force, and went missing. Presumably he died in Pakistani territory. However many years after the war, Pakistan reportedly confirmed that Ajjamada Devayya's body was found near Sargodha, and the nearby villagers had buried him.

Twenty-three years later, in 1988, he was posthumously awarded the MVC award. Squadron Leader **Ajjamada Boppayya Devayya MVC** is the only **Indian Air Force** officer to be posthumously awarded the **Maha Vir Chakra (MVC)**.

Sky Force is a 2025 Indian Hindi-language action drama film centred around India's first airstrike, the Sargodha airbase attack of Pakistan in the **Indo-Pakistani air war of 1965** and **Squadron Leader Ajjamada Boppayya Devayya's** remarkable story of courage and bravery. The film stars Akshay Kumar and newcomer Veer Pahariya in lead roles, alongside Sara Ali Khan and Nimrat Kaur.

Honourable Defence Minister Sh Rajnath Singh Jee joined CDS and three service chiefs at the special screening of the film at Air Force Auditorium on 21 January 2025.

IAF FOSTERING CIVILIAN MILITARY CO-OPERATION WITH PROJECT UDAN



In a landmark move to strengthen regional connectivity the Civilian Aviation Ministry, launched its aircraft BOEING-737 flight Kolkata, Hindon, Goa on 01 March 2025 from IAF base Hindon.
