Q (i) Ans: Coral reefs begin to form when free - swimming coral larvae attach to submerged rocks or other hard surfaces along the edges of islands or continents. As the corals grow and expand, reefs take on one of three major characteristics structures — fringing, barrier or atoll.

Ans(x) Two natural causes that destroy coral reefs are -

(i) Weather-related damage to reefs occurs frequently. Large and powerful waves from hurricanes and cyclones can break apart or flatten large coral heads, scattering their fragments. A single storm seldom kills off an entire colony, but slow-growing corals may be overgrown by algae before they can recover.

(ii) Reefs are also threatened by tidal emersions. Long periods of exceptionally tides leave shallow water coral heads exposed, damaging reefs.
