Notable Anniversaries in 2024

• <u>The Methodist Ministers' Housing Society (MMHS)</u> is 75 years old. This charity enables hundreds of retired Methodist clergies to have a place to call home. At present, more than 700 presbyters, deacons and their families are being housed across the UK. To commemorate this anniversary, the Christian musician and composer, Paul Field has written a hymn based on the second chapter of Ephesians- Christ is the cornerstone.

Here is the first verse: -

There are no strangers here no barricades no walls, In Christ there is no east or west, one saviour for us all Let prejudice and pride be gone, let true forgiveness come So we may build the house of God, where all may live as one.

- <u>Big Ben Chimes</u> were first broadcast at midnight on New Year's Eve, 100 years ago.
- <u>Winter Olympics</u>, the first of these games took place in Chamonix in France, 100 years ago (The summer Olympics this year are also held in France, in Paris.
- <u>The beginning of television.</u> John Logie Baird worked on sending a beam of light through a rapidly spinning disc punched with holes, allowing an image to be captured, transmitted, and turned back into the original image – this was in 1924, the beginning of the TV image!
- <u>Paper tissues</u> were first produced 100 years ago.
