
#### Dear friends,

#### **A Meditation**

In the lectionary reading for 23rd April, Luke Ch 24 v 13-35, there is the story about the Road to Emmaus, when two of the disciples were travelling on the road to Jerusalem, and encountered Jesus, the risen Lord. However, they did not recognise him until he broke bread with them at the end of the journey. This was one of several more encounters with the risen Jesus. This passage reminds us that we should be always alert to welcome our Lord when maybe we do not expect him.
