The bond between you & Allah



Salah is the second pillar of Islam.

The most important pillar of Islam after the Shahadah (testimony) of Faith.

The Prayer is a link between the servant and his Lord.



**"And seek help in patience and As-Salah (the prayer) and truly, it is extremely heavy and hard except for *Al-Khashi'in* (i.e., the true believers in Allah)"
(Al Qur'an 2:45)**

STEPS OF WUDHU' (ABLUTION)

Intention: The intention is in the heart. Uttering the intention is an innovation

Say Bismillaah



Wash the right hand till the wrist, 3 times. Then do the same without the left hand.



Use your right hand to cup water into your mouth and gargle well and spit. Do it three times.



Sniff water into nose. Use your right hand to cup water and inhale it into your nose and blow out three times.



Wash your face three times.



Wash your right hand from fingers to the elbow 3 times. Do the same with the left forearm thrice.



Using your wet hands, gently wipe the entire head once, from the forehead to the back of the head. This is called "Masah".



Wipe your ears inside and out. Do it once.



Wash your right foot till the ankle thrice. Make sure that the water goes in between the toes. Do the same for the left foot thrice.

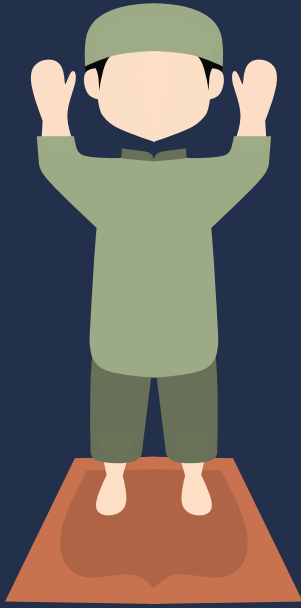

Steps of As Salah



Stand (facing the qiblah) and raise your hands up next to your ears and shoulders, then say Allāhu Akbar (Allah is the greatest).



Place your right hand over your left hand over your chest or navel or in between both. Keep your eyes focused on the ground. Recite opening dua, seek refuge in Allah from Shaitan and recite Surah Al Fatihah and any other Surah.



Raise hands till ears (or shoulders) and say "Allahu Akbar" and bend down. Keep your back and neck as straight as possible and your palm and fingers over the knees. Keep your eyes focused on the ground in front of you and say, Subhanna Rabbiyal Adheem three times.



Stand back (raise from ruku). While rising up recite Samiallahu liman Hamidah with your hands raised till ears or shoulder.



After standing up, keep arms by side and recite Rabbana Walakal Hamd (Our Lord, all praise is for you).



Say Allahu Akbar and prostrate. Place your head, knees, toes and hands on the floor and make sure that your forehead and nose touch the ground. Forearms should not be on the floor. Your fingers should be together. This position is called "sajdah."

Say Subhanna Rabbiyal A'laa (Glorious is my Lord, the most High) three times.



Rise from sajdah saying Allahu Akbar and sit on your knees. Place your left foot from ball to heel on the floor. Your right foot toes' should be on the floor. Place your hands flat on your knees. Recite Rabbi-ghfirlee twice (O My Lord, forgive me).



Return to sajdah saying Allahu Akbar. In sajdah, say Subhanna Rabbiyal a'laa three times.

Then stand up saying Allahu Akbar. One rakat is completed.



In every second rak'ah, after the second Sajdah, sit on your knee again and raise the index finger of right hand and recite the Tashahhud. In the final rakat, recite the Tashuhhud and Durood.



Finish the prayer with Tasleem. After the Tashuhhud, Durood, and any du'a you wish to recite, end the prayer by turning your head to the right and saying, As-salamu alaykum wa Rahmatullah.



Turn your head to the left and say, As-salamu alaykum wa Rahmatullah.

Benefits of Salah

The Prayer is a means of support and assistance in times of distress and grief. And it prevents one from evil and shameful deeds.

Wipes away sins and expiates evil deeds.

Helps us to get closer to Allah.

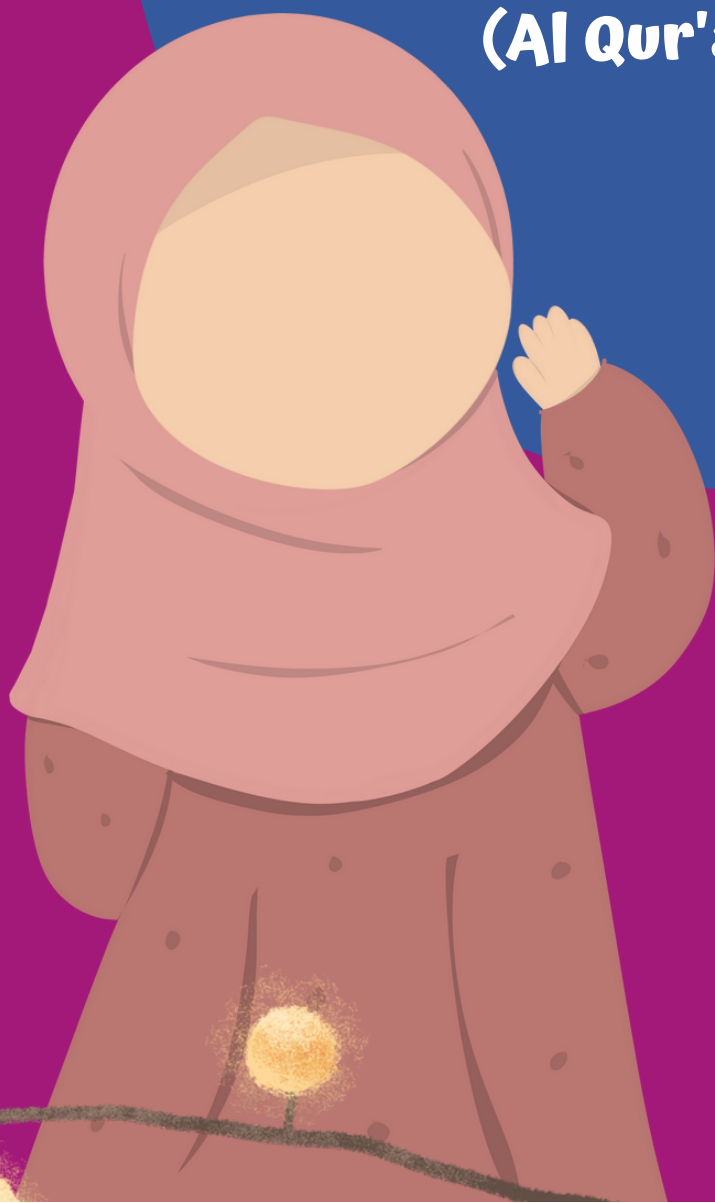

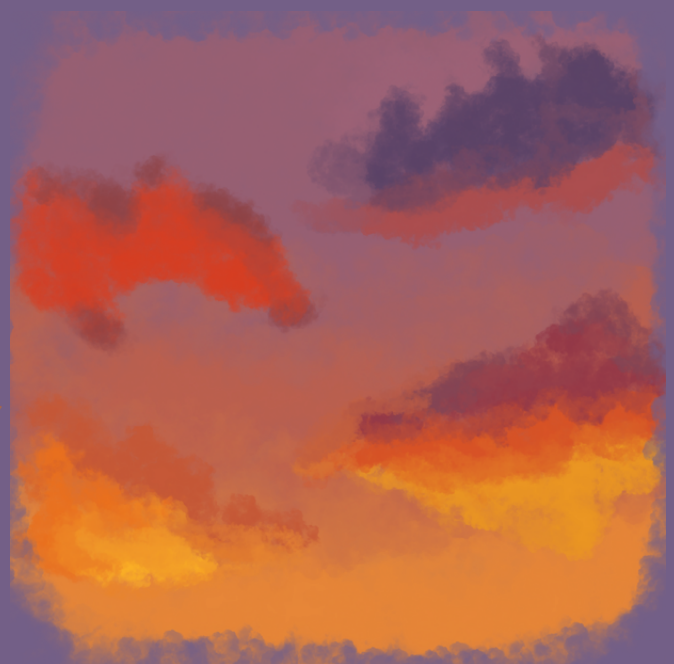


Timing for fasting

From when to when?

From Dawn to Sunset

A fasting person should have the intention to fast (shouldn't be said aloud) before starting the fast. The fasting person will eat the pre dawn meal before Fajr Azaan and will be fasting till time of Sunset.



Deeds to do while fasting

Help your mom in household works especially in cooking.



Read Qur'an more often and act according to its teachings.



Pray more.



Ask your family members and elders if they need help and try to help them.



Abstain from talking unnecessarily and do more dhikr of Allah.

When?

When to give?

Zakat is due on wealth if it reaches the Nisab and one full Hijri year has passed (from when it reached the nisaab). The person has to give 2.5% of what he own.



What is Nisab?

If someone have this limit for one Hijri year, then it's obligatory upon them to give Zakat .

Upon which we have to give Zakat?

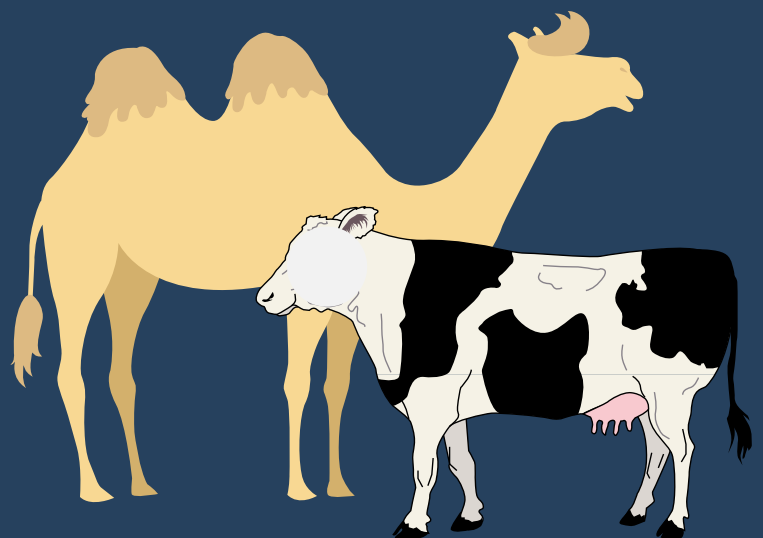

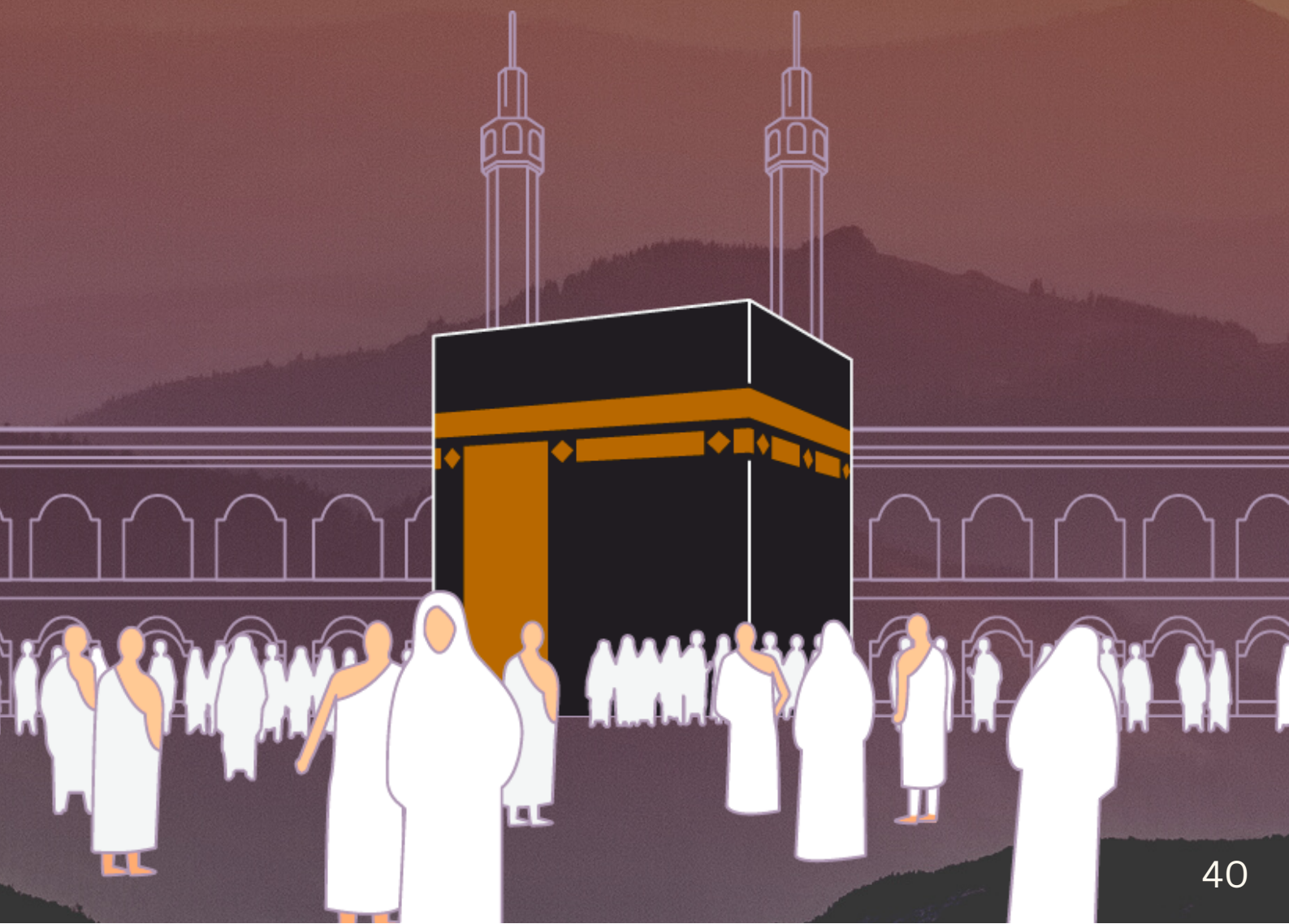

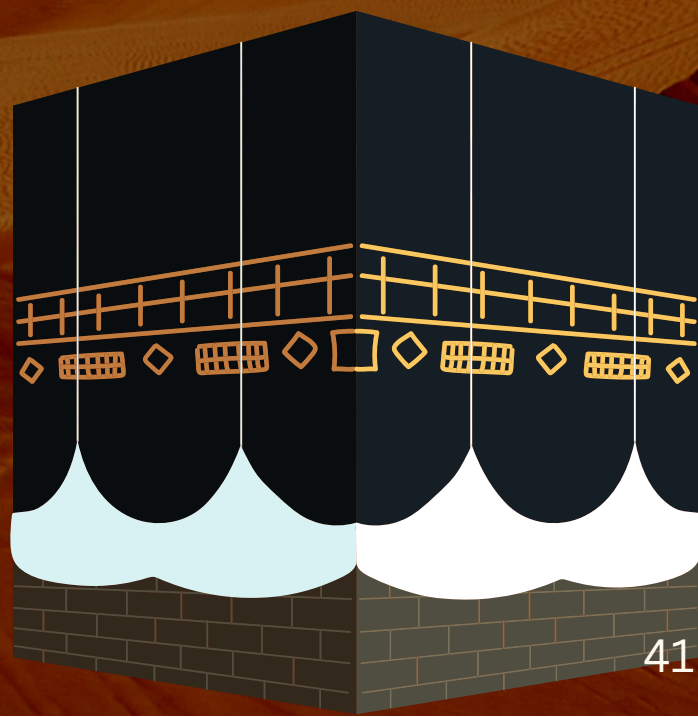
HAJJ

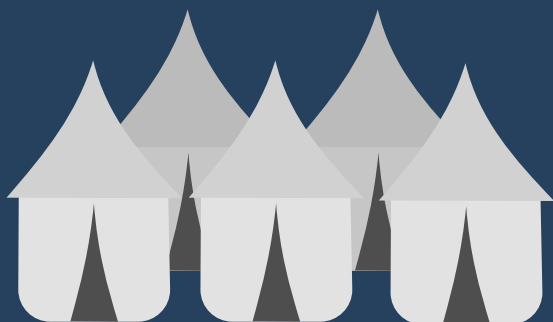

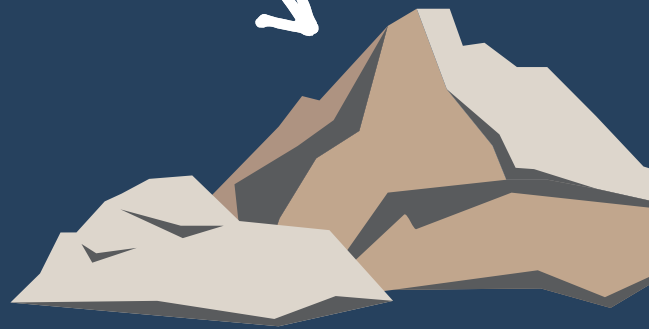
